

**Bologna - Torino**

14 February 2025



- Bologna have won three of their last five Serie A games against Torino (D1 L1), as many wins as they had in their previous 19 games against the Granata in the competition (D8 L8).
- Torino haven't won any of their last eight away Serie A games against Bologna (D5 L3) and, among opponents currently in Serie A, only against Inter (9), Napoli (12), Juventus (19) and Milan (29) do they have a longer open streak of away games without a win.
- Bologna haven't conceded goal in their last three Serie A games against Torino and have never kept more clean sheets in a row against the Granata; the last time the Rossoblu recorded more consecutive clean sheets against a single opponent in the competition was in April 2016 against Genoa (five).
- Torino have drawn six of their last seven Serie A games (W1), at least two more draws than any other team in the Big-5 European leagues since Christmas.
- Bologna are unbeaten in all six of their Serie A games played in 2025 (W2 D4); the last time they didn't lose any of their first seven games in a single calendar year in the top flight was in 2012, under Stefano Pioli.
- Torino are unbeaten in their last five away games in Serie A (W1 D4), and could register six consecutive away league games without losing for the first time since May 2023.
- Bologna have kept a clean sheet in their last two league games, having conceded goal in each of their previous five – the last time the Rossoblu kept more consecutive clean sheets in Serie A was in April 2024 (four).
- Torino (1,370) and Bologna (1,326) have played the most minutes drawing in Serie A this season (including injury time); while level, the Rossoblu have conceded an average of 7.5 shots per 90 minutes, the lowest of any side.
- Santiago Castro (20 years and 149 days on the day of the match and with six goals currently) could become the second youngest foreign player in the history of Bologna to score seven goals in a Serie A season, after Harald Nielsen in 1962.
- Yann Karamoh has scored two of his eight goals in Serie A against Bologna (a joint-record for him in the competition) – including his first goal in the Italian top-flight on 11 February 2018 with Inter.

**Atalanta - Cagliari**

15 February 2025



- Atalanta and Cagliari have not drawn any of their last 19 Serie A meetings (11 Nerazzurri wins and eight Rossoblu wins); the last draw was back in January 2013, 1-1 with an own goal by Michele Canini and a Guglielmo Stendardo goal.
- Cagliari have won four of their last six away games against Atalanta in Serie A (L2), after failing to win in their previous 14 (D4 L10).
- 12 out of the 59 previous Serie A matches between Atalanta and Cagliari have been played in February: the Nerazzurri have won five of the last six (L1).
- Although Atalanta have failed to win five of their last seven league games (D4 L1), they have won two of the last three (D1), including a 5-0 win over Hellas Verona last Saturday – the Dea can win two games in a row for the first time since the start of 2025.
- Just four of Cagliari's 24 points this season have come against opponents currently in the top-10, and only Lecce have fewer (two).
- Cagliari have won just one of their last nine league away games (D3 L5), a 2-1 win over Monza on 5 January; they are also one of two teams, alongside with Como, who have never kept a clean sheet away from home in the current campaign.
- Atalanta (15) and Cagliari (13) are the two teams that have gained the most points from a losing positions in this season's Serie A.
- Gian Piero Gasperini (599) is close to winning 600 points as a manager in Serie A with Atalanta and only one manager in the history of the competition has reached this milestone with a single team – Massimiliano Allegri with Juventus (663).
- Mateo Retegui has scored 20 goals this campaign and only four players in the history of Serie A have scored more goals in a single season for Atalanta: Filippo Inzaghi (24 in 1996/97), Duván Zapata (23 in 2018/19), Luis Muriel (22 in 2020/21) and Hans Jeppson (22 in 1951/52).
- Cagliari striker Roberto Piccoli (15 appearances – including his debut on 15 April 2019 – and one goal for Atalanta in the league) has scored 16 of his 19 goals in Serie A in the second half, including each of his last five; since making his debut in the competition, he is the player with the highest percentage of goals scored in the second half (84% – among players with 19+ goals).

**Lazio - Napoli**

- Napoli have not won any of their last four games against Lazio in Serie A (D1 L3), after having won each of the previous four; they have failed to find the net in the two most recent games and the last time they went three in a row without finding the net was in 1948.
- Lazio can record three wins in a season against Napoli in all competitions for the first time since 1994/95, with Zdenek Zeman as manager, when two of the three came in the quarter-finals of the Coppa Italia.
- Napoli have won eight of their last 11 away games against Lazio in Serie A (D1 L2): in the same period (since 2013/14) no other team has had as many away wins against the Biancocelesti (Inter and Juventus on six).
- Despite Lazio occupying one of the top four positions in the Serie A table after 24 games played for the first time since 2019/20, the Biancocelesti have won only one of their last five home league games (D2 L2), winning the most recent one against Monza.
- After a run of seven consecutive wins in Serie A, Napoli have drawn their two most recent games; the last time they recorded three draws in a row was in December 2014, with Rafael Benítez on the bench.
- Lazio will face the top and bottom teams in Serie A in back-to-back games for the first time since January 2022 (a loss to Inter and a win against Salernitana); overall, the only team in the last 10 seasons to have faced the league leaders and bottom club in back-to-back games and won against both in the competition was Udinese, in December 2017 (on that occasion against Benevento and Inter).
- Napoli (nine) and Lazio (eight) are the two teams that have earned the most points thanks to goals scored after the 75th minute of games in Serie A this season.
- Mattia Zaccagni, who has scored two goals and provided an assist in his last three home games against Napoli in Serie A, is the only Italian player to have scored at least five goals and provided at least five assists this season.
- Giovanni Simeone is the current Serie A player who has scored the most goals against Lazio in the league: eight (including four in a single match, Hellas Verona's 4-1 win on 24 October 2021) in 15 matches; however, over the last two seasons, he has scored just two goals, with his most recent away goal in the competition coming in October 2022, against Cremonese.
- Giovanni Di Lorenzo is close to 200 appearances in Serie A with Napoli (currently at 199): since his debut with the Partenopei in 2019/20, only Lautaro Martínez (201) has played more games in the Italian top-flight.

**Milan - Hellas Verona**

- Milan have won each of their last eight Serie A matches against Hellas Verona; the Rossoneri have only managed to record a longest consecutive winning streak against four opponents in their history in the competition: 13 against Chievo, 10 against Novara, 10 against Pescara and nine against Siena.
- Hellas Verona have never won away against Milan (D13 L19) nor against Inter; since their first Serie A season in 1957/58, they've played the most times at a single stadium (San Siro) without winning: 24 draws and 41 defeats in 65 previous such matches.
- Although Hellas Verona have scored only one goal in the last three matches against Milan in Serie A, the Venetians have scored 66 goals overall against the Rossoneri in the competition, only against Fiorentina (71) have they scored more (also 66 against Lazio).
- Milan have won 11 of their last 15 Serie A matches against opponents in the bottom six positions of the table at the start of the matchday (D4).
- Hellas Verona have remained unbeaten in four of their last five Serie A away games (W3 D1), after recording a run of six consecutive away defeats in the competition.
- Milan have won only two of their last eight home league games (D5 L1); however no team has kept more clean sheets than the Rossoneri at home in Serie A this term (6, alongside Napoli and Juventus).
- Only Southampton (54) and Holstein Kiel (54) have conceded more goals than Hellas Verona (53, level with Leicester) in the big five European Leagues in 2024-25; indeed, before this season, the Venetians had never conceded more than 50 goals in their first 24 matches played in a Serie A season.
- Milan have made the most direct attacks in Serie A this term (58) – on the other hand, Verona have conceded only 25 such attacks to their opponents so far, more than only Juventus (22), Atalanta (20) and Lazio (16).
- Santiago Giménez, after his goal against Empoli, could become the third player to score in each of his first two Serie A appearances for Milan in the three points for a win era - among those in their debut season in the competition - after Andriy Shevchenko in September 1999 and Christian Pulisic in August 2023.
- Diego Coppola, who is the player with the most interceptions in Serie A this term (48), has played 68 games for Hellas Verona in Serie A. Only Ivan Ilic (72) has played more games for the club in the era of three points for a win before turning 22.

**Fiorentina - Como**

- Fiorentina have won each of their last four games against Como across all competitions without conceding goal, including games in Serie B (in 2003/04), Coppa Italia (in August 2004) and Serie A (November 2024).
- Como will play a Serie A away game against Fiorentina for the first time since a 3-1 defeat on 7th May 1989; overall, Como have only won three of their 12 previous away games against the Viola in the competition (D2 L7).
- Fiorentina have picked up more than 40 points after 24 games in a Serie A season (42) for only the third time in the last 16 campaigns, after 2013/14 (44, finished 4th) and 2015/16 (46, finished 5th).
- Como have lost four of their last five league games (W1), including the three most recent; the last time the Lariani recorded a longer streak of consecutive defeats in Serie A was back in November 2002, losing five under Eugenio Fascetti.
- Fiorentina have won seven of their last 10 home league games (D1 L2) and only Napoli (28) and Inter (27) have gained more points in home matches than Viola in the current Serie A campaign (24, level with Lazio).
- Como have picked up only seven of their 22 points this season in away games (32%): only Venezia (25%) have recorded a lower percentage of points gained in away matches in Serie A in 2024/25.
- Only Parma (29) have conceded more goals than Como (26) in the second half of games in Serie A this season - on the other hand, only Napoli (eight) and Juventus (10) have conceded fewer goals than Fiorentina (12, alongside Atalanta).
- Only Inter (17) have scored more goals than Fiorentina (16) via set pieces in Serie A this season. On the other hand, only Monza (four) have netted fewer than Como (five).
- Only Santiago Castro (born in 2004) is younger than Lucas Beltrán (2001) among players who have scored at least four goals and provided at least four assists in Serie A this season (4G+4A); however, the Fiorentina striker has scored only once in his last 12 starting games in the current league season (in January against Lazio).
- Patrick Cutrone, who scored a brace against Fiorentina in May 2018 in Serie A, has netted six goals in the current league season: the last Como player to score more in a single Serie A campaign was Dan Corneliusson in 1985/86 (seven).

**Monza - Lecce**

- Lecce are unbeaten in five matches against Monza in Serie A (W2 D3); among teams the Salento side have never lost to, they have played the joint-most matches against Monza (five also against Venezia).
- Both Monza and Lecce have found the net in four of their five Serie A meetings, with only the Brianza side failing to score in their first match at the U-Power Stadium in the top-flight on 28 May 2023 (0-1 away win).
- Monza have lost 15 of their 24 games in the league this season, a joint-negative record with Hellas Verona; the Brianza team have never recorded more defeats in an entire Serie A season (15 also in 2023/24 in 38 matchdays).
- No team has won fewer matches than Monza this season in the Big-5 European leagues: two, level with Southampton and Bochum.
- After a 0-0 draw in their most recent league match against Bologna, Lecce could draw two games in a row in Serie A for the first time since last September (against Torino and Parma in that case); while the last time they kept a clean sheet in two consecutive games in the tournament dates back to August/September 2024 (against Cagliari and Torino).
- After their success against Parma in their most recent away match, Lecce could win two away games in a row in Serie A for the first time since February 2023 (against Cremonese and Atalanta in that case).
- Monza have earned the fewest points in matches against teams currently in the lower half of the table in Serie A this season (seven in 11 matches), while Lecce has picked up 22 in 12 games (ninth in this ranking).
- Lecce (12) and Monza (11) have conceded the most goals in the last 15 minutes of the first half in Serie A this season.
- Lecce are the opponent against which Dany Mota has played the most minutes in Serie A without being involved in any goal (305). The 1998-born player (four goals in 2024/25) is close to equalling his best season in terms of goals scored in Serie A (five goals in 2022/23); his last league goal, however, came on October 21st against Hellas Verona.
- Monza are the team against which Nikola Krstovic has scored the most goals in Serie A (three); the 2000-born player has scored seven goals in 24 matches in this championship, equalling his haul from last season in the tournament (seven goals in 35 appearances).



Udinese - Empoli

16 February 2025



- Udinese are unbeaten in their last six Serie A matches against Empoli (W2 D4), with the Tuscans' last win against the Friulians in the competition coming back on 6th December 2021 (3-1 at the Castellani stadium).
- Udinese and Empoli have drawn each of their last three league matches: the Tuscans have recorded more consecutive draws in Serie A only against Genoa (four between November 2021 and February 2024).
- Udinese haven't lost in 13 of their 15 home games against Empoli in Serie A (W8 D5), scoring twice as many goals as the Tuscans (26 vs 13).
- Udinese have drawn four of their last seven league games (W1 L2), as many draws as in their previous 21 Serie A matches (W9 D4 L8).
- Empoli have lost seven of their last nine league games (D2), including the two most recent; the Tuscans only once recorded three defeats in a row in Serie A this season: in December 2024 against Torino, Atalanta and Genoa.
- Empoli failed to score in their most recent league match and could register two consecutive games without scoring for the first time in Serie A this season, last doing so between April and May 2024 (three games).
- With Jurgen Ekkelenkamp's goal in the last match against Napoli, Udinese have now scored six goals from outside the box in the current league season, with only Atalanta (eight) netting more (six also for Fiorentina).
- Empoli are the only team yet to win any points from goals scored in the last 30 minutes of play in Serie A this season (only three goals netted in this period), while the Tuscan club have also dropped the most points (14) from goals conceded in the last 30 minutes of play.
- Lorenzo Lucca (nine goals in the current league season) could reach 10+ goals for the first time in a Serie A campaign; he could become only the second Italian player to reach 10+ goals in a single season for Udinese in the last 10 Serie A campaigns (since 2015/16), after Kevin Lasagna (10 in 2019/20 and 12 in 2017/18).
- Seven of Sebastiano Esposito's eight goals in the current league season have come in away games; only one player has netted more away goals in a single Serie A campaign in Empoli's history: Francesco Tavano in 2005/06 (eight).



Parma - Roma

16 February 2025



- Parma have lost more games against Roma (34 in 55 matches) than against any other side in Serie A; 11 Emilian wins and 10 draws.
- There has only been one draw between Parma and Roma in the last 15 matches in Serie A (three wins for the Ducali and 11 wins for the Giallorossi): 0-0 on 15th February 2015 at the Olimpico stadium.
- Parma have won their last two home league games against Roma (both without conceding a goal via 2-0); only once have the Emilians achieved more home wins in a row against the Giallorossi (three at the Tardini stadium in the first three matches at this stadium between 1990 and 1993).
- With three defeats in a row currently, Parma could lose four consecutive matches for the first time in the current league season; indeed, the Emilians could register at least four defeats in a row in Serie A for the first time since the period between April and May 2021 (nine in that case).
- Roma kept a clean sheet in their most recent league match against Venezia and could register two clean sheets in a row for the first time in Serie A this season; the last time they haven't conceded goal in two games in a row was back in the period between March and April 2024 (three in that case).
- After a streak of 13 away league games without a win (D7 L6), Roma have won their last two away matches against Udinese and Venezia; the Giallorossi could win three matches in a row on the road in Serie A for the first time since January/March 2024.
- Roma have scored the most goals courtesy of penalties in the current league season (seven of seven penalties taken); in addition, the Giallorossi have netted the biggest proportion of their goals from penalties. 20%.
- Only one of Parma's last 10 goals (excluding own goals) in Serie A has been scored by a striker: Matteo Cancellieri against AC Milan on 26th January 2025.
- With his goal in the last league match against Cagliari, Giovanni Leoni became the youngest Parma defender to score in Serie A (18 years and 50 days), surpassing the previous record held by Marco Rossi (18 years and 114 days on 22 January 2006 against Chievo). In addition, Parma's last three goals in Serie A have been scored by defenders.
- Paulo Dybala has scored each of his 15 penalties taken for Roma in Serie A; only Hakan Çalhanoglu (17) and Giampaolo Pazzini (16) have recorded a longer streak of penalties scored in a row in Serie A on record (from 2005/06).

**Juventus - Inter**

16 February 2025



- Inter are unbeaten in their last three league matches against Juventus (W1 D2); in the last 45 years (since 1980) only once have they recorded four consecutive matches without defeat against the Bianconeri in Serie A: between 2003 and 2005 (W3 D1 in that case).
- After the 4-4 draw in the reverse match on 27th October 2024, Juventus and Inter could draw both Serie A meetings in a season for the fourth time in history, after 2001/2002, 1994/1995 and 1988/1989.
- Juventus are unbeaten in 10 of their last 11 home league games against Inter (W7 D3), with the Nerazzurri's only win in the period at the Allianz Stadium in Serie A arriving on 3rd April 2022 (0-1 via Hakan Çalhanoglu's penalty).
- Juventus have won their last two league matches and could achieve three wins in a row for the first time in Serie A this season; the last time they recorded three consecutive wins in a single Serie A campaign was between December 2023 and January 2024 (five).
- Juventus are the only team unbeaten in home games in Serie A this season (W5 D7); however, they have drawn the joint-most home matches in the Big-5 European leagues in 2024/25: seven, level with Getafe.
- Inter have picked up the most points on average (2.0 - eight in four matches) and are the only club in games against the top five in Serie A this season; on the other hand Juventus on average have gained 1.2 points (six in five games).
- Inter lost their last away league game (3-0 against Fiorentina) and could lose two away matches in a row in Serie A for the first time since February/March 2023 (against Bologna and Spezia). In general, the Nerazzurri have scored the most (30 goals in 12 matches) and have conceded the joint-fewest goals (nine goals conceded, level with Napoli), in the current league season.
- Inter have scored the most goals via set pieces (17) in Serie A this season; on the other hand, Juventus have conceded the highest proportion of their goals from set pieces (43% - 9/21).
- Randal Kolo Muani (five goals in three matches) is the first player to score at least five goals in his first three Serie A games in the three points for a win era (since 1994/95). He could become only the second player to score in each of his first four Serie A games in the three points for a win era (among those who debuted during this period), after Krzysztof Piatek (he netted in each of his first seven league matches in 2018/19).
- Lautaro Martínez (nine goals in the current league season) could become the first foreign player in Inter's history to reach 10+ goals in six different Serie A campaigns - currently on five, level with Stefano Nyers and Mauro Icardi.

**Genoa - Venezia**

- After the 2-0 win in the reverse match on 21st September 2024, Venezia could win both matches in a season against Genoa for the first time in Serie A; Overall, only between 1943 and 1946 did the Venetians win two consecutive games against the Grifone in the top-flight.
- Venezia are unbeaten in their last four matches against Genoa in Serie A (W1 D3), having lost three of the previous four matches against the Ligurians in the competition (W1); the last Grifone win against the Lagunari in Serie A came back on 30th September 1962 (2-0 at the Ferraris stadium).
- Among the teams faced at least five times at home in Serie A, Venezia are the side against which Genoa have the highest percentage of wins (88% - seven wins in eight home games). Overall, among teams against which the Grifone have never lost against at home in Serie A, they have played the joint-most games against them, eight, level with Lecce.
- After a streak of 10 league games at the Ferraris stadium without a win (D6 L4), Genoa have won their two most recent home games without conceding a goal; the Grifone could win three home games in a row without conceding a goal in Serie A for the first time since the period between January and February 2010 under Gian Piero Gasperini.
- In their last nine league games, Genoa have never repeated the same result two games in a row (W3 D3 L3): a 1-1 draw was their most recent one against Torino.
- Venezia are the only team that haven't won an away match in Serie A this season (D4 L8); the Lagunari have also picked up the fewest points away from home (four) and conceded the most goals on the road (24) in Serie A in 2024/25.
- Venezia have conceded goals in each of their last 19 league games, the longest current streak among the teams currently in Serie A; the Lagunari's last clean sheet in the competition came back in the reverse fixture against Genoa (2-0 on 21st September 2024).
- Venezia (59%) and Genoa (41%) have scored the highest proportion of goals via set pieces in Serie A this season: 13 of 22 for the Lagunari and 9 of 22 for the Grifone.
- Koni De Winter has scored in both his last two league games; only two Genoa defenders have netted in three consecutive Serie A games in the three points for a win era: Domenico Criscito (in September 2021) and Luca Antonelli (between November and December 2014).
- Hans Nicolussi Caviglia has been involved in six goals in the current league season (four goals and two assists), a joint-record for a Venezia player (six also Joel Pohjanpalo, now at Palermo); among Italian central midfielders, only Nicolò Barella (eight) has been involved in more goals in Serie A in 2024/25.
