## ATALANTA

## **FIORENTINA**



Fiorentina have won three of their last five Serie A matches against Atalanta (D1 L1), after having won only one of their previous 10 games against the Bergamaschi in the competition. Furthermore, after their 3–2 win in the reverse fixture back in September, the Viola could record a league double over the Bergamaschi for the second time under Vincenzo Italiano, also doing so in the 2021–22 campaign.

Atalanta have drawn 23 of their 60 Serie A home meetings with Fiorentina (W22 L15): the Bergamaschi have only drawn more home games in the competition against Juventus (26).

Atalanta won their most recent home match against Fiorentina (1-0, 2nd October 2022) but they have not beaten the Viola in two home games in a row in Serie A under the same coach since 1991, doing so under Bruno Giorgi.

Atalanta have won each of their last six league games and only once before have they enjoyed more victories in a row in their Serie A history, winning nine straight between February and July 2020.

Only Inter (46) have won more points in home matches than Atalanta in Serie A this season (41) whilst only in the 1947-48 campaign (48) have the Bergamaschi recorded more points at home in a single campaign in the competition (converting to 3 points for a win).

Fiorentina have won two of their last three away league games (L1), as many wins as they had managed across their previous 12 matches on the road in Serie A (W2 D4 L6).

Only Newcastle (20) and Cagliari (19) have found the net with more different players than Fiorentina (18) in the big-5 European leagues this season (excluding own goals); only once in their history have the Viola had more different scorers in a single Serie A campaign (21 in 2014-15).

For the first time in their history, Atalanta have seen four players reach double figures for goals in the same Serie A season: Gianluca Scamacca (12), Teun Koopmeiners (12), Charles De Ketelaere (10) and Ademola Lookman (10). Overall, the previous club to boast that achievement in an Italian top-flight campaign was Napoli in 2016-17.

Since the most recent international break at the end of March, no player has been directly involved in more goals across all competitions from the big-5 European leagues than Gianluca Scamacca (14 – 10 goals and four assists), who is level with Chelsea's Cole Palmer in that period (14).

Giacomo Bonaventura has scored eight league goals this season, his joint-most in a single Serie A campaign (also eight in 2017-18 with AC Milan). The Fiorentina midfielder, who made his first 99 Serie A appearances with Atalanta between 2008 and 2014 (scoring 14 goals), has bagged four goals against the Bergamaschi in the competition, including one in the reverse fixture earlier this season.
