

**Roma - Genoa**

17 January 2025



- Genoa have won 33 matches against Roma in Serie A (D26 L54), only winning more against Lazio (38 wins); however, the Rossoblu have collected only one win in their last 19 matches against the Giallorossi in the competition (D55 L13).
- Roma have kept four clean sheets in their last six Serie A matches against Genoa, as many as in their previous 14 games against them; furthermore, the Giallorossi have only failed to score once in their last 19 games against the Rossoblu in the competition.
- Roma have not lost at home against Genoa for exactly 35 years, since 17 January 1990; this unbeaten streak of 21 home games (W17 D4) is their joint third longest such open run in the competition (also 21 against Parma, 27 against Hellas Verona and 30 against Bari).
- Roma are unbeaten in their last four Serie A matches (W2 D2), after losing seven of their previous nine games (W2); the Giallorossi have also won three of their last six matches (D2 L1), as many as in their previous 15 (D4 L8).
- After losing two home games in a row, Roma have won all of their last three Serie A games at the Stadio Olimpico; the Giallorossi haven't had a longer run since winning five consecutively under José Mourinho between September and November 2023.
- Roma have won six of their 20 matches in Serie A this term (D6 L8), their worst total in the three points per win era at this point in the season; the Giallorossi last won six or fewer games in their first 21 matches of a league season back in 1993-94 (five).
- Patrick Vieira has five clean sheets in his first eight managerial games in Serie A; there are only 12 coaches in the history of the Italian top-flight to have kept six clean sheets in their first nine matches, the last of which was Alexander Blessin with Genoa.
- In their last five Serie A away matches, Genoa have conceded just one goal and remain unbeaten thanks to three wins and two draws; the Rossoblu last had more away unbeaten matches in the competition between January and July 2020, when they achieved two wins and four draws under Davide Nicola.
- Paulo Dybala has scored nine goals against Genoa in Serie A; among players currently in the top-flight, only two have done better against a single opponent currently in the competition: Dybala himself against Udinese (12) and Lautaro Martínez against Cagliari (10).
- Andrea Pinamonti has scored five goals against Roma, more than he has against any other opponent in Serie A; however, none of his goals against the Giallorossi were in his last three matches against them.

**Bologna - Monza**

- Bologna won the first and most recent of their five matches against Monza in Serie A, with two draws and a victory of the Brianzoli in the other three games.
- Monza have a win and a draw in two Serie A away matches against Bologna; the Rossoblu could become the second team, after Hellas Verona, to fail to achieve even one success in their first three home matches against the Brianza team in the competition.
- Bologna have won three of the last four matches against teams that started the MD bottom of the Serie A table (D1), scoring 2.5 goals on average per game (10 goals), after having had three draws and one defeat in their previous four.
- Bologna have drawn five of their first nine home games this league season (W3 D1), including the most recent game against Roma; only four times have they drawn more in their first 10 Serie A home games of the season, most recently in 1989-90 (6).
- Last time out against Fiorentina, Salvatore Bocchetti won his first game in Serie A during his ninth match in the competition, becoming the first coach to take as many as nine games to find his first victory since Marco Baroni (17); Monza last won two league games in a row last March, against Genoa and Cagliari.
- Monza have lost their last two Serie A away games, losing against Lecce and Parma and only once have they lost more away games in a row in a single top-flight season, between October and November 2022 (3).
- If they win, Bologna – 30 points in 19 matches so far – would set a new record for points won after the first 20 games of the season in the era of three points for a win in Serie A (33).
- Bologna have forced the most high turnovers in this Serie A campaign (144), while Monza are bottom in this metric (88).
- Lewis Ferguson has already scored a goal against Monza in Serie A (his first away) and they could become the third team against which he has scored both home and away (after Atalanta and Lecce). Furthermore, if he finds the net in this match he would become the first Scottish player with 2+ goals for three consecutive seasons in the Italian top-flight, after the seven scored in 2022/23 and the six in 2023/24.
- Among the strikers who have scored at least five goals over the last three Serie A seasons, no one has scored a higher ratio in January than Patrick Ciurria and Gianluca Caprari (57%, 4/7). Ciurria – who scored last time out against Fiorentina – last scored in two Serie A appearances in a row back in January 2023.

**Juventus - Milan**

- Milan are the opponents that Juventus have both collected the most draws (58) and suffered the most defeats (53) against in the Italian top division. The Rossoneri are also the side that have managed to score the most goals against the Bianconeri in Serie A (227 goals).
- Juventus have kept a clean sheet in their last three league games against Milan (W1 D2), while they have never kept four clean sheets in a row against the Rossoneri in Serie A. However, the Bianconeri have only scored two goals in their last eight league matches against them.
- After a run of nine consecutive home wins against Milan in Serie A, Juventus have failed to win their last four such encounters (D2 L2). The Bianconeri have never reached five home games in a row without success against the Rossoneri in Serie A (also 4 between 1991 and 1994).
- In this Serie A campaign, Juventus have dropped points from a winning position in seven games. The last season that this occurred on more occasions was in 2019-20 (eight – never more than eight in the three-points per win era). This is only the third time that they have done so in seven matches across a season (alongside 1984-85 and 1968-69).
- Juventus have dropped points from a winning position in their last three games (D3); only in 1971 have the Bianconeri collected a longer streak of games in which they were ahead but failed to win.
- Juventus earned 12 home draws in Serie A across 2024 - no team has ever collected more in a single calendar year in the competition (also 12 for Udinese in 2023 and Cagliari in 2005). Indeed, the Bianconeri have drawn their last three home league games, last drawing four in a row between April - May 2009.
- Milan won their last Serie A game against Como and are looking to win back-to-back matches in the competition for the first time since September (three against Venezia, Inter and Lecce).
- Milan have won their last two away matches in Serie A, as many as in their previous 10 (D4 L4). It is the Rossoneri's longest such streak since a run of three in March 2024.
- Weston McKennie has provided 10 assists across the last two Serie A campaigns. Among midfielders, only Christian Pulisic (12) and Henrikh Mkhitaryan (11) have provided more – his assists have earned eight points, more than any other midfielder in this period.
- Théo Hernández has scored 30 goals in Serie A, becoming the first defender in AC Milan's history to reach this milestone in the competition (overtaking Paolo Maldini). There are only four defenders who have netted more for a single side in Serie A history, while his next strike would see him draw level with Fiorentina's Sergio Cervato (31).



## Atalanta - Napoli

18 January 2025



- Atalanta have won their last two Serie A matches against Napoli (both 3-0). They last achieved three consecutive league successes against the Neapolitans between April 1997 - February 1998: three 1-0 victories in a row under Emiliano Mondonico.
- Atalanta have lost their last three home Serie A games against Napoli, their longest ongoing such streak at home against a single opponent in the competition. Atalanta last lost four or more home games in a row in Serie A against a single opponent against Juventus between January 2005 and March 2016 (9, before Gian Piero Gasperini's era).
- Atalanta are unbeaten in their last 15 league games (W11 D4), though they have drawn their last three. Only between January and July 2020 have they enjoyed a longer run without defeat (17 in that case – W13 D4), while they have not drawn four consecutive matches since May 2015.
- Atalanta have scored in all of their last 25 Serie A home games (63 goals, 2.5 on average per match), already a record for the Nerazzurri in the competition.
- Napoli have won their last five Serie A matches, including the most recent three without conceding a goal; under Antonio Conte, the Neapolitans have never enjoyed four or more clean sheets in a row, nor beyond five consecutive league successes.
- Napoli have won seven of their first 10 away games this season (D2 L1), while they have only earned seven wins in their first 11 away league games of the season twice: 10 in 2017-18, a championship which they finished in second place, and nine in 2022-23, their last Scudetto season.
- Atalanta have scored 10 headed goals in this Serie A season, including one in the last match against Juventus, more than any other team in the 2024-25 campaign and already equalling their tally from last season. The Nerazzurri haven't netted more since 2019-20 (14) – Napoli and Atalanta are, alongside Udinese, two of the three teams to have not yet conceded a headed goal.
- Despite being 11<sup>th</sup> for high turnovers in this Serie A campaign (118), Napoli are in first position both for shots after a high turnover (32) and for goals in these situations (four, equal to Inter and Roma).
- Mateo Retegui has scored 20 goals in Serie A, more than any other Italian player since his debut in the competition last season. In particular, he has scored 13 goals in 18 appearances in this championship, while the last Italian player to score more in a single season for Atalanta was Cristiano Doni in 2001-02 (16).
- In his last two league games, Romelu Lukaku has scored a goal (v Fiorentina) and provided two assists (one against the Viola and one against Hellas Verona). The Napoli striker has provided an assist in three consecutive Serie A matches only once before, between February - March 2021 with Inter, doing so in four successive appearances.

**Fiorentina - Torino**

- Torino have won 50 Serie A matches against Fiorentina (D51 L50), more than against any other team in the competition. However, the Granata have only won two of their 10 most recent matches against the Viola in the top-flight (D3 L5).
- Fiorentina have kept a clean sheet in each of their last three Serie A matches against Torino (W2 D1), as many times as in their previous 14; the Viola have not recorded four clean sheets in a row against the Granata in the competition since October 1969.
- After a run of eight wins in a row in Serie A, Fiorentina are now winless in their last five matches in the Italian top-flight (D1 L4), but have not gone longer without winning in the league since February 2023 (6).
- Fiorentina have lost their last two Serie A home games, as many as their previous 21 beforehand (W13 D6), while they lost three in a row at home in the division since February 2005.
- Torino have drawn their last three Serie A matches, as many as in their previous 16 (W5 L8); the Granata have not recorded four draws in a row in the competition since a run of five between January and February 2021.
- In their last 15 Serie A matches, Torino have earned only two wins (D5 L8, while, in this period, no team has earned fewer victories than the Granata in the competition.
- Torino have collected eight points in their last 10 Serie A matches, after they had picked up 14 in their first 10 of the season; this difference of -6 is the joint-lowest such drop-off of any side across the two halves of the current campaign.
- Fiorentina are, along with Inter, one of the two teams to have scored the most goals from penalties in Serie A this season (five), while Torino are, alongside Milan, one of the two teams yet to have conceded a goal from the penalty spot – not since the 2021/22 season have the Viola scored more penalty goals in a Serie A campaign (9).
- Lucas Beltrán is just one goal involvement away from last season's tally in Serie A, with three goals and four assists in 16 games in 2024/25 compared to six goals and two assists in 32 matches in 2023/24.
- After his goal against Juventus, Nikola Vlasic became the fourth Torino midfielder to have both 2+ goals and 2+ assists in three different Serie A seasons on record (from 2004/05), after Daniele Baselli, Marco Benassi and Alessandro Rosina. Indeed, he could score in two games in a row in the Italian top-flight for only the second time in his career, after a run of three matches across August and September 2022.



## Parma - Venezia

- Parma are unbeaten in seven Serie A matches against Venezia (W5 D2); among teams against which they have never lost in the top-flight, only against Cremonese have they played more games (eight).
- Parma have won their last five matches against Venezia in Serie A, scoring 13 goals in the period (2.6 per game on average); only against Bari they ever achieved more consecutive wins in their history in the top flight (six between 1999 and 2009).
- Despite Venezia having scored in each of their three away matches against Parma in Serie A, the Venetians have earned just one point in these three away games (four goals for the Venetians, seven for the Emilians). The two teams will face each other at the Tardini stadium in the top-flight for the first time since 5<sup>th</sup> May 2002, 22 years and 259 days ago (2-1 win for Parma).
- Parma haven't scored in three of their last four league games, including the two most recent; the Emilians could go three consecutive Serie A games without scoring for the first time since January-February 2021.
- Parma have won two of their last three league games at the Tardini stadium (L1), as many as their previous 24 home Serie A games (W2 D7 L15). After a 2-1 win against Monza, the Ducali could win two home games in a row in Serie A for the first time since January 2020.
- Venezia have picked up the fewest points in away matches in Serie A this season (three in 10 away games, from three draws). In general, the Venetians haven't won any of their last 17 away games in Serie A (D4 L13), while their last away win in the top-flight was back in February 2022 against Torino.
- Parma have scored the joint-most goals from corners in Serie A this season (six, level with Inter and Udinese), while on the other hand, Venezia have conceded the most goals via corners (seven).
- The most recent of Ange-Yoan Bonny's four goals in Serie A was netted against Venezia in the reverse match in November. Across Serie A and Serie B, he has never scored more than one goal against a single opponent (10 goals in total for him).
- Venezia's last seven league goals have been scored by seven different players: Hans Nicolussi Caviglia, Gaetano Oristanio, Mikael Ellertsson, Jay Idzes, Francesco Zampano, Marin Sverko and Joel Pohjanpalo.
- Since his Serie A debut on 2024/25 MD8, Filip Stankovic has made the most saves in the competition, with 51 in 13 matches (3.9 on average per game).

**Cagliari - Lecce**

19 January 2025



- Lecce are unbeaten in their last six matches against Cagliari in Serie A (W2 D4), only against Siena between 2004 and 2009 have they recorded a streak of seven consecutive matches without defeat in the top division.
- After the 1-0 success in the reverse fixture on last 31 August, Lecce could win both seasonal matches against Cagliari for the first time in Serie A.
- Cagliari have lost just one of their 10 home games against Lecce in Serie A (W5 D4), drawing the most recent two; the only away success of Lecce in the tournament dates back to 26 February 2012 (2-1 at Sant'Elia stadium, under Serse Cosmi).
- Cagliari have lost their last two league games at the Unipol Domus without scoring, the last time they recorded three home defeats in a row in a single Serie A season was between March and April 2022. The Sardinians could, furthermore, fail to score in three consecutive home games in the top division for the first time since November-December 2012.
- After the 3-1 success against Empoli last time out, Lecce could win two games in a row in Serie A for the first time since last April (against Empoli and Sassuolo in that case).
- Cagliari have so far recorded exactly the same data as their last season after 20 games: 18 points (W4 D6 L10), with 19 goals scored and 33 goals conceded.
- Lecce have won 20 points after 20 matches this season – in their previous 10 seasons in Serie A only twice had they earned more points after as many matches played: 21 in 2023-24 and 25 in 2004-05.
- Lecce (5.9%) and Cagliari (7.4%) are the two teams with the lowest shot conversion rate (including blocks) in Serie A 2024/25.
- Nadir Zortea has scored four goals in 17 appearances in this championship, as many as in his previous 67 Serie A matches. He has found the net in the last two matches, and in the era of three points for a win only one Cagliari player (excluding strikers) has scored in three consecutive games played in Serie A: Radja Nainggolan between November and December 2019.
- Lecce's Nikola Krstovic has scored six goals in 20 league appearances this season and is just one goal away from equaling his tally from last season in Serie A (7 goals in 35 matches). He has scored two goals against Cagliari in the tournament and only against Monza he has scored more in Serie A (3 goals).



## Hellas Verona - Lazio

19 January 2025



- After the win in the reverse match on 16<sup>th</sup> September, Lazio could win both of their Serie A games against Hellas Verona in a single season for the first time since 2017/18.
- Lazio haven't lost in 16 of their last 18 Serie A games against Hellas Verona (W10 D6), including the six most recent (W3 D3); the last Scaligeri win against the Biancocelesti was back on 24<sup>th</sup> October 2021 (4-1 at Bentegodi stadium under Igor Tudor).
- Hellas Verona are unbeaten in their last three home Serie A games against Lazio (W1 D2), drawing the two most recent; only once have the two teams drawn three consecutive matches at the Bentegodi stadium in the top-flight: between 1975 and 1978.
- Hellas Verona haven't scored in four of their last six home league games, including the two most recent against AC Milan and Udinese; the last time they failed to score in three consecutive games at the Bentegodi stadium in Serie A was between March and April 2021 (the third match in that case was against Lazio).
- Lazio have recorded three games in a row without a win for the first time in the current league season (D2 L1), the Biancocelesti could have a longer streak without any win in Serie A for the first time since July 2020 (five matches in that case).
- Lazio (55) and Hellas Verona (53) are the two teams that have received the highest number of cards in Serie A this season: 51 yellow cards and four red cards for the Biancocelesti and 47 yellows and six reds for the Scaligeri.
- Lazio (10) and Hellas Verona (six) are two of the three teams, with Atalanta (nine), with the most goals scored by substitutes in Serie A in 2024/25.
- Among the players with more than five goals in the current league season, Verona's Casper Tengstedt (six goals) is both the one with the fewest shots on target (nine) and the one with the fewest total shots (27).
- Lazio's Mattia Zaccagni's first 81 appearances, with nine goals, in Serie A were for Hellas Verona between 2015 and 2021. He has been involved in five goals in six matches against the Scaligeri in the top-flight: two goals and three assists, a record of assists for him against a single opponent in the competition.
- Three of the four players with the most cards received in Serie A this season could feature in this match: Lazio's Nicolò Rovella (nine, all yellows), teammate Valentín Castellanos (seven, six yellows and one red) and Verona's Diego Coppola (seven, all yellows).



**Inter - Empoli**

19 January 2025



- Inter are the opponent against whom Empoli have both lost the most games (26 of 33) and conceded the most goals (69) in Serie A – four wins for the Tuscans and three draws overall.
- Inter have won 13 of their last 14 league matches against Empoli, scoring 29 goals in the process (2.1 per game on average) – the only win for the Tuscans in this period was back on 23 January 2023 (1-0 at the Meazza stadium with Tommaso Baldanzi's goal).
- There haven't been any draws in 16 matches at the Meazza stadium between Inter and Empoli in Serie A (14 wins for the Lombards against the two for the Tuscans); only against Lecce (19) have the Nerazzurri played more home games without ever drawing in the competition.
- After the 2-2 draw against Bologna – in which Inter conceded the same number of goals as in their previous nine league matches – the Nerazzurri could draw two matches in a row in Serie A for the first time this season (the last time it happened in a single campaign dates back to the last two MDs of 2023/24).
- With the two goals conceded against Bologna, the Nerazzurri have now conceded 12 times at home in Serie A this season (in 10 matches – 1.2 per game); already one more than in the whole of last season (11 in 19 games – 0.6 on average).
- Empoli have lost five of their last seven league games (W1 D1), as many defeats as they suffered in their previous 19 Serie A matches (W5 D9 L5).
- Considering only the first half of games, Empoli would be sixth in the Serie A table (29 points), with Inter first (39). Based on second half, however, the Tuscans would be 19<sup>th</sup> (15 points) and Inter would be in third position (34).
- Among teams faced 5+ times in Serie A, Empoli are the side that Inter's Lautaro Martínez boasts his best win percentage against in the tournament (89% - 8/9). Furthermore, after the goal against Bologna, he could score in two home games in a row for the first time since last February (against Salernitana and Atalanta in that case).
- Federico Dimarco has scored more goals against Empoli than against any other side in Serie A (three). He played 12 matches for the Tuscans in the top-flight in 2016/17, providing his first assist in the competition for them.
- Empoli's Sebastiano Esposito has scored the joint-most goals in away games in Serie A this season (six, level with Mateo Retegui). In addition, on 21<sup>st</sup> December 2019, at the age of 17 years and 172 days against Genoa, Sebastiano Esposito – seven appearances for the Nerazzurri in Serie A in 2019/20 – became the second youngest scorer in Inter's history in Serie A, behind only Mario Corso (17 years and 97 days on 30/11/1958 against Bologna).



## Como - Udinese

20 January 2025



- Udinese have won their last three matches against Como in Serie A (including an awarded match on 18<sup>th</sup> December 2002), the longest open streak of wins for the Bianconeri against current top-flight opponents.
- In eight of the nine matches at the Sinigaglia stadium between Como and Udinese in Serie A, at least one of the two sides has failed to score; indeed, only on 30<sup>th</sup> November 1986 have both teams netted in this run (3-1 for the Lombards) – four wins for Como, two draws and three wins for Udinese overall.
- Como lost last time out against Milan, and have only once lost consecutive Serie A games this term (three in that case, between October and November).
- The balance is equal so far in Como's nine matches at Sinigaglia in Serie A 2024-25: three home wins, three draws and three away successes (13 goals scored, 15 conceded).
- Udinese have drawn their last three league matches, and nil-nil in the most recent two. The Friulians could draw four games in a row in Serie A for the first time since October 2023, while only once in their history in the top flight have they drawn more consecutive games 0-0 (four between January and February 1983).
- In the last two seasons (since 2023/24), only Juventus (27) have drawn more matches than Udinese (24) in the Big 5 European leagues.
- Como and Udinese are two of the three teams, along with Genoa, that haven't scored a penalty in Serie A this season; on the other hand, only Venezia (six) have conceded more penalty goals than the Lariani and Friulians (both five, alongside Cagliari and Genoa).
- Como are the team who have conceded the most goals in the last 15 minutes of play in Serie A this term (11), seven of which have been in stoppage time (also a league-high).
- Maxence Caqueret provided an assist on his debut for Como in Serie A against Milan; only once during his 147 appearances for Lyon in Ligue 1 did he assist in two appearances in a row, doing so in February 2023.
- Lorenzo Lucca has scored seven goals in 19 matches in the current league season, and is just one away from equalling his total from the previous Serie A campaign. (eight goals in 37 games). He has scored the joint-most headed goals in the current league season (five, level with Mateo Retegui).
