

**Inter - Parma**

6 December 2024



- Inter won their last Serie A match against Parma, on 4 March 2021 with Antonio Conte on the bench, but have not achieved consecutive successes against the Emilians in the tournament since the period between November 2006 and September 2009 (five in that case).
- Inter have not won at home against Parma in Serie A since 21 April 2013 (D4 L1 since then); for the Nerazzurri this is their longest ongoing streak of home games without a win against an opponent in the competition.
- Inter have kept clean sheets in four of their last six league games, after failing to do so in each of their previous four Serie A matches; from the weekend of 19-20 October onwards, only Napoli (five) have kept more clean sheets than the Nerazzurri (four) in the top-flight.
- Inter have scored in their last 29 home league games and could do so in 30 in a row for the fourth time in their Serie A history, the most recent being between July 2020 and February 2022 (32 in that case).
- Parma have won two of their last three league games (L1), after having achieved just one success in their previous 11 Serie A games this season (D6 L4); the Gialloblù have not achieved two consecutive wins in the competition since July 2020, against Napoli and Brescia in that case, with Roberto D'Aversa on the bench.
- Parma won their last away game in the league (2-1 against Venezia) after a streak of 19 away games without a win in Serie A (D9 L10); the Gialloblù have not obtained two away wins in a row in the competition since July-August 2020, when they won against Brescia and Lecce.
- On the one hand, no team have conceded fewer goals than Parma in the first 30 minutes of in Serie A this term (two), while on the other, Inter have conceded 43% of their goals in the last quarter of an hour of play (6/14); the joint-most, along with Empoli.
- Internazionale's Marcus Thuram could become the third player in Serie A history to reach double figures for goals in a single season by only scoring 2+ goals in games, after Norberto Höfling in 1949/50 and Harald Nielsen in 1962/63.
- Henrikh Mkhitaryan has scored three goals against Parma in Serie A, his joint-most against an opponent (three goals also against Genoa and Inter); indeed, in both of his matches against the Gialloblù he has been involved in two goals (a brace in November 2020 and a goal plus an assist in July 2020).
- Before Enrico Delprato, the last Italian Parma defender to score at least three goals in a single Serie A season was Paolo De Ceglie in 2014/15 (also three). The last to reach four was Alessandro Lucarelli in 2013/14.

**Atalanta - Milan**

- Atalanta and Milan have drawn 45 of their 126 Serie A matches, with 26 Nerazzurri wins and 55 Rossoneri victories completing the tally; against no other team have the Bergamo club recorded more draws in the competition (45 also against Juventus).
- Since 2020/21 onwards, Milan have won four of their eight Serie A matches against Atalanta (D2 L2). During this period, the Bergamo club have lost more matches only against Inter (six) and Napoli (five).
- Atalanta won their last league match at the Gewiss Stadium against Milan (3-2 on 9 December 2023) and have only once achieved two consecutive home wins against the Rossoneri in Serie A: between November 2006 and January 2008.
- Atalanta (31) have won more than 30 points after 14 games played in Serie A for the first time in their history, considering three points per win all-time – furthermore, the Bergamo team have obtained eight consecutive victories for the second time in Serie A, after a streak of nine consecutive successes recorded between February and July 2020.
- Atalanta have scored at least two goals in each of their last 11 home games in Serie A, the longest ongoing streak of home games with at least two goals in the competition. Meanwhile, the last team to record a longer such run was Juventus: 12 between December 2019 and July 2020.
- Milan have kept a clean sheet in six of their last 10 league games, including clean sheets in their two most recent games; the Rossoneri have not kept three consecutive clean sheets in Serie A since February 2023, when the third was against Atalanta.
- Milan have won just two of their six away league games this season (D2 L2), but could remain unbeaten after their first seven away games in Serie A for the first time since 2018/19 (W2 D3 L2).
- No team have scored more headed goals than Atalanta in Serie A this season (six, also Udinese); furthermore, the Bergamo team have yet to concede a headed goal in the 2024/25 campaign (also Napoli and Udinese).
- Match between the four Serie A players that have been involved in the most goals in the calendar year 2024 in all competitions: Charles De Ketelaere (30, 14G+16A), Ademola Lookman (30, 19G+11A), Rafael Leão (28, 16G+12A) and Christian Pulisic (27, 16G+11A).
- All three of Rafael Leão's goals in Serie A this season have come away from home. Meanwhile, among those who have only scored away from home in the competition this term, no player has found the net more times than Razvan Marin, Davide Frattesi and Duván Zapata.

**Genoa - Torino**

- Since the start of 2018, Torino have won eight Serie A matches against Genoa (D2 L1). In this period against no team have they achieved more wins in the competition (eight also against Udinese).
- Genoa have kept clean sheets in each of their last two Serie A home games against Torino, after a streak of nine home games in which they had conceded. Before this, the rossoblù had kept three clean sheets in a row at the Ferraris against the Granata (between 1995 and 2009).
- Genoa are unbeaten in their last four Serie A games (W2 D2), after losing five of their previous six (D1); in particular, the Ligurians won their most recent match against Udinese and have not achieved back-to-back wins in the league since last January (against Salernitana and Lecce in that case).
- Genoa are winless in their last eight games at the Ferraris in Serie A (D5 L3) after having achieved three wins in a row between last April and May; the Rossoblù are also the side to have drawn the most home games in Serie A this term (five).
- In the last five league games, Torino have scored just one goal, after having scored 10 goals in their previous five.
- Torino have lost each of their last four away league games; the Granata have not lost at least five consecutive away games in Serie A since between January and July 2020 (eight in that case).
- Genoa have scored six of their 13 goals in the final quarter of an hour of matches (46%), a division high. However, the Grifone are also the side that have conceded the most goals in the second half in Serie A 2024-25 (17).
- In this championship, no team has conceded more shots on target than Torino (74, like Hellas Verona); Vanja Milinkovic-Savic is in fact the goalkeeper who has made the most saves (50) in Serie A this season.
- With two goals and one assist, Andrea Pinamonti has been involved in three goals in his last four Serie A games, as many as in his previous 11. The Genoa striker has found the net five times in 13 matches in Serie A this season and has never scored more in his first 14 games of the season in the top-flight (five also in 2023-24 and 2021-22).
- Antonio Sanabria (48 – 39 goals and nine assists) is close to being involved in 50 goals in Serie A, with both of his goals in this championship coming away from home (against Hellas Verona and Cagliari). The 1996-born player played 39 Serie A games for Genoa between 2019 and 2020, scoring his first nine goals in the tournament.

**Juventus - Bologna**

- Juventus are unbeaten in their last 24 Serie A matches against Bologna (W17 D7), their longest unbeaten run in the competition.
- In their last 11 home league games against Bologna, Juventus have always alternated between conceding and keeping a clean sheet.
- Juventus have drawn eight of their first 14 league games this season, and have never drawn more of their first 15 Serie A games of the season (eight in 1965-66 and 1980-81).
- Juventus have kept a clean sheet in 10 of their 14 matches this term - the Bianconeri have never recorded 11 clean sheets in the first 15 games of a season in their history in Serie A.
- Bologna have won four of their last five league games (L1), as many successes as in their previous 17 Serie A matches (W4 D11 L2) – in fact, in the last five matchdays, only Atalanta (15) have won more points than the Emilians in Serie A (12, equal with Lazio and Fiorentina - the Viola have played one match fewer).
- Bologna have won three of their first seven away games this season (D2 L2), and in the three points for a win era they have only won more in their first eight away games of the season in Serie A once (four wins in 2017-18 under Roberto Donadoni as coach).
- Thiago Motta has drawn 10 of his first 19 games in charge of Juventus in all competitions (W8 L1); the only Juventus coach since 1929-30 who took fewer official games to reach 10 draws was Cestmir Vycpalek in 1971 (12).
- Bologna are the side that has had the most pressed sequences in Serie A this season (the number of opponents' sequences, with three or fewer passes, that end 40 meters or less from their goal): 179 for the Rossoblù, 68 more than Juventus (18th in this ranking).
- Dusan Vlahovic has scored six goals against Bologna in Serie A, and only against Cagliari has he done better in the competition (seven). Excluding penalties, the Juventus striker has not scored at home in the league since his brace against Frosinone in February (12 games since then).
- Santiago Castro has scored five goals and provided five assists this season in all competitions (he is the Bologna's player who has been directly involved in the most goals, 10): among Serie A players, only three others have already reached this quota of goals and assists: Ademola Lookman, Christian Pulisic and Romelu Lukaku – among them he is the youngest, six years ahead of the second.

**Roma - Lecce**

- Roma have avoided defeat in 34 of their 36 Serie A matches against Lecce (W24 D10). Amongst the teams they have faced at least 10 times in the topflight, the Salento team is the one against which Roma have the lowest loss percentage (6%).
- After losing their first home Serie A match against Lecce on 20 April 1986, Roma are unbeaten in the following 17 (W15 D2), winning all their last seven such matches - the longest ongoing home winning streak for the team from the capital in the competition.
- Roma have picked up a maximum of 13 points from their first 14 Serie A games of the season for only the third time in their history (counting three points for a win) after 1978/79 (13) and 1950/51 (10) – should they fail to win this match, they would establish their second-worst result ever after 15 matches (10 points in 1950/51).
- Roma have lost six of their last seven league games (W1), including all their last four. Only once in their Serie A history have Roma recorded five consecutive defeats - between February and March 1951.
- Lecce scored in their last three Serie A games, as many times as in the previous 14, a run in which they had failed to score on 11 occasions. Overall, the Apulians have neither conceded nor scored more than one goal in their last six games in the competition.
- After a streak of seven away Serie A games without scoring, Lecce found the back of the net in their most recent match against Venezia, in which they also kept a clean sheet. The Apulians have not kept two consecutive clean sheets away from home in the competition since between November 2022 and January 2023.
- Roma and Lecce are the only two teams in this championship that have yet to find the back of the net in the first 15 minutes of play – the Apulians have scored only two goals in the first half, a negative record both overall and in percentage terms in Serie A this season (29% - 2/7).
- Roma are the team that have made the most high turnovers in Serie A this season with 114, while Lecce are in 14th position in this ranking. Despite this, the team from the capital have had five fewer shots than the Apulians from high turnover situations this term (13 v 18).
- Paulo Dybala has scored four goals in six games against Lecce in Serie A (averaging a goal every 101 minutes), only against Monza (every 47 minutes) and Benevento (every 89 minutes) does he have a better minutes-per-goal average in his career in Serie A.
- Ante Rebic, who has scored two goals against Roma in Serie A (in June 2020 and February 2021 with AC Milan), found the net on the last matchday against Juventus. Rebic has not scored in two consecutive appearances in the competition since May 2021.

**Fiorentina - Cagliari**

- Fiorentina are unbeaten in their last seven matches against Cagliari in Serie A (W4 D3), scoring exactly three goals in three of the most recent four. Only twice have the Viola recorded more consecutive matches without defeat against the Sardinians in the competition – a run of eight (W5 D3) between April 2009 and November 2012 and a run of 10 (W3 D7) between April 1980 and November 1991.
- Among the teams they have faced 25+ times at home in Serie A, Cagliari are the team against which Fiorentina has the highest percentage of home wins - 69% - 29/42 (D8 L5).
- No team have picked up fewer points than Cagliari in this Serie A season against opponents currently in the top half of the table (2). On the other hand, no team has won more points than Fiorentina (21, along with Atalanta, Napoli and Lazio) against opponents currently in 11th place or lower.
- Fiorentina are on a run of seven consecutive victories in Serie A and could equal their historic record of consecutive wins in the top-flight – a run of eight between February and April 1960, under Luis Carniglia.
- Cagliari have 14 points in Serie A this season, four more than in the last campaign after the same number of games. The last time the Rossoblù earned more points after the first 15 games of a season in the topflight was in 2019/20 (29).
- Fiorentina have collected 28 points so far and should they win, could pick up 30+ points after their first 14 games in a Serie A season for the first time in the three points for a win era.
- Cagliari (10) and Fiorentina (eight) are the two teams that have gained the most points in this Serie A season thanks to goals scored after the 70th minute of play.
- Fiorentina are the team with the highest shooting accuracy in this Serie A (53%), calculated as the ratio between shots on target and total shots (excluding blocked shots). Cagliari, on the other hand, are the team that have recorded the lowest percentage with just 35%.
- Moise Kean can become the third Italian Fiorentina player to reach double figures in goals in the first 14 games played by the Viola team in a Serie A season in the three points for a win era, after Luca Toni (in 2005/06) and Giuseppe Rossi (in 2013/14).
- Roberto Piccoli is the player who has scored against the most different teams in Serie A without ever having scored more than one goal against a single opponent (17). This record could no longer be valid after the next match, considering that the Cagliari striker has already scored against Fiorentina, netting against them in February for Lecce.



Hellas Verona - Empoli

8 December 2024



- Hellas Verona have remained unbeaten in each of their last six Serie A matches against Empoli (W3 D3), winning the most recent two; only against Venezia (7 in a row) do they have a longer ongoing unbeaten streak in the competition.
- Empoli have won only one of their seven away Serie A games against Hellas Verona (D1 L5), winning 1-0 in December 2015, thanks to an Andrea Costa goal.
- Empoli are the team that Hellas Verona have faced the most times in Serie A without ever conceding more than one goal in a single match. In 14 previous matches, they have kept four clean sheets and conceded exactly one goal on 10 occasions.
- Hellas Verona have conceded goals in each of their last 11 league games (2.7 goals conceded on average) and have lost each of their last three matches; the last time the Gialloblù recorded more consecutive defeats in Serie A was between October and November 2023, suffering five defeats in a row under Marco Baroni.
- Empoli have won only once in their last nine league games (D4 L4), 1-0 in November against Como; this after the Tuscans had won two of their previous four Serie A matches (D2).
- Hellas Verona are the first team to lose 10 of their first 14 games in a Serie A season without sitting in the relegation zone since the league returned to 20 teams in 2004/05.
- Empoli are one of two teams yet to find the back of the net in the last 15 minutes of play this season in the big five European leagues (also Freiburg); in the same period Hellas Verona have scored five goals, more than any other team currently in the bottom five positions of the Serie A table.
- 24% of Hellas Verona's goals in Serie A this season have been scored from outside the box (4/17). Overall, in 2024 only Atalanta (16) have scored more goals from distance than the Gialloblù (13) in the top-flight.
- No defender has created more chances following a carry of 5+ metres than Jackson Tchatchoua in this Serie A season (10). The Hellas Verona man has been involved in two league goals this season (one goal and one assist), as many as across the whole of last season.
- Lorenzo Colombo scored the only top-flight brace of his career against Hellas Verona in November 2023 at the Bentegodi. 82% (9/11) of his overall Serie A goals have come away from home and among players with at least 10 goals in the competition, only Joshua Zirkzee (85%), Andrea Ranocchia (83%) and Stefano Eranio (83%) have recorded a higher proportion of goals on the road.

**Venezia - Como**

- Como are unbeaten against Venezia in Serie A though the only previous season in which the two teams faced each other in the competition dates back to 1949/50, when the Larians won the first meeting 2-1, then drew 0-0 in the second meeting.
- Venezia have remained unbeaten in each of their last five home league matches against Como (W3 D2); the last away league win for the Lariani against this opponent came back in September 1994, 1-0 in Serie B.
- Venezia have both scored and conceded in each of their last seven Serie A matches against newly promoted sides, winning only once in that period (D3 L3): 2-1 in September 2021 against Empoli.
- After the 1-1 draw against Genoa in their most recent away game, Como can remain unbeaten in two consecutive away matches in Serie A for the first time since January-February 2003 (two 0-0 draws, against Torino and Empoli).
- Venezia have lost each of their last four league games and the last time they recorded five consecutive defeats in the first half of the season in Serie A was in 2001/02 under Cesare Prandelli.
- Como are one of four teams that have not won a game in the big five European Leagues since October, along with Heidenheim, Bochum and Nantes.
- Only Lecce (3.9%) have recorded a lower conversion rate than Venezia (7%) and Como (6.9%) in Serie A this season; Venezia have in fact scored just 11 goals from 158 shots and Como 14 goals from 204 shots.
- Venezia are the team that have scored the fewest goals from open play in Serie A this season (4), while only Hellas Verona (28) have conceded more such goals than Como (18 – level with Parma).
- Joel Pohjanpalo has scored in each of his last three league appearances against Como (all in Serie B); the Venezia striker has scored four goals in Serie A this season and can become the first Finnish player to score five goals in a single season in the competition.
- Patrick Cutrone, who scored in his last league match against Venezia (March 2024 in Serie B), has failed to find the net in his last eight appearances in Serie A, after scoring four goals across his first six outings this season. The last players to net five or more goals in a single top-flight season for Como were Nicola Caccia (5), Nicola Amoruso (6) and Fabio Pecchia (6), all in the 2002/03 campaign.



Napoli - Lazio

8 December 2024



- Lazio are unbeaten in their last three Serie A games against Napoli (W2 D1), having lost all four of their previous matches.
- Napoli have scored an average of 2.8 goals in their last 12 home games against Lazio in Serie A (34 in total), winning eight of those games (D1 L3); however, they have lost the two most recent ones and have never suffered more than two consecutive home defeat against these opponents in the competition.
- Lazio are the team against which Napoli have won the most matches in Serie A (54) and scored their-second most goals against (192, more only against Bologna, 197).
- Lazio are unbeaten in three of their last four matches against the league leaders at the start of the matchday (two wins, including one against Napoli, and a draw); Biancocelesti had lost 16 of their previous 17 such matches (1W).
- Napoli have kept a clean sheet in nine games this season, only fewer than Juventus (10); only once in their history have the Partenopei achieved double figures for clean sheets in their first 15 games of the season in Serie A, in 1970/71.
- All four of Lazio's defeats in this championship have come away from home, including the most recent one, against Parma 3-1 at the Tardini; in general, however, the Biancocelesti have found success in two of their last three away games (the defeat against the Ducali being the exception), as many victories as in their previous eight away games in the tournament (D2 L4).
- Lazio and Napoli (both four) are the two teams that have scored the most goals in this Serie A during second half injury time; more generally, only Atalanta (18) have scored more goals than the Biancoceleste (17) during the second half in 2024-25.
- Napoli are the team that have conceded the fewest goals from set pieces in this Serie A season (one penalty against Parma), while only Fiorentina (11) have scored more goals from set pieces than Lazio (nine, equal with Atalanta) in the current tournament.
- Lazio are Giovanni Simeone's favourite opposition in Serie A, thanks to eight goals in 14 matches: the Napoli striker is currently the player in the competition who has scored the most goals against the Biancocelesti.
- Mattia Zaccagni is one of two Italian players, with Riccardo Orsolini, who has scored at least five goals in each of the last five Serie A seasons (five goals for the Biancoceleste in the current tournament). The Lazio player has been involved in three goals against Napoli in the competition (two goals and one assist), however, he has neither scored nor provided an assist away from home against this opponent in the tournament.



Monza - Udinese

9 December 2024



- Six of the last seven league matches between Monza and Udinese have ended in a draw – the other result was a 2-1 Udinese win on 26 August 2022 in Serie A (goals by Beto, Udogie and Colpani).
- Udinese have won only one of their seven away games between Serie A and Serie B against Monza, on 26 August 2022 by 2-1.
- Monza are one of three teams that Udinese have faced at least four times in the last three Serie A seasons (since 2022/23) without ever losing, together with Empoli and Sassuolo: the Friulians have one win and three draws against the Brianza team in the period.
- Among teams currently in Serie A, Monza are the one that have been waiting the longest for a home win: 11 games (D4 L7); more specifically, the Brianza team have lost their last two home games in the league and have only once had three home defeats in a row in the competition, in September 2022.
- Udinese have lost four of their last five away games in Serie A, although they drew in their most recent game (1-1 against Empoli); the Friulians had won three of their four away games before this run (D1).
- Their next one will be Monza's 100th goal in Serie A, with the Brianza team becoming the 60th team to reach this milestone in the competition.
- Udinese, along with Atalanta, are one of the two teams that have scored the most headed goals in this Serie A season (six for both), while Monza are the team that have conceded the most goals using this technique in the current tournament (seven).
- Only Empoli (five) have had fewer shots following high turnovers than Monza (eight) and Udinese (10) in this Serie A season (Torino also have 10).
- Udinese is the team against which Gianluca Caprari has provided the most assists in Serie A: five, one in each of his last five games as a starter against this opponent in the competition. Since Opta began collecting this data (since 2004/05), no player has found at least one assist in more consecutive games as a starter against a single opponent (five also for Luis Alberto against Bologna).
- Sandi Lovric has been involved in two goals in his last three away appearances in Serie A (goal against Venezia and assist against Empoli), after not having been involved in any goals in his previous nine away games in the competition; the Udinese midfielder also scored one of his seven goals in the Italian topflight against Monza, on 8 April 2023 at the Bluenergy Stadium.
