



Como - Juventus

7 February 2025



- Juventus are unbeaten in their last 22 Serie A matches against Como (W13 D9), with the last win for the Lariani against the Bianconeri back in January 1952 (2-0 at Sinigaglia stadium) – this is Como's longest streak without a win against a single opponent in Serie A.
- After winning two of their first three home matches against Juventus in Serie A between 1950 and 1952 (L1), Como haven't won any of their last 10 home matches against the Bianconeri in the top-flight (D4 D6).
- Como have lost their last two league matches against Atalanta and Bologna; in the current league season they have recorded three defeats in a row only once, between October and November 2024 (against Torino, Lazio and Empoli).
- Como failed to score in their last league match (0-2 against Bologna) and could remain without a goal in two consecutive Serie A games for the first time since April-May 2003.
- Juventus won their last Serie A game against Empoli and could register two consecutive league wins for the first time since the beginning of November (against Udinese and Torino in that case).
- No side have scored a higher share of their goals in open play than Como in Serie A this season (85% - 23/27), with Juventus ranking third for that this term (82% - 32/39).
- Como have conceded the most goals in second half stoppage time in Serie A this season (seven), while only Lazio (five) have scored more goals than Juventus (four, level with Napoli and Parma) in the same period.
- Como's Nico Paz has scored in his last four league games at Sinigaglia stadium, only two midfielders have scored in more consecutive home appearances in Serie A in the three points for a win era: Stefano Mauri (six between April and December 2014) and Eugenio Corini (five between September and November 2006). Nico Paz is also the player with the most dribbles completed (45) in Serie A this season.
- Randal Kolo Muani (three goals in two Serie A matches) could become the first Juventus player to score in each of his first three Serie A appearances in the three points for a win era (since 1994/95). Overall, the last player to score at least four goals in his first three Serie A games was Krzysztof Piatek for Genoa in 2018 – no one has ever netted five goals in their first three games in the competition since 1994/95.
- After a goal against AC Milan and an assist against Empoli, Juventus' Timothy Weah could be involved in at least one goal in three consecutive appearances for the first time between Serie A and Ligue 1.



Hellas Verona - Atalanta

- Atalanta have won six of their last eight league matches against Hellas Verona (D1 L1), scoring 18 goals (2.3 on average). The only win for the Scaligeri in this period was back in April 2022 (2-1 at the Gewiss Stadium).
- Hellas Verona have gained just one point in their last six home league games against Atalanta - losing each of their last four - after having won each of their previous five games at the Bentegodi against the Dea in Serie A.
- Hellas Verona won their last league match against Monza and could win two games in a row in Serie A for the first time since March 2024 (against Sassuolo and Lecce in that case). The Scaligeri could also record three consecutive games without defeat in a single Serie A season for the first time since between November and December 2023 (three draws in that case).
- Hellas Verona haven't scored in their last three league games at the Bentegodi stadium, only twice in their history in Serie A they recorded at least four consecutive home games without scoring: four between October and December 2015 and five between January and March 1979.
- After a streak of 11 consecutive league wins, Atalanta have won only one of their last six Serie A games (D4 L1); in 2025 so far only Torino (four) have drawn more games than Atalanta in the top-flight (three of five matches).
- Atalanta are both the club with the most goals scored by crosses (12) and the team that have conceded the fewest goal by a cross (just one) in the big five European leagues this season.
- Atalanta have scored the most goals in the first 15 minutes of Serie A matches this season (7), while Hellas Verona have conceded the most in that time (10).
- Atalanta are the team against which Verona's Darko Lazovic has scored the most goals in Serie A (3). However, he hasn't been involved in any goals in his last 16 league appearances, his last one was back on 29th September 2024 (goal by penalty against Como).
- Atalanta have won 68% of their Serie A matches in which Ademola Lookman has played this season (13/19), averaging 2.3 points-per-game, compared to a 25% win rate (1/4) and one point per game without him.
- Since the start of last season, no players have more Serie A assists than Atalanta duo Raoul Bellanova and Charles De Ketelaere (13 each, level with Rafael Leão).



Empoli - Milan

- AC Milan have won seven of their last eight Serie A games against Empoli (D1), scoring 18 goals in the process (2.3 on average) and conceding only three times.
- AC Milan have kept a clean sheet in each of their last four league games against Empoli; only against Pisa do they have a longer active streak of consecutive clean sheets in Serie A (five between 1988 and 1991).
- AC Milan are the team against which Empoli have played the most home games in Serie A without ever winning (P16 D7 L9). Meanwhile only against SPAL (19) have the Rossoneri played more away matches without ever losing in the top-flight than against the Tuscans (16).
- Across the last eight Serie A games (since MD16), Empoli have picked up the fewest points (2) and conceded the most goals (18).
- AC Milan have lost their last two away games in all competitions (against Juventus and Dinamo Zagreb) and the Rossoneri could lose three in a row for the first time since between April and May 2015 (3 under Filippo Inzaghi).
- AC Milan have conceded in each of their last six league games, after keeping a clean sheet in four of the previous five; the last time the Rossoneri conceded in seven consecutive matches in a single Serie A season came between November 2022 and February 2023.
- Considering only the 1st half of games, AC Milan and Empoli have gained the same number of points in the Serie A standings this season (34 each in 7th and 8th place), but if considering only the 2nd half of matches the Rossoneri would occupy 11th place with 29 points and the Tuscans would occupy 19th place with 16 points.
- Lorenzo Colombo's first five appearances in Serie A came for AC Milan between July 2020 and January 2021. He has scored five goals in 23 appearances in Serie A this season and he has never netted more in a single season in the top-flight (also five goals in 33 matches for Lecce in 2022/23).
- Tijjani Reijnders – who scored the only brace of his Serie A and Eredivisie career against Empoli in the reverse fixture in November – is the top scoring midfielder in Serie A this season (7 goals). The Dutchman, after his goals against Parma and Inter, could score in three consecutive matches for the first time in his top-flight career.
- Santiago Giménez could become the first ever Mexican player to score for AC Milan in Serie A history. During his time at Feyenoord (since 2022/23), the forward scored 65 goals in 105 appearances across all competitions with only Luuk de Jong netting more for an Eredivisie club in that period (70 goals in 115 matches for PSV).

**Torino - Genoa**

- Torino have lost only one of their last 13 Serie A games against Genoa (W8 D4) with the Grifone's only win in that period coming in March 2022 at the Ferraris stadium.
- After the 0-0 draw in the reverse fixture in December, Torino and Genoa could draw both Serie A meetings in a season for only the third time in their history after doing so in 2012/13 and 1982/83.
- Torino have lost only one of their last 40 home games against Genoa in Serie A (W26 D13), going down 2-3 in May 2009 when Diego Milito scored a brace and Rubén Olivera netted for the Grifone under Gian Piero Gasperini.
- Torino are unbeaten in their last six league games (W1 D5) and they could go at least seven consecutive matches without defeat in Serie A for the first time since doing so between March and May 2019 (8 in a row under Walter Mazzarri).
- Since the start of last season Torino have kept the joint-most home clean sheets in the big five European leagues, keeping 17 in 30 home games (level with Real Madrid - 17 in 29 matches).
- Genoa's last nine Serie A games have seen them record three wins, three draws and three defeats, scoring eight goals and conceding eight goals.
- Only Monaco (13) have seen a higher number of different nationalities of player score for them across the big five European leagues this season than Torino (12 – level with Brighton).
- Torino and Genoa are two of the three teams, along with Cagliari, that have scored the fewest goals in the opening 30 minutes of Serie A matches this season (3 each).
- Since Vanja Milinkovic-Savic's first season as Torino's starting goalkeeper in 2021-22, only Lukasz Skorupski (5) has saved more penalties than the Serbian shot stopper in Serie A (4 - level with Szczesny and Meret). Vanja Milinkovic-Savic is also the goalkeeper with the most saves made (86) in Serie A so far this season.
- Aarón Martín has both created the most chances overall (46) and the most chances from set pieces (28) in Serie A this season.



Venezia - Roma

- The last four matches between Venezia and Roma in Serie A have been balanced in terms of victories (one win each, two draws) and goals (7 each); the Giallorossi had won six of their previous seven matches against the Lagunari in the top flight (L1).
- Venezia won the most recent league match at the Penzo stadium against Roma (3-2 on 7th November 2021) and they have never achieved two home wins in a row against the Giallorossi in Serie A.
- Venezia have avoided defeat in four of their last five home league matches (W1 D3), drawing the most recent (1-1 against Hellas Verona); the Lagunari could draw two games in a row at the Penzo stadium in Serie A for the first time since the period between October and November 2001 (three in that case under Giuseppe Iachini).
- Since Claudio Ranieri's return to Roma (since 14th November 2024), only Inter (30) have scored more goals than the Giallorossi in Serie A (20, level with Bologna). In the same period, the Giallorossi have gained 18 points in 11 matches (W5 D3 L3), with only Napoli (28), Inter (26, before the postponed match against Fiorentina), Atalanta (22) and Bologna (19) picking up more.
- Roma are unbeaten in their last seven league games (W4 D3), last having a longer streak without defeat in Serie A between January and April 2022 (12 matches in that case under José Mourinho).
- Roma won their last away league game (2-1 against Udinese) after a streak of 13 consecutive away matches without doing so in Serie A (D7 L6); the Giallorossi could win at least two consecutive away games in Serie A for the first time since the period between January and March 2024 (three in that case).
- In the last five Serie A seasons (since 2020/21), Roma have scored the most goals from the 90th minute onwards in the top-flight: 28.
- Roma have scored the joint-most goals from penalties in Serie A this season (six, level with Inter - before the postponed match against Fiorentina). On the other hand, Venezia have conceded the joint-most goals by penalties (seven, level with Udinese).
- No player has scored more goals from outside the box than Hans Nicolussi Caviglia in Serie A this season (three, level with Danilo Cataldi). In addition, Nicolussi Caviglia has scored the joint-most goals by direct free kicks (two) in the Big-5 European leagues in 2024/25 (level with Omar Marmoush, Sandro Ramírez and Gaëtan Perrin).
- Alexis Saelemaekers has been involved in six goals in the current league season (four goals and two assists), never previously registering more goal involvements in a single Serie A campaign (six also in 2023/24 and 2020/21).

**Lazio - Monza**

- Lazio are unbeaten in their five Serie A matches against Monza (W3 D2); only against five teams, none of which are currently in Serie A, have the Biancocelesti played more games in the competition without losing (Frosinone, Mantova, Reggiana, Sampierdarenese and Spezia).
- Lazio haven't won any of their last six home games against Lombardy opponents in Serie A (D3 L3); the last time the Biancocelesti recorded a longer streak against these sides was back between January 1985 and January 1990 (nine).
- Lazio have won two of their last three Serie A games (L1), as many wins they had in their previous seven games in the competition (D2 L3); the Biancocelesti could win two Serie A games in a row for the first time since a streak of five between October and November 2024.
- Lazio haven't won any of their last four home league games (D2 L2), after five home wins in a row beforehand; the Biancocelesti last had a longer run back in 2016 (five).
- Since the beginning of December 2024, Monza have lost eight of their nine games in Serie A (W1). Across the Big-5 European leagues, only Southampton (nine defeats) have lost more matches in this period.
- Monza have lost their last four away games in Serie A, their longest ever run in the competition; the Brianzoli had suffered the same number of defeats in their previous 11 away matches (W1 D6).
- Lazio have scored 98% of their goals from inside the box in Serie A this season (39/40). Across the big five European leagues, only Le Havre, Bochum, Southampton and Mallorca have a higher percentage (100%).
- Valentín Castellanos has scored eight goals in 20 appearances in the current league season, twice as many as in 35 games of the previous Serie A season in 2023/24 – with one goal here, he will equal his total in LaLiga (12 vs 13), which he managed in a single campaign.
- Mattia Zaccagni has already scored one more goal this season than he did last term in Serie A (seven in 2024/24 vs six in 2023/24); he is one of only five Italians to have exceeded five goals in both this and the previous campaign (with Orsolini, Retegui, Lucca and Pinamonti).
- Dany Mota has scored four goals in the current league season and is close to equalling his Serie A record (five goals in 2022/23); however, the Monza striker hasn't netted in his last 12 league games, after scoring four goals in his previous four.

**Cagliari - Parma**

- Cagliari are unbeaten in their last six Serie A matches against Parma (W4 D2), only against Sassuolo do they have a longer ongoing unbeaten streak (run of eight).
- Cagliari have won four of their last five home matches against Parma in Serie A (D1), as many as in their previous 11 matches against the Gialloblu (D4 L3).
- After a run of three matches unbeaten (W2 D1), Cagliari have lost their last two games, conceding two goals in each; the Rossoblu have already suffered three defeats in a row with at least two goals conceded in the current league season, between October and November.
- Cagliari have lost six of their last 10 home matches in Serie A (W3 D1); from mid-September 2024, only Monza have lost more in the competition (7 home defeats).
- Since November 2024, Parma have lost eight of their 13 league games (W3 D2); in that period only Monza (10) have suffered more defeats than the Gialloblu in Serie A.
- After going unbeaten in five away league games in a row (W1 D4), Parma have lost four of their last five (D1), including the two most recent; the Gialloblu could lose three consecutive away games for the first time in Serie A this season.
- Parma have conceded the most goals in the second half of games in Serie A this season (27), while Cagliari have conceded the third-most goals in the first half of Serie A games this season (17, level with Venezia), fewer only than Monza (19) and Hellas Verona (31).
- Parma (16.1) and Cagliari (15) are the two teams with the highest PPDA values in Serie A this season. PPDA is the number of opposition passes allowed outside of the pressing team's own defensive third, divided by the number of defensive actions by the pressing team outside of their own defensive third.
- In the last matchday, Lazio became the 19th opponent against which Roberto Piccoli scored in Serie A (of a total of 19 goals). Parma could become the first team to concede two goals by Piccoli, thus eliminating his record as the player with the most opponents with only one goal scored in the big five European leagues since his first goal in the Italian top flight in 2020-21.
- Emanuele Valeri has scored a goal and provided an assist in his last two Serie A games and for only the second time he has been involved in a goal in successive appearances, after February 2023; he has never done so in three successive games before.



Lecce - Bologna

- Bologna are unbeaten in their last eight Serie A matches against Lecce (W6 D2); against current Serie A sides, the Rossoblù have a longer unbeaten streak only against Parma (10).
- Lecce have won two of their 15 home matches against Bologna in Serie A (D8 L5); among sides they have faced at least 15 times at home in the competition, only against Milan and Roma (6%) do they have a lower winning rate than against Bologna (13%).
- Lecce have earned eight points in the opening 11 Serie A games this season (W2 D2 L7), with no team earning fewer in this period, while in the next 12 the Giallorossi have earned 15 points. Indeed, the difference of seven league points between the two periods is the second-largest in Serie A, after Genoa (+8).
- Lecce have failed to score in two consecutive home games for the first time this season, after scoring in their previous five home games – in a single Serie A season, the Giallorossi have already failed to score in at least three consecutive home games on five occasions, most recently between February and April 2024.
- Bologna have scored in their last 10 league games; the last time they scored in at least 11 consecutive Serie A games was between October and December 2023.
- Bologna have drawn three of their last four league away games (W1), as many draws as in their previous 11 (W5 L3); indeed, the Rossoblù have collected two away draws in a row for the first time since a run of five between August and October 2023 under Thiago Motta.
- Bologna are both the team with the most high turnovers (165), and the most pressed sequences (284) in Serie A this season – indeed the Rossoblù have a 9.1 PPDA value (ratio between the opposition passes allowed outside of the team's own defensive third and the defensive actions outside of their own defensive third), the lowest in Serie A this term.
- Nikola Krstovic has been involved in five goals in his last four league games (3 goals, 2 assists), as many as in his previous 22 appearances in the competition (4 goals, 1 assist); the Lecce striker has netted seven goals in two different Serie A campaigns with the Giallorossi and, prior to him, the last player to achieve this with the Apulians was David Di Michele, between 2010-11 and 2011-12.
- Davide Calabria could play his first Serie A match with a team other than Milan; since his debut in the competition in 2014-15, he has played 210 games, only eight defenders have more in the same period with a single team. He has already found the net in Serie A against Lecce, in January 2023, his last away goal in the competition.
- Giovanni Fabbian, who found the net in the last matchday, has scored two goals in the 2024-25 Serie A season; among the players with at least two goals in both this and in the last campaign, only Patrick Dorgu (26/10/2004 who has just left Lecce) and Kenan Yildiz (04/05/2005) are younger than the Rossoblù midfielder (14/01/2003).



Napoli - Udinese

- Napoli are unbeaten in their last 17 Serie A matches against Udinese (W14 D3); in their top-flight history the Partenopei have only enjoyed a longer such streak against four teams before: Cagliari (18), Cesena (26), Como (18) and Roma (19).
- Napoli have won each of their last 10 Serie A home games against Udinese, scoring an average of 3.1 goals per match in the period. In the competition, they've collected more wins in a row on their own patch only against Como (12) and Hellas Verona (11).
- After recording seven successive wins in Serie A, Napoli drew their last game (1-1 against Roma) and could draw back-to-back matches for the first time since the last two matchdays of last season, under Francesco Calzona.
- Napoli have kept a clean sheet in six home games out of their 11 played in Serie A this season: no team has recorded more than them (also six both Juventus and AC Milan). The last time the Partenopei collected more in their first 12 home games was in 2018/19.
- After three draws and two defeats, Udinese won last time out in the league (3-2 against Venezia) and could record back-to-back wins for the first time in the competition since last August-September (three in that case).
- Udinese have lost five of their last nine Serie A away games (W2 D2), as many defeats as they suffered in their previous 18 matches on the road in the competition (W6 D7).
- Napoli and Udinese are the only two teams yet to concede a headed goal in Serie A this season. The Bianconeri have scored eight headed goals out of their 28 total (29%) with no team holding a higher percentage in Serie A this season (also 29% for Genoa).
- Napoli are 10th in the ranking for high turnovers in the league this season (133, only six more than Udinese); despite this the Partenopei are first - level with Lazio - for shot ending high turnovers (34)
- Romelu Lukaku has scored six goals in eight Serie A games against Udinese - only against Genoa he netted more in the competition (seven). His goals against the Bianconeri have come in five different matches, against no team did he find the net in more different meetings in the top-flight (also five vs AC Milan and Genoa).
- Since the beginning of last season, Lorenzo Lucca has scored 17 goals in total with eight of those coming via his head (only Duván Zapata has more with ten). In general, eight of his 17 goals were the first goal of a league match in Serie A this season, with only Pinamonti (10), Lautaro Martínez (nine) and Vlahovic (nine) scoring more such goals.
