

**Parma - Lecce**

31th January 2025



- Parma have avoided defeat in 22 of their last 23 matches against Lecce in Serie A (W13 D9); the only occasion in this period in which the Salento team won dates back to 2nd February 2011 (1-0, Chevanton scoring at the Tardini).
- After the 2-2 draw in the reverse fixture, Parma and Lecce could draw both seasonal encounters in Serie A for only the second time, after 2001-02 (two 1-1 draws in that case).
- After their success in their last home match against Lecce in Serie A (2-0 on 13 January 2020, with goals scored by Simone Iacoponi and Andreas Cornelius), Parma could keep a clean sheet in two home games in a row against the Salento team for only the second time (the first one was between January 1991 and September 1993, in their first two home matches against the Giallorossi).
- Parma have won only one of their last eight league matches (D2 L5), conceding 17 goals and scoring just eight; over the last eight matchdays in Serie A (from MD15), only Monza (3) have won fewer points than the Emilians (5, level with Empoli) while only Lecce (18) have conceded more goals than Parma (17) in the competition.
- Parma are unbeaten in their last two Serie A home matches (W1 D1) and have not recorded a longer unbeaten streak in front of their fans in the tournament since the period between October and December 2020 (a run of five under Fabio Liverani).
- Lecce have lost their last two Serie A matches (against Cagliari and Inter, conceding four goals in both); in general, the Giallorossi could suffer three defeats in a row in the competition for the first time since the period between September and October 2024 (a run of four under Luca Gotti).
- Lecce have conceded 11 goals in their last four Serie A away games, only one goal less than they conceded in their previous 12 such matches in the competition (12).
- Parma are the team with the most fast breaks (35) and one of the three sides with the most goals scored from this kind of situation in Serie A this season (5 goals, level with Lazio and Juventus); on the other hand, only Lazio (10) and Atalanta (11) have faced fewer fast breaks than Lecce (12, with only one goal conceded in this way).
- Matteo Cancellieri, who scored last time out against Milan, could find the net in two consecutive appearances in Serie A for the first time. In general, he has scored three goals in 20 appearances this term, only one less than he scored in the previous top-flight season with Empoli (4 goals in 36 matches).
- Nikola Krstovic is the only Lecce player to have scored more than one away goal in Serie A this season: three, including two of the Giallorossi's last three goals on the road in the competition. Following his goal the last time the two sides met (21st September, 2-2), Parma could become the second opponent against which the Montenegrin has scored in both matches in a single Serie A season, after Monza in 2023-24.



Monza - Hellas Verona

1st February 2025



- Hellas Verona are the opponent against which Monza have played the most matches in Serie A without ever losing: three wins and two draws in five matches against the Gialloblù.
- After winning the reverse fixture without conceding a goal (3-0, on 21 October), Hellas Verona could become the fifth team against which Monza have won both Serie A matches of the season with a clean sheet, after Juventus and Spezia in 2022/23 and Sassuolo and Salernitana in 2023/24.
- Monza have kept clean sheets in both matches at the U-Power Stadium against Hellas Verona in Serie A (2-0 win on 6 November 2022 and 0-0 draw on 11 February 2024) and have kept more clean sheets at home against no other team in the competition (two also against Salernitana).
- Monza have conceded at least one goal in each of their last 14 Serie A games - only Venezia (17) are on a longer ongoing run without a clean sheet among teams currently in the division; however, the last clean sheet of the Brianza team in the league dates to the reverse fixture against Hellas Verona (3-0 at the Bentegodi, on 21 October).
- Monza won their last home match in Serie A (2-1 vs Fiorentina) and have not collected two consecutive home wins in the competition since November 2022 (the first of which was against Hellas Verona).
- Hellas Verona have drawn two of their last four league games (L2) - including the most recent one against Venezia (1-1 at Penzo) - as many as in their previous 26 games in the topflight (W9 D2 L15); the Gialloblù have not recorded two consecutive draws in Serie A since February 2024 (the first of which was against Monza).
- Hellas Verona have collected seven points from their last four away games in Serie A (W2 D1 L1), as many as in their previous 10 away games in the competition (W2 D1 L7).
- Monza are the team that have conceded the most headed goals in Serie A this season: 12, at least four more than any other side. However, Hellas Verona have scored only two headed goals with no team scoring fewer (two also Como, Lecce and Monza).
- In the last two Serie A seasons (since 2023/24) no goalkeeper has saved more penalties than Stefano Turati: three, equal with Alex Meret.
- Jackson Tchatchoua has been involved in four goals in 20 appearances for Hellas Verona in Serie A this season (two goals and two assists), setting his own record for most goal involvements in a single season in the top 10 European Leagues (previously three with Sporting de Charleroi in 2021/22 and 2022/23).

**Udinese - Venezia**

1st February 2025



- Both sides have won four of the last 11 meetings between Udinese and Venezia in Serie A (D3). The lagoon players won the reverse fixture (3-2 at Penzo Stadium on 30/10) and have never achieved two successes in a row against the Friulians in the Italian top-flight.
- Udinese could become only the third opponent against which Venezia have won both seasonal Serie A matches in the post-war period, after Bologna in 2021/22 and Cagliari in 1998/99.
- Udinese are unbeaten in their five home games against Venezia in Serie A, winning the most recent three (D2); in general, only against Como (10), Piacenza (eight) and Novara (six) have the Friulians played more home matches without ever losing in the competition. Moreover, among the teams currently in the Italian top-flight, the Venetians are the opponent against which Udinese have the longest open streak of home victories (three).
- Udinese have not won any of their last five league games (D3 L2) their joint longest winless run under Kosta Runjaic (five consecutive games without success also between last October and December). They last went longer without a win under a single coach between November and December 2023 (six in that case, under Gabriele Cioffi).
- Udinese have not won any of their last six Serie A home games (D2 L4), with only four goals scored compared to 11 conceded; Since the beginning of November 2024, the Friulians are the team with the fewest points won (two) on home soil and have the second worst goal difference at home during this period in Serie A (-11 for Hellas Verona, -7 for the Bianconeri).
- Venezia have won eight points in their last eight league matches (W1 D5 L2), as many as in all of their previous 14 matches in this Serie A campaign (W2 D2 L10). Furthermore, after the two draws in the two most recent matches (both 1-1 against Parma and Hellas Verona), they could collect three successive draws in Serie A for the first time since the period between March and April 1962 (four in that case).
- Venezia have not won in their last 18 away games in Serie A (D5 L13), however they drew the most recent one (1-1 vs Parma); They last avoided defeat in back to back away games in the competition between October-November 2021 (draw against Genoa and success against Bologna, when they were managed by Paolo Zanetti).
- Venezia are the team that have dropped the most points from winning positions across the big five European leagues in 2024/25: 24, at least three more than any other. Udinese are also one of the teams, along with Empoli, to have not yet gained points from losing positions in Serie A this term
- Since the start of last season – his first in the Italian top-flight – Lorenzo Lucca has scored 16 goals in 58 appearances in the league, none from penalties; among the players who have not scored a single penalty goal over the last two Serie A campaigns, only Marcus Thuram (26) has scored more goals than Lucca (16, alongside Duván Zapata) in the tournament.
- Thanks to his goal against Hellas Verona, Alessio Zerbin (1st goal in Serie A) became the 2nd Italian player to score for Venezia in his first match as a starter in Serie A in the three points for a win era, after Maurizio Ganz against Lazio on 5 January 2000. Indeed, he was the Venetian player who attempted the most passes in the opposing midfield (13) and had the most touches in the opponent's box (five) last time out.



Atalanta - Torino

1st February 2025



- Atalanta have lost two of their last three games against Torino in Serie A (W1), as many as in their previous 14 games against them in the competition (W7 D5); in general, the Dea have not recorded two defeats in a row against the Granata in the top division since the period between February and September 2019.
- After the 2-1 victory in the reverse fixture, Torino could win both matches of the season against Atalanta in Serie A for the first time since 2015-16 (1-0 in the first game and 2-1 in the second one, with the two teams coached respectively by Giampiero Ventura and Edoardo Reja).
- Atalanta have won both of their last two home matches against Torino in Serie A and they have never collected three home wins in a row against the Granata in the competition. Furthermore, after the 3-0 success at the Gewiss Stadium last May, the Dea could win two consecutive home games with a clean sheet against this opponent for the first time in the top-flight.
- Atalanta have lost only one of their last 17 Serie A matches (W12 D4), the most recent in front of their fans (2-3 vs Napoli); indeed, the Nerazzurri have not recorded two home defeats in a row in the league since November 2023 (against the Neapolitans and Inter in that case).
- Torino are unbeaten in their last five league games (W1 D4), last reaching a run of six in Serie A between January and February 2024 (6 under Ivan Juric).
- Torino have drawn three of their last four away matches in Serie A (W1) - including the two most recent ones (v Udinese and Fiorentina) - as many as in their previous 16 in the tournament (W5 D3 L8); in general, the Granata have not recorded three consecutive draws away from home in the top-flight since December 2018 (a run of four, under Walter Mazzarri).
- Atalanta are the team with the most points won from losing situations (15) in this championship; in fact, the Dea has collected points despite going behind in three of their last five Serie A matches (1 with both Lazio and Juventus, 3 with Como); in general, in the top-5 European Leagues 2024-25, only Manchester City (17) and Atlético Madrid (16) have won more such points than Atalanta (15, level with Newcastle).
- Mateo Retegui has scored multiple goals in four games this championship (three braces and one hat-trick), only fewer than Robert Lewandowski (5) in the top-5 European Leagues 2024-25; furthermore, only two players have scored multiple goals more often in a single Serie A season with the Dea: Luis Muriel in 2019-20 and Filippo Inzaghi in 1996-97 (both five).
- Samuele Ricci and Lazar Samardzic are the only two players born 2001 or later to have both scored at least one goal and provided at least one assist in each of the last four Serie A seasons (from 2021-22).
- Ché Adams has scored seven goals in 21 league matches played this season, including on his Serie A debut against Atalanta on last 25th August; overall, only one other Scottish player has scored more goals in a single Serie A season: Denis Law, 10 goals for Torino in 1961-62.

**Bologna - Como**

1st February 2025



- Among the teams faced at least 15 times in Serie A, Bologna are the one against which Como have the lowest percentage of defeats (26%); in fact Como remained unbeaten in 14 of their 19 matches against the Rossoblu in Serie A (W8 D6).
- After the 2-2 draw in the reverse fixture last 14 September, Bologna and Como could draw both seasonal Serie A matches for only the second time after 1949-50 (two 2-2 draws in the first two ever meetings between the two teams in the competition).
- Bologna are unbeaten in eight of their nine home games against Como in Serie A (W5 D3); the only success for the Larians against the Rossoblu in the competition dates back to 4th March 1951 (0-2).
- Bologna have drawn 10 of their 21 matches played in this championship (8W L3); the last time the Rossoblu recorded at least 10 draws after 21 seasonal Serie A matches dates back to 1989-90 (11 in that case, with Luigi Maifredi on the bench).
- Bologna have scored 12 goals in their last six home Serie A games (an average of two per match); in general, since the start of last November, only Roma (16) have scored more home goals than Bologna in the competition (12, level with Inter).
- Como have never repeated the same result twice in the last eight league matches (W3 D2 L3), losing the most recent one (1-2 v Atalanta); in general, Como have only once lost two matches in a row in this Serie A: in the period between November 2024 (three, against Torino, Lazio and Empoli in that case).
- Como have not won any of their last seven away matches in Serie A (D3 L4), since Atalanta-Como 2-3 on last 24 September, even though they have drawn three of the most recent four such games; indeed, since the start of last October, Como are one of the two teams, with Venezia, to have won the fewest points away from home in the tournament (three for both).
- No team has scored more goals following a cross than Bologna in 2025 in Serie A (three, level with Genoa); on the other hand, Como are the team to have scored the fewest such goals in the current tournament: only one (Patrick Cutrone against Lazio, 10th January).
- This is the match between the two youngest players with at least five goals scored in this championship: Santiago Castro (6 goals) and Nico Paz (5 goals), both born in 2004, born just 10 days apart from each other – on 8 September 2004 the Como playmaker and on 18 September 2004 the Bologna striker.
- Benjamín Domínguez has been involved in four goals in his last four Serie A appearances (3 goals and 1 assist); starting from MD18, only Romelu Lukaku and Lautaro Martínez (both 5) have been involved in more goals than Bologna's player (4) in Serie A.

**Juventus - Empoli**

2nd February 2025



- Juventus have won just one of their last four Serie A games against Empoli (D2 L1), having won 10 of their previous 11 against them (L1). Both the last two meetings have been drawn.
- Empoli have only avoided defeat in seven of their last 24 Serie A matches against Juventus (W3 D4), with five of those coming in the second half of the season.
- Juventus have won 80% of their Serie A home matches against Empoli (W12 D2 L1): among opponents currently in the competition, only against Hellas Verona (85%) do the Bianconeri have a higher percentage of home wins in the competition.
- Empoli have only won one of their last 14 Serie A games played on Sunday at 12.30 (D4 L9), 1-0 against Napoli in November 2023. They've failed to score in 10 of those 14 games.
- Juventus are the only team unbeaten at home in Serie A this season, and also have the most draws on home soil this term (7). However, following the win (2-0) against AC Milan, the Bianconeri could win back-to-back at home in a single league season for the first time since January 2024 (three in that case).
- Empoli are winless in their last seven Serie A games (D2 L5), the longest current run in the competition. They've average just 0.3 points-per-game in this run, compared to 1.3 in their first 15 games this term.
- Juventus have only won eight of their first 22 Serie A matches this season; the last time the Bianconeri won less than nine games at this point of the season was back in 1987/88, when they won their 23rd encounter against an opponent from Toscana (2-1 against Pisa).
- The average time of Juventus' sequences in Serie A this season is 15.2 seconds: the highest in the league in 2024/25; on the other hand, Empoli are last in this ranking with 7.0 seconds.
- Empoli's Sebastiano Esposito has found the net in each of his last four away appearances in Serie A: should he score, he would become the fourth player in the 21st century to find the net in at least five away matches in a row before turning 23 years old, after Alberto Gilardino (six in 2004), Adriano (six in 2004) and Stephan El Shaarawy (seven in 2012).
- After scoring against Napoli, Randal Kolo Muani could become the second player to find the net in his first two Serie A appearances for Juventus in the three-points-for-a-win era, after Carlos Tevez in August 2013.

**Fiorentina - Genoa**

2nd February 2025



- Fiorentina won four of their five most recent matches against Genoa (D1) and, in general, are unbeaten in 13 of the last 14 (W5 D8) – the Rossoblù's only success in this period was in September 2019 (2-1), with goals scored by Cristián Zapata and Christian Kouamé.
- Genoa have drawn 39 Serie A matches against Fiorentina (compared to 18 wins and 48 defeats), more draws than they have recorded against any other opponent in the competition; in fact, 12 of the last 20 matches between these two teams have ended in a draw (six victories for the Viola and two for the Rossoblù).
- Fiorentina are unbeaten in 25 home matches against Genoa in Serie A (W12 D13), although they have only won one of the most recent seven (6-0 on 17 January 2022); the Viola have recorded a longer run of consecutive home games without defeat in the competition only against Cagliari (26, between 1973 and 2013) and Torino (32, between 1978 and 2021).
- After a series of five consecutive home wins, Fiorentina have not won any of their last three home games in Serie A (D1 L2); the last time they played more home matches in a row without a win under the management of a single coach was in January 2021 (five, with Cesare Prandelli as manager).
- Genoa have kept six clean sheets in their last nine Serie A games, as many as they had in their previous 28 in the competition.
- Although Fiorentina have won only one of their last seven league games (D2 L4), the Viola's 36 points is their most after 21 Serie A games since 2015-16 (41), a season which they finished in fifth place.
- Patrick Vieira lost only two of his first 10 games as Genoa coach in Serie A, compared to four wins and four draws; the last Rossoblù coach who won at least five of the first 11 matches managing the Grifone in the competition was Manlio Bacigalupo, in 1950.
- Fiorentina are, along with Inter, one of the two teams that have the highest difference between goals scored and conceded from corner kicks in this Serie A: both at +5, for the Viola thanks to five goals scored from these situations and none conceded (record shared with Napoli).
- Moise Kean – who has still not scored in the Italian top-flight against Genoa in five games played – could become the third player in his first year at Fiorentina to score at least 13 goals in the first 22 games played by the Viola in a single Serie A campaign in the last 60 years, after Luca Toni in 2005/06 (21) and Alberto Gilardino in 2008/09 (13).
- After a run of four goals in seven Serie A games, Genoa's Andrea Pinamonti has scored just once in his last eight. All three of this goals against Fiorentina have come in home games, with the Artemio Franchi Stadium the ground he has played the most Serie A games without ever scoring (6).



Milan - Inter

2nd February 2025



- AC Milan have won the last two Milan derbies against Inter across all competitions, as many as in the previous 13 (D2, L9). The Rossoneri could win three games in a row against the Nerazzurri for the first time since 2011 under Massimiliano Allegri.
- Inter have won 70 matches and scored 259 goals in Serie A against AC Milan, more than any other side in the competition. On the other hand, the Nerazzurri have drawn 56 games against the Rossoneri, more than against any other opponent in the Italian top-flight.
- Across the last seven Milan derbies in Serie A (since Simone Inzaghi has been on the Nerazzurri's bench), the score between Inter and AC Milan is three wins apiece and one draw. In this period, the Rossoneri have always conceded in the first half, with the last time the Nerazzurri failed to score before half-time coming in February 2020.
- Inter have kept a clean sheet in their last seven away games in Serie A, with an aggregate score of 23-0. Only AC Milan (eight between November 1993 and March 1994) have achieved more clean sheets in a row away from home in the history of the competition.
- Considering games between the top eight current sides in the Serie A table, AC Milan have collected only five points (W1 D2 L4), fewer than any other side. However, their sole such success came against Inter in the reverse fixture.
- Inter have scored 55 goals in Serie A this season; the only times the Nerazzurri have netted more after the first 22 games in the Italian top-flight were in 1949-50 (64), 1950-51 (59) and 1960-61 (56).
- Sérgio Conceição (41 Serie A appearances with Inter, between 2001 and 2003) can become the second AC Milan manager in the last 35 years to win his first two Milan derbies against the Nerazzurri across all competitions, after Massimiliano Allegri between 2010 and 2011.
- Tijjani Reijnders is the central midfielder with the most goals in the current Serie A season (six). Overall, he has scored nine goals with AC Milan in the competition and could become the fifth Dutch player to score at least 10 goals with the Rossoneri in the Italian top-flight, after Marco van Basten (90), Clarence Seedorf (47), Ruud Gullit (38) and Frank Rijkaard (16).
- Denzel Dumfries has scored in each of his last three Serie A appearances; only one defender has found the net in four games in a row in the competition in the three-points for a win era: Christian Terlizzi, with Palermo in September 2005.
- Lautaro Martínez has scored nine goals in Serie A this term and could become the sixth player to score 10+ goals with Inter in six Serie A different seasons, after Giuseppe Meazza (9), Benito Lorenzi (9), Alessandro Altobelli (8), Roberto Boninsegna (6) and Christian Vieri (6). With a goal, he will also become the third Nerazzurri player with at least 10 against Milan in all competitions, after Giuseppe Meazza (12) and Stefano Nyers (11).



Roma - Napoli

2nd February 2025



- Napoli are unbeaten in nine of their last 10 Serie A games against Roma (W6 D3) – the Giallorossi's only win in this run came in December 2023, a 2-0 win via goals from Lorenzo Pellegrini and Romelu Lukaku.
- After a run of four consecutive home wins against Napoli in Serie A, Roma have won just two of their last eight home league games against the Partenopei, also failing to find the net in three of their most recent four.
- Roma are unbeaten in their last six league games (W4 D2), after losing seven of their previous nine (W2). Furthermore, after their victories against Genoa and Udinese, they are seeking three Serie A wins in a row for the first time since March 2024 under Daniele De Rossi.
- Napoli have won their last seven Serie A games, and have only achieved a longer run on six occasions in their history in the competition, most recently between January and February 2023 (run of eight).
- Although Claudio Ranieri's Roma are attempting fewer shots per game in Serie A this season than they did under Ivan Juric and Daniele De Rossi combined (12.1 v 15.3), they are scoring more goals per game on average (1.9 v 1.2); Roma are also facing more shots on average (13 v 11.9), but conceding fewer goals (1.1 v 1.4).
- Napoli have averaged the most shots per game in Serie A this season when drawing (15). Furthermore, the Partenopei have won the most games in which they have taken the lead (17, out of 18) and have won the joint-most games after trailing (four, along with Atalanta).
- Roma's Claudio Ranieri, who against Udinese became the 15th manager in Serie A history to reach 200 wins, also became the first coach in the history of the competition to manage a team in 10+ matches after turning 73. Indeed, none of the players he fielded in the last MD were born on the day of his first game in the competition in September 1990.
- Artem Dovbyk has scored in each of his last three Serie A appearances; the last Roma to have found the net in four consecutive games in a season in the competition was Henrikh Mkhitaryan in May 2021. Dovbyk has been involved in the most goals in the last six Serie A matchdays: six (four goals and two assists).
- Napoli striker Matteo Politano, who has been directly involved in a goal in each of his last two Serie A appearances (one goal and one assist), has been involved in six goals in the competition against Roma (two goals and four assists), his joint-best against a single opponent in the Italian top-flight.
- This will be Romelu Lukaku's 150th Serie A appearance (32 of those with Roma last season), while Lukaku has currently scored 79 goals in the competition. Among players to have made their debut in the three points for a win era, only eight have managed to score more goals in their first 150 games in the Italian top-flight: Gonzalo Higuaín (98), David Trézéguet (94), Andriy Shevchenko (90), Hernán Crespo (88), Diego Milito (86), Vincenzo Montella (85), Ciro Immobile (84) and Cristiano Ronaldo (81).

**Cagliari - Lazio**

- Lazio are unbeaten in their last 19 Serie A matches against Cagliari (W16 D3), and have never recorded a longer run without defeat against a single opponent in their history in the competition (19 also against Inter, between 1996 and 2005).
- Cagliari have lost each of their last five home matches against Lazio in Serie A, with an aggregate score of 12-3. The Sardinians have only suffered a longer run of consecutive home defeats in the tournament against Juventus (8 between 2011 and 2019) and against Napoli (6 between 2015 and 2021).
- Lazio have averaged 2.3 goals per game in their last 19 league matches against Cagliari (43 total goals). In this period (since 2013/14) they have only scored more goals against Sampdoria (44 in 20 games).
- Cagliari have lost nine games without scoring in Serie A this season, with no team doing so on more occasions (also Lecce 9). In their history, the Sardinians have never suffered more defeats without scoring across their first 23 matches of a season in the top division (9 in 1964/65).
- After a run of five consecutive victories, Lazio have failed to win six of their last nine league matches (D2 L4), losing the most recent one, against Fiorentina. The last time the Biancocelesti were defeated in two or more games in a row in Serie A was in March 2024 – a run of three starting with defeat against the Viola.
- Cagliari have been defeated in five of their 11 home league games this season, just one defeat fewer than in the whole of last season (6). Meanwhile, in only one of their previous five seasons have the Sardinians lost more times across their first 12 home games in the competition (seven in 2020-21).
- Lazio are the only side yet to draw away from home in Serie A this term (W6 L5): this is the first time in their history that they have not recorded a single draw across their first 11 away games in a season in the competition.
- No side has conceded more goals from set pieces than Cagliari in Serie A this season (14, level with Venezia), while Lazio have scored 13 such goals, only fewer than Inter (16).
- Razvan Marin has been involved in five goals in Serie A this term (3 goals and 2 assists), four of which coming as a substitute – only Nicolas Viola (6 in 2023-24) has been involved in more goals as a substitute for Cagliari in a single Serie A season over the last 20 campaigns.
- Boulaye Dia has scored three goals in his two Serie A matches against Cagliari, including his most recent multiple goal haul in the competition (a brace with Salernitana on 22 October 2023) – the Lazio forward has only scored more goals in the top-flight against Fiorentina (four in five matches).
