

**Como - Empoli**

29 March 2025



- Como and Empoli have never repeated the same result twice in a row in Serie A. In their seven previous meetings, there has been one win for the Lariani, three draws and three wins for the Toscani, including one in the reverse fixture (1-0 on November 4th).
- Empoli have won 67% of their Serie A away games against Como, two out of three (L1); among teams faced more than once on the road in the competition, this is their best win percentage against an opponent.
- Como have scored in each of their last six league games; the last time they went on a longer such streak was between February and April 1951 (eight matches in a row in that case).
- In their last eight league games at Sinigaglia (since mid-December), Como have earned 13 points (W4 D1); only five teams have picked up more points in Serie A home games in this period, while only two have scored more goals (Bologna 22 goals and Roma 18) than the Lariani (14) on their own patch.
- Empoli are winless in their last 14 Serie A games (D3 L11); across the big five European leagues, only are on a longer run without a victory (15) than the Toscani.
- Empoli have gained 14 points away from home and 8 at home in Serie A this season (+6); only Atalanta have a greater difference (+8) between points picked up on the road and points earned on home soil.
- According to the Expected Points model, Como should have 40.9 points in Serie A this season (currently on 29); the difference of -11.9 is the second-biggest in the division, after that of Monza (-12.4). Meanwhile, Empoli have also picked up fewer points than expected (22 points against 27.9 Expected Points, -5.9).
- Como have picked up 17 points against teams currently in the top half of the table in Serie A in 2024/25, but just 12 against the sides in the bottom half. The Lariani (+5) are one of only two teams, along with Hellas Verona (+3), to have earned more points against the top 10 sides than against the bottom 10 currently in the table.
- Lucas da Cunha has been involved in four goals (three goals and one assist) in Serie A this season, but he has not had a hand in any at Sinigaglia yet. Among the players yet to be involved in any goals in home games in the current Serie A season, only Davide Frattesi and Marco Brescianini have been involved in more goals (both five) overall.
- Should he score, Lorenzo Colombo - who has failed to find the net in each of his last seven Serie A games - could overtake his overall tally of goals in a single top-flight season (five so far, as he did in 2022/23 for Lecce). Furthermore, only Matías Soulé (15) has netted more than the Empoli striker (14) among the players born from 2002 onwards in the last three Serie A seasons (since 2022/23).

**Venezia - Bologna**

- Bologna have scored three goals in each of their last two Serie A games against Venezia, between May 2022 and November 2024; the Rossoblu have scored at least three goals in three games in a row against only two teams in the three points for a win era in the competition: Vicenza between 1998 and 1999 and Pescara between 2013 and 2017.
- In the last Serie A meeting between Venezia and Bologna at Penzo (8th May 2022), seven goals were scored (four for the Lagunari and three for the Felsinei); as many as in the previous four home matches for the Venetians in the competition (one goal for Venezia, six for Bologna).
- Venezia have scored just one goal in their last six Serie A matches (D4, L2), drawing all four of their most recent games; the Venetians have recorded five draws in a row only once in their history in the Italian top-flight: between October and December 1961 (six in that case).
- Venezia have failed to score in their last three home Serie A games, against Roma, Lazio and Napoli; furthermore, the Venetians have scored just three goals at home against teams currently in the top half of the table, conceding just six, for a total of nine goals in total – the fewest in such clashes in the competition this season.
- Bologna have scored 24 goals in Serie A in 2025, at least four more than any other side in the competition; considering also their 13 goals conceded, the Emilian team's matches have seen 37 goals – another record in this period.
- Bologna currently sit in fourth place with 53 points after 29 Serie A games; in the three-point-for-a-win era they have only done better after 30 games in the competition once (57 points last season) – the Rossoblu could finish in the top five for two seasons in a row in Serie A for the first time since the period between 1965/66 and 1967/68 (three in that case).
- Bologna have made 362 pressed sequences in the current Serie A campaign, at an average of 12.5 per match; the highest in the competition this season. Furthermore, they also have the lowest PPDA average (opponent passes allowed for defensive action) in the division this season (9).
- Bologna have scored just 4% of their goals in the first 15 minutes of play in Serie A this term (2/49), while Venezia have scored 22% (5/23); these are respectively the lowest and highest percentages of goals scored in this timeframe in the competition this season.
- Since his first match with Venezia in the current Serie A campaign, on February 9th, Ionut Radu has conceded only four goals in six games, collecting three clean sheets; already one more than the Joronen-Stankovic duo (two). In this period, he is the goalkeeper who has made the most saves (26) and who has prevented the most goals, based on xG on target faced (+4.5, at least two more than any other goalkeeper).
- Riccardo Orsolini has reached double figures for goals for three consecutive Serie A seasons, for a total of 31 goals since 2022/23; in this period, no other Italian player has scored 10 goals in more than one season, while he is also the top scorer among Italian players since 2022/23.

**Juventus - Genoa**

- Juventus are the opponents against which Genoa have recorded the most defeats in Serie A: 68, at least eight more than against any other in the competition, with 22 wins for the Grifone and 23 draws, making a total of 113 meetings.
- In Serie A, Juventus have not lost at home to Genoa since January 20, 1991, when Luigi Maifredi was in charge. Since then, Juventus have collected 15 wins and five draws; in the competition, the Bianconeri have a longer unbeaten home streak only against Brescia (23), Bari (30), and Hellas Verona (34).
- Juventus have collected 13 draws and suffered three defeats so far this season, failing to win in 16 out of the 29 matches played; it's the first time since 2010/11 that Juventus have failed to win at least 16 times after 29 Serie A matches (with nine draws and nine defeats in that case).
- In his previous period as manager in Serie A under Lazio (also in that case for the last nine games of Serie A in 2023/24), Igor Tudor picked up 18 points with the Capitoline team (exactly two on average per match, level with Inter), only Atalanta gained more with 19 points (2.1 on average) – in addition, the Biancocelesti conceded the fewest goals in this period in Serie A (six goals conceded).
- Juventus have not scored in their last two Serie A matches and have already registered three games in a row without scoring once this season, in September against Roma, Empoli, and Napoli; this could be only their third season with two streaks of at least three consecutive games without goals for the Bianconeri in the competition, after 1955/56 with Sandro Puppo and 1962/63 with Paulo Amaral.
- Genoa won their last Serie A match (2-1 against Lecce), and under Patrick Vieira, they have yet to achieve two consecutive wins in the competition; the last time they achieved this was in January 2024, against Salernitana and Lecce, with Alberto Gilardino as coach.
- Genoa have conceded in each of their last five away matches in Serie A, after shipping only one goal in the previous five; moreover, the Rossoblù have yet to win in six away games played in 2025 in the competition (D3, L3), with their last away win coming on December 28 against Empoli.
- Despite Juventus registering 113 build up attacks, 18 more than any other opponent in this season, they have scored only three goals from such actions, ranking behind five other teams in Serie A 2024/25.
- After scoring five goals in the first three matches for Juventus across all competitions, one every 52 minutes on average, Randal Kolo Muani hasn't found the net in the following eight games with the Bianconeri (622 minutes); the French striker had an Expected Goals (xG) of 1.84 in his first three appearances, compared to 1.73 xG in his last eight.
- Fabio Miretti, who scored a brace in the last match against Lecce, has scored three goals and provided three assists in 23 appearances this season with Genoa, already surpassing his performance in 58 Serie A games with Juventus, his current opponent (one goal and three assists).



Lecce - Roma

- Roma have lost only two of their 37 Serie A matches against Lecce (W25 D10) a 5% loss rate. Lecce is the team against which they have suffered the lowest percentage of defeats among the teams the Giallorossi have faced at least 10 times in the competition.
- In their 18 Serie A home matches played against Roma, Lecce has scored 12 goals, failing to score in 10 occasions. Roma is the team against which Lecce have most often failed to find the net in home games in Serie A.
- Lecce have lost their last four Serie A matches and have not endured a worse streak since a run of six consecutive losses between February and April 2023. Marco Giampaolo has never experienced five consecutive defeats in the competition, stopping at four losses on seven occasions.
- Lecce is one of four teams still without a home win in Serie A in 2025 (D2 L3), and no team has scored fewer goals than Lecce in home matches during this period (two goals, along with Venezia, Empoli, and Hellas Verona).
- Roma have collected 29 points in Serie A in 2025, with 9 wins and 2 draws from 11 matches. Among the Big-5 European leagues, only PSG have registered as many victories in the same period, but with 28 points from 10 matches (W9 D1).
- Roma have won their last four away matches in Serie A, and they have only enjoyed five or more consecutive away wins on five occasions in the competition, all between 2006 and 2017 – the last of which was between February and November 2017 (12 wins in that case).
- Roma have scored seven goals from penalties, more than any other opponent in Serie A. Among the Big-5 European Leagues, only Bayern Munich (9), Liverpool (9), and Real Madrid (8) have scored more goals from the spot. On the other hand, only Venezia (8) have conceded more penalties than Lecce (7, a level with Udinese and Como) in Serie A 2024/25.
- Both Roma and Lecce have registered 15 shot ending high turnovers in 2025 in Serie A, with no other side bettering this this year in the competition (Bologna and Udinese also 15).
- Nikola Krstovic has scored Lecce's last three goals in Serie A and now has reached 10 goals this season. The Montenegrin forward has scored 48% of Lecce's goals (10 out of 21), a record percentage in the Big-5 European Leagues 2024/25.
- Under Claudio Ranieri, Artem Dovbyk has scored six goals in 14 Serie A matches, averaging one goal every 159 minutes. In the 11 matches with Ivan Juric and Daniele De Rossi, he scored four goals, averaging one every 239 minutes. Additionally, both of his assists this season have come under Roma's current manager.

**Cagliari - Monza**

- Cagliari and Monza have met three times in Serie A, winning a game eachh (D1); the Brianzoli have found the net in each of those three meetings.
- Cagliari are unbeaten in each of their last seven home matches against Monza between Serie A and Serie B, winning two games and drawing five from 1984 onwards.
- Cagliari have only scored two goals in their last five league games (an average of 0.4 goals per match), failing to find the net on three occasions: as many as they did in their previous nine Serie A meetings (an average of 1.2 goals per game in the period).
- Cagliari have lost four of their last seven Serie A home games (W2 D1): as many defeats as they suffered in their previous 15 games on their own patch in the competition (W4 D7).
- Monza have earned 15 points in Serie A this season, while last term they had accrued 42 points after 29 games; the difference of 27 points is the largest among the teams present both in this and last season.
- Monza drew (1-1) last time out against Parma; the last time the Brianzoli remained unbeaten in back-to-back in Serie A fixtures was in November 2024 (two draws against Torino and Como, both 1-1).
- Monza are both one of the two teams to have scored the fewest headed goals (two, level with Hellas Verona), and the one to have conceded the most headed goals in Serie A this season (16, at least six more than any other side).
- Monza and Cagliari are the two teams to have conceded the most goals from corners in the current Serie A season (both eight); furthermore, the Sardi have shipped the most goals from set pieces (17).
- Roberto Piccoli has challenged for 376 duels in Serie A this season; among the forwards in the Big five European leagues, only Bournemouth's Antoine Semenyo (437) and Borussia Mönchengladbach's Tim Kleindienst (405) have attempted more; Cagliari striker has scored seven goals in the current top-flight season, already his best tally of goals in a single Serie A season.
- After scoring with each of his first four total shots (four goals) in Serie A this season, Dany Mota failed to find the net with his next 23 shots: his longest streak of shots without netting in the top-flight.

**Fiorentina - Atalanta**

- Only against Bologna (57) and Napoli (55) have Fiorentina won more Serie A matches than against Atalanta (W53 D38 L32).
- The most common score in Serie A meetings between Fiorentina and Atalanta is 0-0, recorded 15 times; however, the most recent 0-0 draw between the two teams was back in March, 2017. Furthermore, in each of the last three encounters, Fiorentina and Atalanta have scored five goals in total, the result of three 3-2 wins (two for the Viola and one for the Dea).
- Among the teams faced at least 50 times on home soil in Serie A, Atalanta are the one against which Fiorentina have the highest percentage of home wins in the competition: 61%, thanks to 37 wins in 61 games (D15 L9). In general, only against Bologna have the Toscani won more meetings (40) on their own patch in the top-flight.
- Fiorentina are the side that Atalanta have faced the most times in Serie A after Italian national team games: 22 such matches in the top-flight between the two teams, with nine wins for the Viola, six for the Nerazzurri and seven draws.
- Fiorentina have won their last two matches in all competitions, scoring three goals in each of those (3-1 against Panathinaikos in UEFA Conference League and 3-0 against Juventus in Serie A) and in general they've scored 75 goals in 40 games this season: their average of 1.88 goals per match is the highest for the Viola in a single season since the 1960s.
- Following their 1-0 win against Lecce and the 3-0 against Juventus, Fiorentina could win three Serie A home games in a row while keeping a clean sheet in each for the first time under Raffaele Palladino and in general for the first time since December 2023, under Vincenzo Italiano.
- After five clean sheets in a row in Serie A (W3 D2), Atalanta lost 0-2 last time out against Inter and could concede at least two goals in back-to-back games for the first time since August-September 2024: four successive games in that case, two of those against Inter (0-4 defeat) and Fiorentina (3-2 victory).
- Fiorentina (14.5%) and Atalanta (13.7%) are two of the three sides with the highest shot conversion rate in Serie A this season; among them Inter (14.1%). In fact, the two Nerazzurri teams and the Viola are the three sides to have netted more goals than they should have scored according to the Expected Goals model in the top-flight in 2024/25: +11.2 for the Dea (63G, 51.8xG), +10.4 for Inter (65G, 54.6xG) and +9.1 for the Viola (46G, 36.9xG).
- Atalanta are the team in the Big five European leagues with which Robin Gosens has collected the most appearances (157) and scored the most goals (29) in all competitions, all under Gian Piero Gasperini. After his goals against Lecce and Juventus, he could find the net in three Serie A home matches in a row for the first time since February-March 2021, for Atalanta (against Torino, Napoli and Crotone in that case).
- Ademola Lookman has been involved in six goals in four Serie A games against Fiorentina (four goals and two assists), scoring in each of those four games; against no opponents has he been involved in more goals in the competition (Empoli also six, 5G+1A); only Alexandre Pato (between 2008 and 2011) has scored in each of his first five Serie A matches against the Viola in the three points for a win era.

**Inter - Udinese**

- Inter have won each of their last four Serie A matches against Udinese and could equal their record streak of five consecutive wins against the Bianconeri, which they have already achieved three times in the competition (between 1993 and 1996, between 2008 and 2010, between 2015 and 2017).
- Inter have won their last six home meetings against Udinese in Serie A with an aggregate of 16-2; already a record for consecutive home wins for the Nerazzurri against the Bianconeri in the competition. The last win for the Friulians at the Meazza against Inter dates back to 16 December 2017: 3-1 with goals from Kevin Lasagna, Rodrigo De Paul and Antonín Barák (Mauro Icardi scored for the Nerazzurri).
- Inter have never lost in nine previous meetings with Udinese in Serie A after an international break: five Nerazzurri wins (four of which in the last four games of this type between the two clubs) and four draws.
- Inter have won their last four games in all competitions and have not done better since the period between December 2024 and January 2025: five in that case, including a 2-0 win against Udinese at Meazza on 19 December in Coppa Italia.
- Inter have collected 64 points in 29 games played in the current Serie A and under Simone Inzaghi this is the third time in four seasons that the Nerazzurri have collected 60 or more points after the first 29 seasonal games in the competition (60 in 2021/22 and 76 in 2023/24): as many times as in the previous 12 editions of the Italian top-flight (60 in 2009/10, 64 in 2019/20 and 71 in 2020/21).
- Udinese have collected 40 points in their first 29 games of the current Serie A and the last time they managed to go over 40 points after 30 seasonal games played was in 2012/13 (42 in that case), a season they finished in fifth place.
- After a streak of six consecutive matches without defeat (W4, D2), Udinese have lost the most recent in Serie A against Hellas Verona (0-1); the Bianconeri could lose two matches in a row without scoring in a single season of the competition for the first time since May 2023 (two 0-2 against Fiorentina and Lazio in that case).
- Inter (120) and Udinese (104) are two of the three sides – together with Atalanta (111) – with the most successful open play crosses in the current Serie A. Indeed, the Milanese (13), the Bergamaschi (11) and Friulians (nine) are also the three teams with the most headed goals in the competition this season.
- Hakan Çalhanoglu has provided the joint-most assists via set pieces across the last eight seasons in the Big-5 European leagues, since he arrived in Serie A in 2017/18: 27, level with Joshua Kimmich and Dani Parejo. The Turkish midfielder has been involved in three goals in his last three Serie A games against Udinese (two goals and one assist), after not being involved in any goals in his first seven games against the Friulians in the competition.
- Lorenzo Lucca has scored 10 goals in Serie A this season – one against Inter, on September 28 – and could become the first Italian player to score more than 10 goals in a season with Udinese in the competition since Kevin Lasagna (12) in 2017/18. Furthermore, he is one of the two players with the most headed goals in the current competition (five each), along with Mateo Retegui.

**Napoli - AC Milan**

- In the last 12 Serie A meetings between Napoli and AC Milan, both sides won four games (D4), after the Partenopei had been unbeaten in each of their previous eight matches against the Rossoneri in the competition, winning six in the period.
- AC Milan are unbeaten in each of their last six away matches (W3 D3) against Napoli in all competitions and have they never gone seven successive games on the road without defeat against the Azzurri in their history.
- Napoli (61) have 14 points more than AC Milan (47) in the table: only in three of the 153 previous matches between the two sides in Serie A history have the Azzurri faced the Rossoneri with a higher advantage (+15 on February 8th, 2014; +25 on April 15th, 2018 and +23 on April 2nd, 2023).
- Only against Roma (nine) have Napoli lost more matches than against AC Milan (eight, as against Inter) after Italian national team games. Overall, Azzurri and Rossoneri have met 18 times after such games, with five wins for the Partenopei, five draws and eight wins for the Diavolo.
- Since the start of February, Napoli are winless in six of their seven Serie A matches (D5 L1): one more than in their first 22 games in the current top-flight season (D2 L3). Furthermore, with only eight points earned since the start of the 23rd matchday, the Azzurri would be 13th in the table in this period.
- AC Milan have picked up 47 points in 29 games in the current league season: since Serie A returned to 20 teams in 2004/05, only one team finished the season in the top four positions after having obtained a maximum of 47 points in the standings with nine games remaining, Sampdoria 2009/10 (fourth).
- After comeback wins against Lecce (3-2) and Como (2-1), AC Milan could win three Serie A matches in a row for the first time since last September: against Venezia, Inter and Lecce, under Paulo Fonseca.
- AC Milan and Napoli are two of the four teams to have gained the most points from losing positions in Serie A this season: 15 for the Rossoneri (along with Atalanta) and 14 for the Azzurri – Bologna first with 16.
- Since his debut in Serie A in 2019/20, Romelu Lukaku has been directly involved in eight goals (6G+2A) in 818 minutes against AC Milan in all competitions (one goal or assist every 102'): only Lautaro Martínez (10) has had a hand in more goals against the Rossoneri in the period among players in the Big five European leagues, but with 621 more minutes than the Belgian (one every 144').
- Since he joined the Rossoneri last season, Christian Pulisic (30G+17A) is one of only two Serie A players to have both scored at least 30 goals and provided at least 15 assists in all competitions, along with Ademola Lookman (35G+15A).



Hellas Verona - Parma

- Among the teams faced at least 15 times in Serie A, Parma is the one against which Hellas Verona have the highest win percentage: 53%, with 10 wins in 19 matches played so far (D3 L6).
- Hellas Verona have won their last five home matches against Parma in Serie A and could record six consecutive home wins against a single opponent in the competition for the first time in their history.
- This will be the fifth time that Hellas Verona face Parma in Serie A after an international break: after three consecutive victories for the Venetians, the Emilia-Romagna side won the most recent of these four encounters, on March 9, 2014.
- After their 1-0 win against Udinese last time out, Hellas Verona could win consecutive Serie A matches for the first time in over a year – the last time was between March 3 and March 10, 2024 (two 1-0 wins against Sassuolo and Lecce).
- Since Cristian Chivu's debut in charge of Parma on February 22 against Bologna, the Ducali have lost only one Serie A match (W1 D2), earning five points (1.25 points per game). This is the same number of points they have collected in their previous 11 matches under Fabio Pecchia (W1 D2 L8 – 0.45 points per game on average).
- Parma have earned at least 25 points in the first 29 matches of the season for the 25th time in their history considering three points for a win era: in the previous 24 instances, only once did the team fail to avoid relegation by the end of the season (in 2007/08, when they finished 19th).
- Hellas Verona are the club with the most high pressure applied in Serie A this season: 302 on average per game. On the other hand, only Monza (50.5%) have a lower percentage of touches under pressure than Parma (51.2%) in the current league season.
- Hellas Verona have registered the fewest build up attacks in Serie A this season (12). On the other hand, Parma (60) have collected the second-most direct attacks in the competition after Milan (77).
- In addition to scoring Hellas Verona's first direct free-kick goal in Serie A in the last four seasons (vs Udinese), Ondrej Duda has created the most chances from set-pieces among his teammates in the current season (11). Overall, he has registered the highest expected assists (2.1 xA), most passes completed in the opponent's box (102), and most passes completed in the final third (215) among Hellas Verona's players in this Serie A campaign.
- After scoring against Monza last time out, Ange-Yoan Bonny could find the net in consecutive Serie A games for the second time in his career, after doing so between September 2024 against Napoli and Udinese. The French player (21 years and 157 days at the time of the match) has already scored six goals in the current campaign and could become the fourth youngest foreign player to surpass this tally in a single Serie A season with Parma, after Dejan Kulusevski (20 years and 67 days), Adriano (20 years and 294 days), and Ishak Belfodil (21 years and 8 days).



Lazio - Torino

- After failing to win against Torino in five consecutive Serie A games (D4, L1), Lazio have won each of their last three meetings against the Granata and they could win four matches in a row against this opponent for the first time in the competition.
- Lazio have lost only two of their 20 home games against Torino in Serie A in the three points for a win era (W8, D10): among the opponents faced more than 15 times at home in the competition in this period, only against Sampdoria (4%) do the Biancocelesti have a lower defeat percentage than against the Granata (10%).
- After their 2-0 win in Serie A last season at Olimpico, Lazio could win two home meetings in a row without conceding against Torino for only the third time in the competition, having done so between February and October 1951 (two 3-0 wins in that case) and between November 1958 and January 1961 (2-0 and 1-0).
- Torino have lost only one of their last eight Serie A games against Lazio after an international break (W4, D3): 11th September 1994. The two teams will meet for the first time in such a game in over 16 years (the previous dates back to February 14, 2009, 1-1 at Olimpico).
- After their 0-5 defeat against Bologna in the last round of Serie A, Lazio could lose two matches in a row without scoring for the first time since November 2021 (0-2 against Juventus and 0-4 against Napoli in that case). Furthermore, the Biancocelesti have not lost consecutive matches in the competition with a margin of at least three goals since January 1985 (0-3 against Fiorentina and 1-4 against Udinese).
- Torino have won three of their last four Serie A games (D1), as many as in their previous 20 games in the competition (D8, L9). The Granata have lost just one of their 11 league games since the start of 2025 (W4, D6) and only Roma have remained unbeaten in the period in the competition (Bologna and Napoli have also lost just once).
- Only Milan (270) have completed more dribbles than Lazio (244) in the current Serie A; while only Inter (112) have completed fewer than Torino (123) in the competition this season.
- Lazio have the highest percentage of successful dribbles in Serie A 24/25 (52%), while they've attempted 162 line breaking passes of at least two opposition lines, fewer only than Como (167) and Juventus (183).
- Mattéo Guendouzi has scored two of his three goals in Serie A against Torino, on 22 February and 29 September 2024 (2-0 and 3-2 for Lazio). Among all the 2024/25 competitions, the French player is the Biancoceleste with the most minutes played (3216), the most successful passes in the final third (627), the most chances created from open play (44) and the most recoveries in the final third (16).
- Eljif Elmas (three goals) and Cesare Casadei (one goal and one assist for the 1999-born player) have been directly involved in four of Torino's last five away goals in Serie A. Since the first time they played in the same match for the Granata in the competition (on 14 February 2025 against Bologna), they have passed the ball to each other 30 times and the only player with whom they have more passes is Cristiano Biraghi (43 passes with the Macedonian and 34 with the Italian).
