

**Genoa - Lecce**

14 March 2025



- Lecce have won just one of their last 15 Serie A games against Genoa (D6 L8), 1-0 in September 2023 thanks to a goal from Rémi Oudin; however, the Giallorossi have avoided defeat in five of their last seven meetings with them in the competition (W1 D4).
- Genoa are unbeaten in each of their eight home games against Lecce in Serie A (W6 D2); only against Venezia (nine) have they had more home matches in the competition without ever suffering defeat.
- Genoa have won six of their last seven games against Lecce that have come in the second half of the season in Serie A (D1), scoring at least two goals in each of those matches (2.7 goals on average).
- Lecce have lost their last three league games, after remaining unbeaten in the previous three (W1 D2); the last time they suffered four defeats in a row in Serie A came between September and October 2024 under Luca Gotti.
- Genoa have lost only one of their last five league games (W1 D3), drawing 1-1 in each of the most recent two (against Empoli and Cagliari); the last time the Rossoblù recorded more consecutive draws in Serie A came between December 2023 and January 2024 (3 in a row).
- Lecce have won 25 points in Serie A this season (W6 D7 L15), the same number they obtained after the same number of games last season; they have only recorded more defeats (15 currently) after their first 29 games of the season on three occasions in Serie A in the three points for a win era (17 in 1997/98, 19 in 2005/06 and 16 in 2019/20).
- Since Patrick Vieira's first Serie A home game in charge of Genoa on November 24th, no team have conceded fewer home goals than the Rossoblu in the top-flight (five – level with Napoli).
- Ruslan Malinovskyi (one goal and one assist in his last four league games against Lecce) made his return to the pitch last time out, 167 days since his previous Serie A appearance; the Genoa man (149) is close to 150 appearances in Serie A and could become the second Ukrainian player to reach this milestone in the three points for a win era, after Andriy Shevchenko (226).
- Since Patrick Vieira joined Genoa, Fabio Miretti has played each of the club's 16 league games, completing more dribbles than any other Genoa player in that period (18); he is also the only Grifone player to create 15+ chances (16) and take at least 15 total shots (19) in Serie A in that time.
- Nikola Krstovic has scored nine goals in Serie A this season; Peru's Gianluca Lapadula is the only foreign player to hit double figures for goals in a single Serie A season for Lecce over the last 20 seasons.



Udinese - Hellas Verona

- The record across the last eight encounters in the top-flight between Hellas Verona and Udinese is balanced, with two wins each and four draws, including a 0-0 draw in the reverse fixture: the two teams could draw both seasonal matches in Serie A for the first time since 2019-20, with both meetings ending goalless on that occasion.
- Udinese are unbeaten in their last seven home games against Hellas Verona in Serie A (W3 D4) and they have never recorded a longer such run against them in the competition – the last away success for the Venetians in the top-flight against the Friulians came back in December 2014, a 2-1 win with goals scored by Luca Toni and Lazaros Christodoulopoulos.
- Hellas Verona have kept a clean sheet in six of their last 11 league games against Udinese and the Friulian team are in fact the opponent against which the Gialloblù have recorded the most clean sheets in Serie A since the 2019-20 season.
- Udinese have won 40 points from their first 28 games of the season in Serie A for the first time since 2012-13, when they won 41 points but lost their following match that season.
- Hellas Verona have lost four of their last five league games (W1); however, considering only matches against opponents outside the top eight positions in the table at the start of the matchday, they have remained unbeaten in each of their last four such games (W2 D2).
- After a run of six consecutive home games without a win (D2 L4), Udinese have since won their last three Serie A games at the Bluenergy Stadium; the last time they recorded more consecutive home wins under a single manager in the competition was between April and September 2013 (5 under Francesco Guidolin).
- Hellas Verona have averaged the lowest possession rate in Serie A in 2025 (35%); however, the Gialloblù have attempted a shot on average once every 26 passes in the league over that period, more often than any other team in the competition.
- This is only the second time in the last 10 seasons that Udinese have two players with at least eight goals scored after their first 28 Serie A games of the season (8 for Florian Thauvin and 10 for Lorenzo Lucca), following 2021/22 when Beto (8) and Gerard Deulofeu (9) did so.
- Florian Thauvin has found the net in his last two Serie A appearances and could score in three games in a row in the big five European Leagues for the first time since September 2018 with Marseille; the Udinese striker has also scored eight goals in Serie A this season, last scoring more in a single league campaign in 2018-19 in Ligue 1 (16).
- Only Atlético Madrid's Alexander Sørloth (7) has scored more goals as a substitute than Daniel Mosquera (5 - level with Lazio's Pedro and Girona's Cristhian Stuani) in the big five European Leagues 2024-25; furthermore, only Giampaolo Pazzini (6 - 3 in 2017-18 and 3 in 2019-20) has scored more such goals for Hellas Verona in Serie A in the three points for a win era.

**Monza - Parma**

- Parma won the reverse fixture against Monza: the last time they won both of their first two Serie A matches against a single opponent was against Sassuolo in 2013/14.
- Monza have not won any of their last seven matches against Parma between Serie A and Serie B (D5 L2): the last success of the Brianza team between these two competitions was in March 1985, a 3-0 home win in the second division.
- Parma are the opponent that Monza have faced most at home without ever losing between Serie A and B: 10 wins and six draws in 16 previous matches (the only one this century was a 1-1 in March 2022 in Serie B).
- Despite failing to find the net in their last three home league games, Monza have avoided defeat in two of their last four Serie A home matches (W1 D1), after having been defeated in all five previous matches.
- Only Venezia (six) and Monza (seven) have gained fewer points than Parma away from home in Serie A this season (eight). They have lost each of their last four away games, last losing more consecutively in a single campaign between April and May 2021 (five consecutive defeats).
- Monza have lost 12 of their 14 Serie A games since the beginning of December: in the same period, only Southampton (13) have recorded more defeats in the big five European leagues (12 defeats also for Leicester).
- Parma have scored 24% of their goals from corners in Serie A this season (8/34), the highest percentage in the current tournament. Meanwhile, Monza have conceded the most goals following corners (eight).
- Parma (43) and Monza (44, equal with Hellas Verona) are two of the three teams that have made the fewest high turnovers in Serie A in 2025.
- Keita Baldé has scored in three of his six Serie A matches against Parma, including his first goal in the Italian top-flight in November 2013. After his goal against Inter, the Monza striker can find the net in two consecutive appearances in the tournament for the first time since May 2021.
- Emanuele Valeri has provided four assists this season: the last Italian players to provide more assists for Parma in a single Serie A season were Mattia Cassani (five), Marco Parolo (six) and Antonio Cassano (six), all in 2013/14.

**Milan - Como**

15 March 2025



- Milan are unbeaten in their last 12 Serie A games against Como (W7 D5), winning all three against them in the 2000s; the only time the Rossoneri have recorded four consecutive wins against Como in the competition was between 1951 and 1952.
- Como have won just one of their 12 away games against Milan in Serie A (D4 L7): 2-0 in January 1985, with goals from Gianfranco Matteoli and Pasquale Bruno. They've also failed to score in their last five such matches (most recently in 2003).
- Milan have won five of their last six games against teams starting the matchday in the bottom half of the table (L1), as many wins as in their previous 13 matches against those teams (D6 L2).
- Como are unbeaten in three of their last four Serie A games (W2 D1), as many times as in their previous eight league games (W2 D1) – however, they have just one win in their most recent 10 away games in the competition (D3 L6).
- Milan have conceded exactly two goals in each of their last four league games; they have conceded more than one goal in five consecutive matches in a single Serie A season on just three occasions in their history: twice in the 1940s and most recently in April 1974.
- Como have won 17 of their 29 points in Serie A this term against teams currently in the top half of the table: only Napoli (30), Atalanta (22), Inter (20) and Juventus (19) have won more points against these teams in the current tournament.
- Milan have attempted the most shots from outside the box in Serie A this term (148); on the other hand, only Bologna (79) have conceded fewer such shots than Como (95).
- Como are the second team in the last 50 years to have two players who have scored at least five goals in a Serie A season before turning 21 (5 goals for Assane Diao and 6 goals for Nico Paz), after Reggina 1999/2000 (Andrea Pirlo and Mohammed Kallon).
- Rafael Leão is close to 250 appearances in all competitions with Milan (currently 249, with 68 goals and 50 assists): since his debut with the Rossoneri in 2019-20, he is the only Serie A player who has scored at least 50 goals and provided at least 50 assists in all competitions.
- Assane Diao, who scored his first Serie A goal in the reverse fixture against Milan, with one goal would become the Como player to have scored the most goals in the competition before turning 20 (currently 5, level with Giovanni Migliorini and Bruno Susmel).



Torino - Empoli

- Empoli have only won two of their last 11 meetings against Torino in the League (D5 L4): 4-1 on 19th May 2019 and 3-2 on 6th April 2024 (in the 2nd leg of last Serie A).
- Torino have been unbeaten in their all last five home matches against Empoli in Serie A (W2 D3) after they having lost four of their first seven such games with this side in the competition (W2 D1).
- After the 1-0 win of the last 13th December, Torino could win two games in a row against Empoli for the first time in Serie A: the Toscani are the team against whom the Granata played more times without ever recording two successes in a row in the competition (25).
- Empoli are the current Serie A team who are waiting win for the most matches in the League (13 – D3 L10); the Toscani only two times have recorded a longest winless streak in a top-flight campaign in their history: between December 1998 and March 1999 (15) and between December 2021 and April 2022 (16).
- Torino have been unbeaten in 10 of their last 11 League games (W3 L7) and they found the net in all the most recent nine ones; furthermore, the last time the Granata scored at least one net for more matches in a row in a single Serie A campaign back to the period between January-May 2017 (streak of 14 ones with Sinisa Mihajlovic as manager).
- Empoli have scored 18 away goals in Serie A this season and just five ones in home matches: the +13 goal difference is the 2nd highest so far in a single campaign in the tournament history – after Udinese in 2020/21 (+14), +13 also for Scudetto's Milan in 2021/22.
- Empoli are the team who recorded the most pressed sequences in 2025 in Serie A: 137; to the other hand, Torino are the worst one in this rank, with just 86.
- Ché Adams scored eight goals in Serie A this season and he is one net far from his seasonal goal record in the Big-5 European League (nine in 2020/21 with Southampton).
- Eljif Elmas scored three goals in his first four appearances with Torino in the current League season – he could become the first Granata player to find the net in at least four of his first five Serie A matches in the three points per win era.
- Sebastiano Esposito scored seven of his eight goals in away matches in Serie A this season: only one player in Empoli's history has been able to score more nets far from home in a single top-flight campaign, Francesco Tavano in 2005/06 (eight, while Antonio Di Natale stopped at seven in 2002/03).

**Venezia - Napoli**

- Napoli have kept clean sheet in all their last six meetings against Venezia in Serie A – winning all the most recent four: only against Avellino (eight) and Mantova (seven) the Partenopei have a longest opened streak of clean sheet in a row in the competition.
- Two wins for both and three draws in the seven meetings between Venezia and Napoli played at Lagunari's home in Serie A – with the Partenopei wins for 2-0 in the most recent one, on 6th February 2022.
- Venezia have drawn three games in a row in Serie A (vs Lazio, Atalanta and Como) for the first time since the period between March and April 1962 (streak of four ones in that case with Carlo Alberto Quario as manager).
- Venezia have only lost two of their last seven home League matches (W1 D4), against Inter and Roma – without scoring in their two most recent ones; furthermore, the Lagunari could record at least three goalless games played at Penzo in Serie A for the first time since the period between May 2000 and November 2001 (five ones in that case).
- Napoli have conceded goal in their all last eight League games (11 ones) – after they had conceded just 12 overall nets in the first 20 matches in Serie A this season (with precisely 12 clean sheets in the period).
- Napoli have lost the last match against a newly promoted team in Serie A (1-2 vs Como, on last 23rd February), the Partenopei could suffer two defeats in a row with these sides for the first time since the period between February and April 2015 (vs Palermo and Empoli with Rafael Benítez as manager).
- Napoli have lost four of their last six games played at 12:30 p.m. in Serie A (W1 D1) – including the two most recent ones (vs Atalanta and Como); the Partenopei never lost three matches in a row in this game time in the top-flight.
- From one hand, Venezia are the team who scored the most percentage goals on set play in Serie A this season (61%, 14/23); to the other, Napoli are that ones who conceded in % the fewer such ones in the current tournament (13%, 3/23).
- Since his first match with Venezia (from last 19 January), Alessio Zerbin is the Lagunari's player who created the most chances (11), recorded the most touches in opposite box (23) and open play crosses (17). 19 of his 40 overall appearances in Serie A were with Napoli jersey.
- Napoli have always won when Romelu Lukaku scored in the current League: 10 goals in 10 games and 10 victories – only Harry Kane (12 on 12) has found the net in more different games always recording a win in this season in the Big-5 European Leagues (10 on 10 also Bradley Barcola). The Belgian forward has also been involved in eight goals in his last nine meetings against newly promoted sides in Serie A (six nets and two assists).



Bologna - Lazio

- Only against Roma (54) have Bologna won more games in Serie A than against Lazio (W48 D38 L55). On the other hand, only against Fiorentina (59) have Lazio achieved more wins in Serie A than against Bologna (55, as against Sampdoria).
- After the 3-0 win in the reverse fixture on last 24 November, Lazio could win both seasonal matches against Bologna in Serie A for the first time since 2004-05.
- Bologna have kept a clean sheet in their last four league games at the Dall'Ara against Lazio, already a record streak of consecutive home clean sheets for the Rossoblu against the Biancocelesti in Serie A. The Emilians are in fact unbeaten in five consecutive home matches against Lazio in the top-flight (W3 D2), the last away win for the team of the capital dates back to 26 December 2018 (2-0 in that case).
- Bologna have won their last three league games, in the last 55 years only once have they recorded at least four consecutive wins in Serie A: six between February and March 2024.
- In the last two Serie A seasons (since 2023-24), among the teams present in both campaigns, only Torino (21) have conceded fewer goals in home games than Bologna (25, equal with Juventus); furthermore, only Inter (79) have earned more points in home games in Serie A than the Emilians in this period (70 points in 33 games at the Dall'Ara, 2.1 on average).
- Lazio have drawn three of their last four league games (W1), as many as they have in the first 24 games of this Serie A season (W14 D3 L7).
- Only Roma (26) have earned more points than Bologna (22 in 11 matches) in 2025 in Serie A; in addition, in this calendar year only Atalanta (20) have scored more goals than the Emilians (19, equal with Roma) in the competition.
- Both Bologna and Lazio have scored 15 goals from set pieces this Serie A season (Atalanta also have 15), only Inter (19) and Fiorentina (16) have scored more from set pieces.
- Nicolò Cambiaghi has been involved in a goal in each of his last three league appearances, always as a substitute (1 goal and 2 assists) and he has never been involved in at least one goal in four consecutive Serie A matches. Overall, only one player has been involved in a goal (between goals and assists) in four consecutive Serie A appearances as a substitute in the three points for a win era: Manolo Gabbiadini between December 2016 and January 2019.
- Mattia Zaccagni's has only scored more than once in a Serie A game with Lazio, which came against Bologna, a brace on 12 February 2022; he has scored three goals in total in the competition against the Rossoblu, only against Sassuolo (5) has he scored more in the top-flight.



Roma - Cagliari

16 March 2025



- Roma haven't lost in 18 of their last 19 league games against Cagliari (W13 D5), with the Sardinians' only win against the Giallorossi in Serie A in the period on 25th April 2021 (3-2 at Unipol Domus stadium under Leonardo Semplici).
- After the 0-0 draw in MD1, Roma and Cagliari could draw both seasonal games in Serie A for only the third time, after 1990/1991 and 1972/1973.
- Roma are unbeaten in their last nine home games against Cagliari in Serie A (W7 D2), keeping seven clean sheets in the period; the Sardinians' last away win against the Giallorossi in Serie A was back on 1st February 2013 (4-2).
- Roma have won their last five league games and the last time they achieved six wins in a row in Serie A was back to the period between April and August 2016 under Luciano Spalletti. In addition, the Giallorossi are unbeaten in their last 12 league matches (W9 D3) and the last time they reached 13 was back to the period between April and September 2019.
- Roma have picked up the most points in 2025 in the Big-5 European leagues: 26, thanks to eight wins and two draws in 10 Serie A matches.
- Cagliari are one of the two teams, with Lecce, that haven't won any match against sides currently in the top half of the standing in Serie A: five draws and 10 defeats in 15 matches played by the Rossoblù against these opponents.
- Only Luciano Spalletti (59.2%) has a higher win percentage as Roma manager than Claudio Ranieri (57.3%: 51 wins in 89 games) in Serie A history – min. 2 games. Claudio Ranieri was the Cagliari manager in two different periods: between 1988/89 and 1990/91 with a double promotion from Serie C1 to Serie B and from Serie B to Serie A (1990/91 his first ever season as coach in the top division) and between January 2023 and May 2024 (with the Sardinian club's last promotion to Serie A obtained in 2022/23).
- Cagliari have conceded the most goals by set pieces (16) in Serie A this season, on the other hand, Roma are one of the two teams, with Juventus, to have conceded the highest percentage of their goals by set pieces (both 40%, 12/30 for the Giallorossi).
- Matías Soulé has scored more goals against Cagliari than against any other side in Serie A: three, including his only brace in the competition (on 29th October 2023 for Frosinone). He has been involved in three goals (two goals and one assist) in his last four league games, as many as in his previous 28 appearances in Serie A (two goals and one assist).
- After a goal against Bologna and an assist against Genoa, Roberto Piccoli could be involved in at least one goal in three consecutive appearances for the first time in Serie A. He has already scored a goal against Roma in Serie A, in his first match against the Giallorossi, on 23 January 2021 for Spezia at the Olimpico stadium.

**Fiorentina - Juventus**

- After the 2-2 draw in the reverse fixture earlier this season on 29 December, Fiorentina and Juventus could draw both Serie A matches of a campaign for only the second time in the last 40 years, after 2010/11.
- Juventus are unbeaten in seven of their last eight league matches against Fiorentina (W4 D3): the Viola's only win in this period came in May 2022 (2-0 at the Franchi with goals from Alfred Duncan and Nicolás González).
- Only against Milan (27) have Fiorentina lost more home matches in Serie A than against Juventus (24). In their 85 previous encounters on home soil in the competition, Fiorentina have recorded 28 wins and 33 draws.
- Fiorentina haven't drawn any of their last eight league matches (W4, L4). Since the start of the 2025 calendar year, no team has recorded fewer draws than the Viola in Serie A—just one in 11 games (level with Monza). Additionally, in the new calendar year, only Monza (eight) and Empoli (seven) have lost more games in the competition than Fiorentina (six, level with Hellas Verona and Parma).
- After their 0-4 defeat against Atalanta, Juventus could lose two games in a row in Serie A for the first time since February 2024 (against Inter and Udinese in that case).
- Juventus have won their last two away league games, against Como and Cagliari; the Bianconeri could record three consecutive Serie A wins on the road for the first time since January 2024. They are also the team to have lost the fewest away games in the current campaign (only one in 13: 6W, 6D).
- Fiorentina are one of two sides, along with Atalanta, to have scored the most goals during the opening 15 minutes of play in Serie A this season (seven both); the Viola are also the only team not to have conceded a goal in the first quarter of an hour of play in the 2024/25 Serie A.
- After his goal in the reverse fixture earlier this season, Moise Kean could become only the third Fiorentina player to score in both of his first two games against Juventus in Serie A in the three points for a win era (since 1994/95), after Josip Ilicic (between April and December 2015) and Giampaolo Pazzini (between April and December 2005).
- Dusan Vlahovic scored 42 goals in 97 league appearances for Juventus, with an average of one goal every 162 minutes and a shot conversion rate of 15%; during his spell at Fiorentina, the Serbian scored 44 goals in 98 Serie A games, with an average of one goal every 146 minutes and a shot conversion rate of 19%.
- After scoring a brace in the reverse fixture earlier this season (his first match with 2+ goals between Serie A and Ligue 1), Khéphren Thuram could become only the third Juventus player to score in both of his first two games against Fiorentina in Serie A since 2000, after Gonzalo Higuaín in 2016/17 and Mario Mandzukic in 2015/16.

**Atalanta - Inter**

16 March 2025



- Inter are unbeaten in their last 12 Serie A games against Atalanta (W7 D5), already a record run in this fixture – winning all five of their most recent games by an aggregate scoreline of 16-5. The Meneghini can win six league games in a row against the Bergamaschi for the first time since 1997-2001.
- Atalanta and Inter will face each other with a maximum gap of three points at the start of the matchday in the second half of a Serie A season for the first time since the last match of the 2019/20 campaign (August 1, 2020). On that occasion, the Bergamaschi had 78 points, while the Milanese club had 79, and the match ended in a 2-0 Inter win.
- Across the last 15 league matches between Atalanta and Inter in Bergamo: both sides have recorded four wins each, seven draws and scored 21 goals apiece. Despite this, Inter are unbeaten in their last five away games against the Bergamaschi in Serie A, winning the most recent two.
- Atalanta have remained unbeaten in 22 of their last 23 league matches (W15 D7), with their only defeat in this period coming against Napoli in January. Additionally, after their victory against Juventus, the Bergamaschi could win back-to-back Serie A matches for the first time in 2025.
- Atalanta have kept a clean sheet in each of their last five league games, only once have they kept six in their Serie A history in the period between December 1996 and January 1997.
- Atalanta are yet to win in their five league matches at the Gewiss Stadium in 2025 (D4 L1), drawing each of the last three; the Bergamaschi have not recorded four consecutive home draws in Serie A since the period between January and April 2007 (five in that case).
- Inter are winless in their last four league games on the road (D2 L2), after a prior run of eight away wins in a row; the Nerazzurri have not gone five consecutive away winless games Serie A since the period between December 2017 and February 2018 under Luciano Spalletti.
- Atalanta and Inter have scored the most Serie A goals during the 2024/25 season (63 each). Additionally, Atalanta have scored the most goals during the first halves of play (31) while Inter have netted the most goals in the second halves (34) in this year's Italian top-flight campaign.
- Only Filippo Inzaghi (24 in 1996/97) and Duván Zapata (23 in 2018/19) have scored more goals in a single Serie A season for Atalanta than Mateo Retegui (22 in 2024/25), with 22 goals also for Luis Muriel in 2020/21 and Hans Jørgensen in 1951/52. Amongst the opponents against which Retegui has neither scored nor provided an assist in Serie A, Inter are the team which he's played the most minutes (209).
- Since his first season scoring against Atalanta in Serie A (2019/20), no player has netted more goals against the Bergamaschi than Lautaro Martínez in the competition: six - level with Andrea Belotti. Overall, in the last two seasons across the big-5 European leagues (since 2023/24), only Kylian Mbappé (26) and Erling Haaland (22) have scored more away goals than the Inter striker (21, level with Mohamed Salah and Harry Kane).
