

**Genoa - Como**

7 November 2024



- Genoa and Como will meet in Serie A 42 years and 280 days after their previous meeting (a 1-0 home win for the Rossoblù in January 1982); the Grifone are unbeaten in five of their six matches against the Lariani in the competition (W3 D2).
- Genoa have won each of their three Serie A home matches against Como: among the teams against which they have always won at home in the competition, only against Casale (four) have the Grifone picked up more successes.
- Following their win at Parma (1-0), Genoa could win back-to-back games in Serie A for the first time since January 2024 (vs Salernitana and Lecce); furthermore, the Grifone could keep a clean sheet in two games in a row in the top-flight for the first time since February-March 2022 (four in that case under Alexander Blessin).
- Genoa have alternated between draws and defeats in their first six home games in Serie A this season, losing their most recent one (1-0 vs Fiorentina); the Rossoblù could lose two home games in a row in a single top-flight season for the first time since the November-December 2021 (three in that case under Andriy Shevchenko).
- Como have lost their last three Serie A matches, scoring only one goal and conceding seven; they could suffer four defeats in a row in the competition for the first time since November 2002 (five in that case, under Eugenio Fascetti).
- Como have picked up the fewest points since the start of October in Serie A (only one in five matches): only Bochum and Montpellier (both zero) have collected fewer points than the Lariani in the Big-5 European leagues in this period (Nantes, Heidenheim & Ipswich Town all also one point during this period).
- Genoa have scored the highest share of their Serie A goals in the final 15 minutes of games this season (5/8 from 76' onwards, 62.5%), while Como have conceded eight goals in this period: at least two more than any other side in the top-flight in 2024/25.
- 38% of Genoa's Serie A goals this season have been headed (3/8): the highest percentage in the division; meanwhile, Como are the only team without a headed goal in the competition this season.
- Andrea Pinamonti has scored three of his four Serie A goals in 2024-25 from the 70th minute onwards: a record in the league this season alongside Mosquera (Verona) and Dany Mota (Monza).
- Nico Paz has been directly involved in 50 shots in Serie A this season (31 shots and 19 chances created) – a record among midfielders in the top-flight in 2024/25 (at least 11 more than any other midfielder). In particular, among the players born after 1/1/2004, only Lamine Yamal (65) has been involved in more than the Argentine (50) in the Big-5 European leagues this season.

**Lecce - Empoli**

8 November 2024



- Following the win in the last match against Empoli in Serie A (1-0 at Via del Mare, thanks to Nicola Sansone's goal, on 13rd April), Lecce could win back-to-back games against the Toscani for the first time in the competition.
- Lecce are unbeaten in four of their five Serie A home matches against Empoli (W2 D2) with their only defeat on their own patch against them coming on 8th February 2006 (2-1 thanks to Sergio Almirón's and Francesco Tavano's goals for the Toscani and Cristian Ledesma's for the Pugliesi).
- Lecce have only scored four goals in their last 14 Serie A games, failing to score 11 times and also conceding an average of 1.7 goals per match in this period (24 goals conceded in total during this period) – their goal difference of -20 during this period is the worst of all sides (from 10 May to today).
- Following their win against Hellas Verona in their last Serie A match played at Via del Mare (1-0), Lecce could win back-to-back matches at home in the top-flight for the first time since August-September 2023 (three in that case, under Roberto D'Aversa).
- Empoli have only conceded nine goals after their first 11 matches in Serie A this season, the joint fewest they've conceded at this stage of a top-flight campaign (also nine in 2006/07 finishing 7th).
- Empoli have only lost one of their last six Serie A away matches (W3 D3), scoring in each game; following their draw in their last match away from home at Parma, the Toscani could draw two games in a row on the road for the first time in the competition since May 2023 (against Sampdoria and Hellas Verona in that case).
- In 21 Serie A games as Lecce manager, Luca Gotti has an average of 1.00 point per game, while Roberto D'Aversa recorded an average of 0.89 per match in the 28 games in which he managed the Salentini last term (in 2023/24).
- Empoli have kept a clean sheet in five of their 11 matches in Serie A this season (equaling their best tally at this point of a season in the top flight, set in 1998/99): only Juventus (eight) and Napoli (seven) have collected more than the Toscani (five, level with Fiorentina and Inter) in the league this season.
- Lameck Banda scored his last goal in Serie A against Empoli at Castellani on 11th December 2023: the Toscani are the only team against which he has netted at least one goal and provided at least one assist in the top-flight.
- Mattia Viti is the defender with the most tackles (21) in Serie A this season; furthermore, among Empoli players, he has won the most duels (59) and he is one of the two with the most interceptions (19 level with Ardian Ismajli) in the league in 2024/25.

**Venezia - Parma**

- Venezia are winless in their six Serie A encounters against Parma (D2 L4) - only against Hellas Verona have they played more matches (seven) without winning than against the Ducali (six) in the competition.
- Parma have won their last four Serie A meetings against Venezia, scoring 11 goals and conceding five; indeed, only against Padova (five), do the Gialloblù have a longer current streak of victories in a row than against the Arancioneroverdi (four) in the top-flight.
- Among current Serie A sides, Venezia are the team Parma have faced the the most away from home without ever winning in the top-flight: three (D1 L2).
- Despite failing to find the net last time out against Inter (1-0 defeat at Meazza), Venezia have scored 10 goals in 11 matches in Serie A this season; the last time the Arancioneroverdi netted more at this point of a top-flight season was back in 1962/63 (16).
- Venezia have never achieved the same result in their last seven Serie A home matches (W3 D1 L3), winning their most recent one (3-2 vs Udinese); the Arancioneroverdi could win back-to-back matches on their own patch for the first time in the top-flight since January 2000 (also two in that case, under Luciano Spalletti).
- Parma lost last time out without scoring (1-0 vs Genoa) and could suffer two defeats in a row in Serie A without scoring for the first time since January-February 2021 (three in that case, vs Sampdoria, Napoli and Bologna).
- Parma have drawn their last four Serie A away games and could draw five games in a row on the road for the first time in the competition; the last team to record more successive draws away from home in the competition was Bologna (five, between August and October 2023).
- Parma (12) and Venezia (11) are the two sides to have dropped the most points from winning positions in Serie A this season; the Emiliani have lost seven of those away from home, while the Lagunari are yet to drop points from winning positions at Penzo in the top-flight in 2024/25.
- Joel Pohjanpalo has scored three of his four Serie A goals at Penzo this season; indeed, over the last three seasons between Serie A and Serie B (from 2022/23, incl. playoffs), the Venezia forward is the player with the most goals (28) netted in home games.
- Dennis Man is the Parma player who has been directly involved in the most goals in Serie A in 2024/25 (five, three goals and two assists); following his assist against Juventus in his last away appearance in the competition, he could have a hand in a goal in two games in a row on the road in the top-flight for the first time since April 2021 (vs Benevento and Cagliari in that case).

**Cagliari - Milan**

9 November 2024



- Cagliari have lost 47 out of 82 games played against AC Milan in Serie A, more than against any other side in the top-flight (W8, D27)– the Rossoneri are also the opponent against which the Rossoblù have the lowest win percentage (9.76%) among those faced more than 12 times in the competition.
- Cagliari have won only one of their last 39 matches against AC Milan in Serie A (D8, L30): 2-1 at home on 28th of May 2017. Indeed, the Rossoneri have obtained eight wins in their last nine matches against the Sardinian team in the top-flight (D1), conceding only three goals in this period.
- AC Milan have scored in each of their last 13 away matches against Cagliari in Serie A (22 goals in total, an average of 1.7 per match); this run is the Rossoneri's longest current streak of scoring in consecutive away games against an opponent (13).
- AC Milan have kept a clean sheet in four of their last seven Serie A games - as many times as in the previous 17 games played in the competition - scoring 12 goals and conceding five in this period.
- AC Milan won their last away game in Serie A (1-0 vs Monza) and could record two away wins in a row without conceding in a single top-flight campaign for the first time since March 2022 (two in that case too, the second of which was against Cagliari).
- Cagliari have conceded at least two goals in seven of their last eight Serie A games, shipping 17 goals in total; fewer than only Hellas Verona (21) in this period. Furthermore, no team have more games with at least two goals conceded in Serie A this term (seven like Genoa, Hellas Verona and Venezia).
- Cagliari have failed to score in four of their six home matches played in Serie A 24/25, including the last one (2-0 vs Bologna), while scoring only four goals in this period; overall, only Empoli have had more home matches without finding the net (five) and scored fewer goals (zero) than the Rossoblù at home in this campaign.
- AC Milan have scored the highest percentage of their goals in the first half in this Serie A (11/17, 65%) while on the other hand, only Genoa and Lecce (both two) have scored fewer goals than Cagliari (four) in the first half of the current campaign.
- Zito Luvumbo scored his first goal in a Serie A home match against AC Milan, in the 3-1 defeat on 27th of September 2023 at Unipol Domus. After his goal against Lazio in the last match, the Rossoblù striker could score in two matches in a row in the competition for the first time in his career.
- Christian Pulisic scored his only brace in Serie A against Cagliari, doing so in the 5-1 win by the Rossoneri at the Meazza, in May 2024. In general, against no other team has the American been involved in more goals in Serie A (three versus Cagliari - also against Monza).

**Juventus - Torino**

- Juventus have avoided defeat in 35 of the last 36 derbies against Torino in Serie A (W26 D9), drawing the most recent match against the Granata in the tournament (0-0, on 13/04/2024). The two teams have not drawn two matches in a row in the Italian top-flight since the period between October 2001 and February 2002 (two in that case, managed by Marcello Lippi and Giancarlo Camolese respectively).
- Juventus are unbeaten in their last 18 matches against Torino in Serie A (W13 D5), keeping a clean sheet in eight of these matches, including the two most recent. The Bianconeri could collect three clean sheets in a row against them in the Italian top-flight for the first time since the period between September 2017 and December 2018 (exactly three in that case).
- Juventus have collected 13 wins and five draws in their last 18 home matches against Torino in Serie A, including the last 12 played at the Allianz Stadium (W9, D3): indeed, this is their joint-longest unbeaten run against an opponent at their current stadium in the Italian top-flight (12 also against Bologna, Cagliari and Genoa).
- Juventus have not lost any of their last 19 Serie A games (W7 D12), while among the teams currently in the big five European leagues, they are the one with the longest current unbeaten streak, and the only one that haven't lost since the beginning of April. Furthermore, since the beginning of April 2024, the Bianconeri have kept a clean sheet on 12 of these 19 occasions, at least two more than any other team in the period in the big five European leagues.
- Juventus have drawn more than 50% of their Serie A matches played in 2024 at the Allianz Stadium: nine out of 16 (W6 D1), already their record of home draws in a single calendar year. Moreover, the last team that drew more home matches in a single year in the competition was Udinese (12 in 2023).
- Torino have lost five of their last six Serie A matches (W1), including the two most recent without scoring a goal. The Granata could suffer three defeats in a row without scoring a goal in the competition for the first time since the period between February and March 2014 (four in that case, the first lost 1-0 away against Juventus).
- Juventus are the team that have conceded the fewest shots in total (93) and on target (27) in this Serie A campaign, while Torino are the team that have conceded the most overall (188) and joint-most on target (58, alongside Venezia).
- Juventus are the team that have completed the most dribbles overall and have the highest dribble success rate in this Serie A campaign (94/170 – 55%); on the other hand, only Inter (29/93 – 31%) rank below Torino (38/105 – 36%) in the Italian top-flight this term.
- Alieu Njie (19 years, 179 days on Saturday) could become the youngest Torino goalscorer in Serie A games against Juventus (the record belongs to Luigi Giuliano, 19 years and 215 days on 19/03/1950). Meanwhile, Kenan Yildiz (19 years, 189 days on Saturday) could become the third-youngest scorer for Juventus in this top-flight fixture, after Felice Placido Borel (18 years, 243 days) and Bruno Nicolè (18 years, 244 days).
- Juventus could become the first opponent against whom Antonio Sanabria has scored more than three goals for Torino in Serie A (three goals also against five other teams). Furthermore, against the Bianconeri, the forward scored his only brace for the Granata in the competition - in the 2-2 draw at the Olimpico Grande Torino on 3/04/2021.



Atalanta - Udinese

10 November 2024



- Atalanta are unbeaten in their last 13 Serie A games (W8 D5) against Udinese, after losing four of their previous seven (D3) against the Friuliani in the top-flight. This is their longest current unbeaten run against a Serie A opponent.
- Udinese have won 27 Serie A matches against Atalanta (D28, L25): only against Cagliari have the Friuliani collected more wins (28) in the top-flight. However, their last victory against the Bergamaschi in the competition dates back to 29 October 2017: 2-1 at home, thanks to goals from Rodrigo de Paul and Antonin Barak for Udinese (Jasmin Kurtic for Atalanta).
- Udinese have only won one of their last 16 Serie A away games (D8 L7) against Atalanta, after winning four of their five previous matches on the road (D1). That lone victory came in December 2016, when the Friuliani won 3-1, thanks to goals from Duván Zapata, Seko Fofana and Cyril Théreau.
- Atalanta have scored 29 goals in Serie A this season: only Bayern Munich (32) and Barcelona (40) have netted more in the big five European leagues in 2024/25. What's more, 18 of the Nerazzurri's 29 total goals (62%) have come from October onwards: a record in the big five European leagues in the period (Fiorentina, Barcelona and Bayern Munich on 15).
- Atalanta have kept a clean sheet in their last two league matches (against Monza and Napoli); the Bergamaschi could keep a clean sheet for three Serie A games in a row for only the second time in the last five top-flight seasons (since 2020/21), after the period between September and October 2023.
- After being unbeaten for five league away games in a row (W3 D2), Udinese have lost their last three meetings on the road (against Roma, AC Milan and Venezia); the last time the Friuliani went on a longer such streak away from home in the top-flight was between April-May 2023 (five in that case under Andrea Sottile).
- Atalanta have scored the most goals from outside box in Serie A in 2024/25 (7), including Ademola Lookman's last time out versus Napoli; only Barcelona have netted more (eight) from outside box in the big five European leagues this term.
- Since the start of October, Mateo Retegui is the only player to have been directly involved in at least 10 goals (seven goals and three assists for the Atalanta striker) in the big five European leagues: at least three more than any another player in this period (his teammate Ademola Lookman is on seven).
- Charles De Ketelaere has provided seven of his 14 assists (50%) in Serie A for Ademola Lookman, including both last time out against Napoli. If he provides an assist for the Nigerian against Udinese, the Belgian's percentage would rise to 53% (8/15); since 2004/05, among players who have provided at least 15 assists in the top-flight, only Milinkovic-Savic has had a higher percentage for a single teammate (56%, 25 of his 45 to Ciro Immobile).
- Lorenzo Lucca is one of only four players born from 2000 onwards to have been directly involved in more than 15 goals (12 goals and four assists for him) in the last two Serie A seasons (since 2023/24), alongside Dusan Vlahovic (26), Khvicha Kvaratskhelia (24) and Charles De Ketelaere (25).

**Fiorentina – Hellas Verona**

10 November 2024



- After eight encounters without a win (D4 L4), Hellas Verona won their last league game against Fiorentina. They could win consecutive matches against the Viola for the first time since 2019 in the top-flight. Furthermore, Hellas Verona have won 15 matches against the Tuscans (D20 L31) in the competition; against no team they have won more such games (also 15 also against Cagliari).
- Fiorentina have won the last two Serie A matches played at the Artemio Franchi against Hellas Verona without conceding a goal; the Viola could collect three home wins in a row without conceding against Hellas Verona for the first time ever in Serie A.
- Fiorentina have won the last five league games, last winning more matches in a row in Serie A back to the period February-April 2018, under Stefano Pioli (a run of six).
- Fiorentina have scored 2+ goals in seven of their last eight home Serie A matches, for an average of 2.5 goals per game - the only exception in the period was their goalless draw last August against Venezia.
- Hellas Verona won their last league match against a team in the top four at the start of the matchday (2-0 v Genoa last September), after remaining without a success in the previous 20 such games (D5 L15); the Gialloblù haven't won two such games in a row in Serie A since the start of the last decade.
- Hellas Verona – courtesy of four wins and seven defeats in Serie A this term – are only one of the three teams yet to draw a single match in the big five European Leagues 2024-25, alongside Barcelona and Le Havre; the last league game drawn by the Gialloblù was in May, against Inter (2-2) at the Bentegodi.
- After two victories in a row, Hellas Verona have lost their last four away games in Serie A, conceding 12 goals in the process (an average of three per match); the Gialloblù could lose five consecutive Serie A away matches under the same coach for the first time since the last eight games on the road of the 2017-18 season, under Fabio Pecchia.
- Hellas Verona are the team with the best ratio between touches in the opposition box and goals scored in Serie A this term: one goal every 8.4 touches. Meanwhile, Fiorentina are third in this ranking with a goal every 11 touches.
- Fiorentina's Moise Kean has been involved in six goals (5 goals, 1 assist) in Serie A this term, as many involvements as in the previous two Serie A seasons combined, but in 47 games (6 goals with Juventus). Kean could score in three matches in a row for only the third time in the big five European Leagues, after the four consecutive matches between March and April 2019 with Juventus, and the three with PSG between December 2020 and January 2021 in Ligue 1.
- Hellas Verona's Casper Tengstedt is the player who has scored the most goals in the first 15 minutes of play in this Serie A: three (out of four total), including the one against Roma last time out. Only Erling Haaland has scored more goals (4) in this time frame in the big five European leagues in 2024-25.



Roma - Bologna

10 November 2024



- Bologna have won their last two Serie A matches against Roma, and could win three successive games against the Capitolini for the first time in the competition since the period between 1958 and 1961 (five in that case, under Alfredo Foni first and Federico Allasio then).
- Roma lost their last league match at Olimpico against Bologna (1-3) last April, and could suffer two consecutive defeats on home soil against the Emiliani for the first time since 1959.
- For the second time in a row, Bologna will face Roma while above the Giallorossi in the table at the start of the matchday in Serie A - this had only happened once in the 21 previous meetings between the two teams in the top-flight.
- Roma have lost three of their last four league games (W1) - as many as they did in their previous 13 Serie A matches (W4 D6). In this period (since the 8th MD), only Como have picked up fewer points (one) than the Giallorossi (three) in Serie A.
- Roma have picked up 13 points in Serie A this season (W3 D4 L4). In case of a defeat against Bologna, this would be the worst start for the Capitolini after their first 12 Serie A seasonal matches in the last 20 years (13 points also in 2004/05 at this point of the season).
- Bologna have won their last two league matches without conceding; the Emiliani could collect three successive wins while keeping a clean sheet in each of those for the first time in Serie A since 1973 (one of the three meetings against Roma, won 1-0 at Olimpico).
- Roma have hit the woodwork seven times in Serie A this season (four of those at Olimpico), fewer only than Cagliari (nine); in general, in the last four top-flight seasons (since 2021/22), the Capitolini have hit the woodwork more times than any other side in the competition: 59 (both 56 Juventus and Napoli).
- The two players with the most touches in the opposition box without yet having found the net in Serie A this season belong to Bologna and Roma: Dan Ndoye (for the Emiliani, first in this standing with 34 touches) and Lorenzo Pellegrini (for the Giallorossi, second with 27).
- Paulo Dybala has scored seven goals against Bologna in Serie A, although none of those in the two matches for Roma. Only one Argentine player has netted more against the Emiliani in the top-flight: Gabriel Batistuta (9), his last three for the Giallorossi, between 2001 and 2002.
- After scoring against Lecce, Riccardo Orsolini (10 goals in 2019 and 2024, 13 in 2023) became the first Bologna player to find the net at least 10 times in three different calendar years in Serie A since Marco Di Vaio (four, between 2008 and 2011). He could score for four matches in a row for only the second time in the competition, after December 2021-January 2022 (4).



Monza - Lazio

10 November 2024



- Monza are yet to win any of their four Serie A encounters with Lazio – recording two draws and two losses. They've only ever faced Atalanta and Roma more often without winning (five each) in the competition.
- Monza have never won any of their nine Serie A encounters with the two Roman clubs, with a record of four draws, including the two most recent at U-Power Stadium, and five defeats. Additionally, the Biancorossi have never managed to keep a clean sheet against either Lazio or Roma in the league, conceding a total of 16.
- Monza have lost their last two league matches without scoring and could suffer three consecutive defeats without netting a goal for the first time in Serie A.
- After the first 11 matches of Serie A in 2024, Monza were fifth with 20 points, earned from six wins and two draws (3L), behind only Inter, Milan, Roma, and Bologna. However, in the following 20 matches, the Brianzoli have recorded the most defeats of any side (11).
- Monza have not won any of their last 10 home league matches (4D, 6L). Their last home victory at U-Power Stadium in Serie A was on March 16th against Cagliari, with this the longest active streak of consecutive home games without a win among all teams in the competition.
- Lazio have won their last three league matches, scoring at least two goals in each (10 goals in total, an average of 3.3 per game). The Biancocelesti could record four consecutive wins in Serie A for the first time since December 2023-January 2024 under Maurizio Sarri's management.
- Lazio have scored 24 goals in Serie A 2024/25 (the third-best attack, behind only Inter with 25 and Atalanta with 29). Only twice in their history have the Biancocelesti scored more goals after the first 11 matches in Serie A: in 2017/18 (31 goals) and in 1942/43 (25 goals).
- Lazio are the team that has scored the most goals in the final 30 minutes of play in this Serie A season, with 12 goals, including Mattia Zaccagni's strike (76') in their latest match against Cagliari. Of those 12 goals, nine have come in the final 15 minutes of the game – the most of any side as well.
- Milan Djuric made his Serie A debut in a match against Lazio at the Olimpico, playing for Cesena on September 14, 2014. The only multi-goal performance of the Bosnian striker in the competition came against the Biancocelesti in the return fixture last season at U-Power Stadium: a brace in a 2-2 draw.
- No player has earned more points for their team with their goals than Lazio's Boulaye Dia (seven, tied with Lautaro Martínez) in the current season. The Senegalese forward, who has been involved in three goals (one goal, two assists) in his last two league matches, has scored four times in this Serie A campaign – already matching his total goals from the 2023/24 season with Salernitana, where he netted four goals in 17 appearances.

**Inter - Napoli**

10 November 2024



- Napoli have won just one of their last 10 matches against Inter in Serie A - a 3-1 win, at Maradona, in May 2023, with goals scored by Anguissa, Di Lorenzo and Gaetano - drawing three of those (including the most recent one in March) and losing six in the process.
- Napoli are the team against whom Inter have won the most home games in Serie A: 51 successes, out of 78 total matches (D18 L9), including each of the last four home games against the Neapolitans.
- Napoli have lost seven of their last 12 games (W1 D3) played against Inter in Serie A; in the period (since the 2018-19 season), the Nerazzurri are the team against which the Neapolitans have suffered the most defeats in the competition.
- Inter have scored in each of their last 28 home games in Serie A: across the five major European Leagues, only Barcelona (29) and Lille (30) are on a longer such on-going run than the Nerazzurri.
- After a run of nine consecutive unbeaten league games (W8 D1), Napoli lost last time out against Atalanta (0-3) and they could suffer two defeats in a row in Serie A for the first time since December 2023 under Walter Mazzarri.
- Napoli have not conceded a goal in four consecutive away games in Serie A - the longest on-going such run currently in Serie A together with Fiorentina (4). The Neapolitans could keep a clean sheet for more away games in a row in Serie A for the first time since six consecutive matches on the road between January and March 2023.
- Inter are the team that has taken the most corners in this Serie A: 77, only fewer than Real Sociedad (81), Tottenham (90) and Man City (98) in Europe's top-5 Leagues. Napoli - with almost 20 fewer corners to their name (58) - have scored more goals than the Nerazzurri (2) though from such situations.
- After scoring three goals in his first four Serie A matches against Napoli, Lautaro Martínez has only scored one goal against the Neapolitans in his eight subsequent matches in the competition, failing to score in each of the last five. If he scores, the Argentine would become the Inter player with the most goals scored against Napoli in home matches in Serie A in the three-points-for-a-win era (currently three goals, level with Iván Zamorano).
- Only Riccardo Orsolini has scored the opening goal of the match more times (4) than Giovanni Di Lorenzo in Serie A 2024-25: three, alongside Dusan Vlahovic and Artem Dovbyk. Since his debut in the top-flight (2018-19), the Napoli full-back could become the second defender in the competition with 20+ goals and 20+ assists (19G+27A so far), after only Theo Hernández (29G+ 23A).
- The first of Matteo Politano's two braces in Serie A came against Inter for Sassuolo on 14 May 2016. With the Nerazzurri, the now Napoli striker played 47 matches in the tournament, scoring five goals and delivering six assists between 2018 and 2020.
