



Genoa - Udinese

4 April 2025



- Genoa are unbeaten in their last six Serie A games against Udinese (W2 D4), winning the last two; only once have Genoa achieved at least three consecutive wins against the Friulians in the tournament: five between 1993 and 2008.
- Genoa and Udinese are equal in the last 10 games played at the Ferraris stadium, with two wins each and six draws, with exactly 13 goals scored each. Genoa won their most recent home game against this opponent: 2-0 on 24 February 2024.
- Genoa have kept a clean sheet in four of their last five Serie A games against Udinese, as many times as in their previous 24 games against this opponent in the competition.
- After a run of six consecutive matches without defeat (W4 D2), Udinese have lost their two most recent Serie A matches (v Hellas Verona and Inter), only once have they recorded three defeats in a row in the league under Kosta Runjaic, between October and November 2024.
- Genoa have won four of their five home Serie A games played in 2025 (D1), recording an average of 2.60 points per game, only lower in this period than Bologna (2.71), Roma (2.67) and Inter (2.67) in home matches.
- Nine of Udinese's 11 wins this season have come against teams with fewer points in the standings at the start of the matchday - however, the Friulians lost the most recent of these games, against Hellas Verona: only once in the last five seasons have they lost consecutive games against these teams, last September (but against Roma and Inter).
- Only 12% of Genoa's high turnovers in Serie A this term have ended with a shot (24 out of 199): this is the lowest ratio this term; in general, among the teams in the bottom half of the table, the Rossoblu are the ones who have started the most sequences of open play that start 40 meters or less from the opponent's goal (199).
- No team has attempted fewer shots than Genoa and Udinese during the first 15 minutes of play in Serie A this season: 38 each, level with Torino.
- Genoa striker Andrea Pinamonti, who has not scored or provided an assist in his last five league appearances, has scored four goals against Udinese in Serie A (one of which in the reverse fixture), only against Roma (5) has he scored more goals in the competition (also 4 against Bologna).
- Udinese's Oumar Solet - who scored his first goal in Serie A last time out - is the defender who has completed the most dribbles (19) since his debut in the competition (last January 4th); furthermore, he is one of the four defenders who have recovered more than 50 balls and won more than 50 duels in Serie A in 2025 (56+56), with Dodô, Theo Hernández and his next opponent Johan Vásquez (60+77).

**Monza - Como**

5 April 2025



- Following their 1-1 draw on 30 November, Como could become the first team against which Monza have drawn both their first two matches in Serie A.
- Monza are unbeaten in nine of their last 10 games against Como between Serie A, Serie B and Serie C (W5 D4); the only success of the Lariani side in the period was on 3 April 2022 in Serie B at Sinigaglia.
- Monza have avoided defeat in 11 of their last 14 games against newly-promoted teams in Serie A (W5 D6), although their last success against these teams was on 16 March 2024 (1-0 vs Cagliari) – three draws and two defeats since then.
- Como have lost their last four derbies of Lombardia and have they never recorded more defeats in a row against these teams in a single Serie A campaign (also 4 in 1951/52).
- Monza have avoided defeat in three of their five home games played in the second leg this season (W1 D2), as many times as in the entire first leg (D3 L7); however, in the last four Serie A home matches they have scored just one goal (Armando Izzo vs Parma).
- Como have won one of their last 11 away matches in Serie A – three draws and seven defeats – the only success in the period was against Fiorentina on 16 February 2025 (2-0), in the only one of these games in which they kept a clean sheet.
- Como have won most possession in the final third in Serie A this season (143) while Monza are the one that have recorded the least (62).
- Monza and Como have scored five goals from set pieces in Serie A this season; fewer than any other teams in the competition.
- Gianluca Caprari scored the first of his two goals in this Serie A season in the first leg against Como; the last time he has scored in both seasonal games against a single opponent was against Spezia in 2021/22 with Hellas Verona shirt.
- Patrick Cutrone - close to 150 appearances in Serie A – has been involved in nine goals in Serie A this season (six goals and three assists), only once has he been involved in 10+ goals in a single Serie A campaign (12 in 2017/18 with AC Milan), moreover the last Como player to score more goals in a season in the competition was Dan Corneliusson (7) and Stefano Borgonovo (10) in 1985/86 – also six goals for Nico Paz in this Serie A.

**Parma - Inter**

- Inter are unbeaten in their last six league matches against Parma (W4 D2), with the last win for the Ducali against the Nerazzurri in Serie A dating back to 15 September 2018: 1-0 at the Meazza, with Federico Dimarco's first goal of the tournament.
- Inter have won their last two league matches against Parma and only once have the Nerazzurri achieved more consecutive victories against the Emilians in Serie A: five between 2006 and 2009.
- The 18 matches played in Serie A since 2000 at the Tardini between Parma and Inter are balanced: seven wins each and four draws; the Nerazzurri have however won the last three away matches against the Ducali in the league.
- Parma are unbeaten in four of their five Serie A games under Cristian Chivu (W1 D3), as many times as in their previous 13 league games under Fabio Pecchia (W2 D2).
- Inter have failed to win in four of their last five away games in Serie A (D2 L2), after having won all their previous eight and keeping a clean sheet in seven of those.
- Inter have scored the most goals from set pieces in Serie A this season (20, 10 of which following corners – another record in the tournament, with the Gialloblu behind the Nerazzurri with eight); while only Venezia (61%) have scored more than Parma in terms of percentage from set pieces in the current championship: 40% (14 out of 35).
- Parma have attempted the fewest headed shots in Serie A this season (33), on the other hand, Inter is the team who have scored the most headed goal (13).
- Ange-Yoan Bonny has scored six goals in 29 league appearances this season: only Paul Pogba has managed to score seven goals among French players in a Serie A season before turning 22 (seven goals in both 2013/14 and 2014/15).
- Marko Arnautovic has found the net in each of his last three Serie A appearances: he has never managed to score in more games in a row in the Big-5 European leagues.
- Hakan Çalhanoglu is close to recording 200 wins in the Big-5 European leagues (currently at 199): he could become the first Turkish player to reach this milestone in the 2000s.

**Milan - Fiorentina**

- After a 2-1 win in the reverse fixture on October 6th, Fiorentina could win both of their Serie A seasonal matches against AC Milan for the first time since 2000/01.
- AC Milan and Fiorentina have only drawn one of their last 14 league encounters (1-1 on February 22nd, 2020 at Franchi), along with eight wins for the Rossoneri and five for the Viola in the period.
- AC Milan have won each of their last four league matches at Meazza against Fiorentina; the last time they won 5+ successive Serie A home games against the Viola was between 1948 and 1955 (eight in that case).
- Fiorentina will face AC Milan with more points in Serie A table at the start of the matchday for the first time since December 30th, 2017 (1-1 draw with Hakan Çalhanoglu's and Giovanni Simeone's goals); overall, the Viola have avoided defeat in four (W3 D1) of their six meetings with the Rossoneri in the top-flight when ahead in the table (W3 D1).
- AC Milan have recorded four defeats in a run of six Serie A games (W2) under a single manager for the first time since August-September 2019, under Marco Giampaolo.
- Fiorentina have earned 51 points in Serie A this season and should they win the Viola could gain 54 points in their first 31 top-flight seasonal games for the second time in the last 15 years, after 2015/16: 56 in that case when they ended in 5th place.
- Fiorentina have scored an average of one goal for every 17 corners in Serie A in 2024/25 (seven goals and 118 corners): the best ratio in the the top-flight this season; on the other hand, AC Milan have netted an average of one goal for every 59 corners, which is better only than Lecce (one for every 62) and Empoli (one for every 65).
- Fiorentina have not conceded a goal in the first 15 minutes of play in their first 30 Serie A seasonal games for the third time in their top-flight history, after 1955/56 and 1981/82 (both seasons ended without conceding any in this period).
- Christian Pulisic (nine goals scored and six assists provided in Serie A this season) could become the second American player to reach double figures for goals in two different seasons in the big five European leagues in the 2000s (12 goals in 2023/24), after Clint Dempsey.
- Moise Kean currently has 199 appearances and 99 wins in the big five European leagues. The Fiorentina striker could become the third player born in the 2000s to be directly involved in at least 20 goals in a single Serie A season (16G+3A), after Dusan Vlahovic (in three different top-flight seasons) and Khvicha Kvaratskhelia.

**Lecce - Venezia**

- Lecce are unbeaten in five games against Venezia in Serie A (W3 D2), while only against Monza (six) have they played more matches without losing in the top flight.
- Lecce have won their last two matches against Venezia in Serie A (last 25th November and 30th March 2002); only against Brescia (between 2004 and 2010) and Reggina (between 2000 and 2004) have the Apulians achieved at least three consecutive successes in their history in the top division (four against both).
- Lecce have won both matches at "Via del Mare" against Venezia in Serie A: on 30th March 2002 and 28th November 1999 (both 2-1). Furthermore, between Serie A and Serie B (including playoffs) the Salento side have avoided defeat in 12 of their 14 home matches against this opponent (W7 D5), losing only the first two home matches (between 1930 and 1931 in Serie B).
- Venezia have won just three of their first 30 games in a Serie A season for only the second time in the competition, after 2001/02, when they also lost their 31st match of that campaign.
- Lecce are unbeaten in each of their last 11 Serie A games against opponents in the bottom two positions at the start of the matchday (W6 D5), and have won four of their most recent five (D1).
- Venezia have scored just one goal through their last seven Serie A games (D4 L3) for the first time since the first seven matchdays of 1998/99; furthermore, they have managed just one win across a span of 20 games in the top-flight (D9 L10) for the first time since May 2022.
- Among teams currently in Serie A, Lecce are the one with the longest ongoing streak of consecutive defeats in the top flight (5). The last time they lost six games in a row in the tournament dates back to April 2023.
- Lecce (5.9%) and Venezia (7.7%) are the two teams who have recorded the lowest conversion rate in Serie A this season: out of 653 shots attempted by the two teams together (354 and 299 respectively), only 44 have been converted into goals (21 and 23 respectively).
- Between goals and assists, Nikola Krstovic has been involved in 61% of Lecce's goals in Serie A this season (10 goals and three assists compared to 21 Giallorossi's goals); the highest share of any player for their team.
- Among players who have played at least 40 games in Serie A in the three points for a win era, Christian Gytkjær is the one who has recorded the highest percentage of them as a substitute: 89% (39 out of 44). Furthermore, the two goals scored in this championship by the Danish striker have come as a substitute, while no player has ever scored more goals from the bench for Venezia from 1994/95 onwards.

**Empoli - Cagliari**

- After the 2-0 in the reverse fixture on last 20 September, Empoli could win two games in a row against Cagliari for the first time in Serie A.
- The last 12 matches between Empoli and Cagliari in Serie A have seen both sides record the same number of victories: four wins each and four draws, with 14 goals scored by both teams.
- Cagliari are unbeaten in their last two away games (W1 D1) against Empoli in Serie A, after having lost six of the first seven games on the road against them in the top-flight (W1).
- Empoli have not won any of their last 15 league games (D4 L11) - their last win dates back to 8 December away to Hellas Verona (4-1) – and could equal their longest streak of consecutive games without a win in Serie A: 16 matches in a row between December 2021 and April 2022, under Aurelio Andreazzoli.
- Empoli have lost six of their last seven home league games (D1), including the three most recent ones without scoring; only once have the Tuscans suffered four defeats in a row in Serie A, between June and September 2023 (in that case they also remained without scoring in that run).
- After the 3-0 win against Monza, Cagliari could win two consecutive matches in Serie A for the first time since March 2024, with Claudio Ranieri as coach (against Empoli and then Salernitana).
- Cagliari have won just one of their last 12 league away games (D4 L7) - 2-1 against Monza on 5 January - losing the two most recent ones; the Sardinians have not suffered at least three consecutive away defeats in Serie A since November and December 2023 (a run of four).
- Empoli are both the team that have conceded the most goals (27) in the last half hour of play in Serie A this term, and the team that has scored the fewest goals (4) in the last 30 minutes of the game.
- Last time out against Como, Christian Kouamé scored in Serie A for the first time since 21 April 2024 (for Fiorentina against Salernitana). He could score in two consecutive games in the competition for the first time since April 2023 (v Sampdoria and Monza in that case, also with Fiorentina).
- Nicolas Viola has scored two goals in his last three league games, as many as in his previous 23 Serie A matches. Furthermore, only one of his last seven goals in the top-flight has been scored away from home: against Inter, on 14 April 2024.



Torino - Hellas Verona

6 April 2025



- Torino are unbeaten in their last 11 matches against Hellas Verona in Serie A (W5 D6) and only against Mantov do the Granata have a longer active unbeaten streak in the top-flight (14 games).
- Torino have won their last two matches against Hellas Verona in Serie A; only once before have the Granata recorded three wins in a row against the Scaligeri in the competition, doing so between 1969 and 1970.
- Seven of the last nine Serie A matches played between Torino and Hellas Verona at Olimpico Grande Torino have ended in a draw (78%), with each side picking up one win each. Of fixtures to be played at least four times since 2013-14, that is the highest rate of draws by two teams at a specific venue in the competition.
- Since the start of 2025, Torino would be 7th in the Serie A table with 19 points won from 12 games (W4 D7 L1), level with Fiorentina; meanwhile this calendar year, no team has drawn more games than the Granata in the competition (7 - level with Venezia).
- Torino have won three of their last four home League matches (D1), as many as across their previous 14 (W3 D7 L4); furthermore, the Granata could win three home games in a row in Serie A for the first time since doing so between November and December 2023.
- Hellas Verona have kept a clean sheet in each of their last two Serie A matches and the Scaligeri could record three clean sheets in a row in the competition for the first time since doing so between March and April 2000 (4 in a row under Cesare Prandelli).
- Only Napoli (11) have conceded fewer home goals than Torino in Serie A this season (12 - level with Milan); however only four teams (Empoli, Monza, Lecce and Venezia) have scored fewer home goals than the Granata in the top-flight this season (13 - level with Hellas Verona).
- Hellas Verona are the team that has received both the joint-most yellow cards (68 - level with Monza) and the most red cards (8) in Serie A this season.
- Vanja Milinkovic-Savic has recorded at least three more home clean sheets across the last two campaigns in the big five European leagues than any other goalkeeper (18).
- Three of the four players that have scored the most goals as a substitute in Serie A this season could feature in this game: Daniel Mosquera (five), Gvidas Gineitis (3) and Ché Adams (3) (Pedro also 5).



Atalanta - Lazio

6 April 2025



- Atalanta have won 38 of their 113 matches against Lazio in Serie A (D43 L32), a joint-record in terms of wins for them in the competition (also 38 against Bologna).
- The last nine matches between Atalanta and Lazio in Serie A have seen three wins each and three draws. Meanwhile after the 1-1 draw in the reverse fixture in December 2024, the two teams could draw both of their Serie A meetings in a campaign for the first time since 2021/22.
- In the last 11 matches between Atalanta and Lazio played in Bergamo in Serie A, 41 goals have been scored at an average of 3.7 goals per game (21 for the Lombardy team and 20 for the Capitoline club).
- Atalanta have lost their last two league games without scoring and only twice under Gian Piero Gasperini have they suffered three consecutive defeats in Serie A, doing so in November 2022 and in April 2022. However, the last time the Dea lost three consecutive matches to nil in the top-flight was back between September and October 2014 under Stefano Colantuono (4 in a row).
- After a streak of six consecutive wins at the Gewiss Stadium in Serie A between October and December 2024, Atalanta have since failed to win any of their last six home games (D4 L2); only once under Gian Piero Gasperini have they gone seven consecutive home games without a win in Serie A, doing so between March and August 2022 (D4 L3 in that case).
- Atalanta have failed to score in their last three league games at the Gewiss Stadium and only five times in their Serie A history have they gone four consecutive home matches without finding the net, most recently between November and December 2004.
- Lazio have won only one of their last six league games (2-1 against AC Milan on 2nd March), gaining just two points from their most recent three matches (D2 L1); the last time the Biancocelesti went four consecutive matches without a win in Serie A was back in July 2020 (5 in a row).
- Lazio have scored the most goals (25) in the final 30 minutes of play in Serie A this season, though Atalanta have conceded the fewest goals (3) in that same period. Furthermore, the Biancocelesti also rank first for goals scored (6) in injury time of games, but the Dea haven't yet conceded a goal after the 90th minute.
- After having been directly involved in 10 goals (5 goals and 5 assists) in the first 16 games of the current league season, Charles De Ketelaere has since not been involved in a single goal across the last 13 Serie A games. In 2025, only Tomáš Suslov has been involved in more shots (28) without scoring or providing an assist in the competition than the Belgian (23 - 16 shots and 7 chances created).
- In 2025 only Lautaro Martínez (77) has recorded more touches in the opposition box than Gustav Isaksen (67) in Serie A. The Danish winger has scored three goals in the current league season, a joint-record for him in a single Serie A campaign (also 3 in 2023/24).



Roma - Juventus

6 April 2025



- Roma and Juventus have drawn their last two league games and could draw three Serie A games in a row for the first time since December 1983-March 1985 (run of four). Furthermore, after the 0-0 draw in the reverse fixture in September, the two teams could draw both Serie A matches for the first time since 2000-01.
- Juventus are unbeaten in eight (W4 D4) of their last nine league games against Roma, with the Giallorossi's only win in that period in the top-flight coming in March 2023 (1-0 at the Olimpico), thanks to Gianluca Mancini's goal.
- Roma are unbeaten in eight (W4 D4) of their last 10 Serie A home games against Juventus, finding the net in nine of those games at the Olimpico (16 goals for the Giallorossi in this period).
- Juventus and Roma will meet with a maximum three-point difference in the second half of a Serie A season for the first time since MD21 of the top-flight in 2021-22. Indeed, in that instance, in January 2022, the Bianconeri had three more points than the Giallorossi at the start of the game and won 4-3 at the Olimpico, after trailing 3-1. In fact, that was the last time the Piemontesi won a league match after trailing by at least two goals.
- Roma have won their last seven league games and have only won 8+ matches in a row in their Serie A history on four occasions, with each of those coming since 2005-06; the last one between January-March 2016 (eight under Luciano Spalletti).
- Roma have kept a clean sheet in six of their last seven league games (conceding only one goal in this period, from Como's Lucas da Cunha); as many clean sheets as they collected (6) in their first 23 games in Serie A this season. Furthermore, the Giallorossi could keep a clean sheet in four successive games in a single Serie A season for the first time since February-March 2014, under Rudi Garcia.
- Igor Tudor won his first match as Juventus manager against Genoa last time out; only three times has a single coach won both of his first two games replacing another manager in the same season in Juventus' Serie A history: Ciro Ferrara in May 2009, Carlo Ancelotti in February 1999 and Teobaldo Depetrini between April-May 1957.
- Juventus (17) and Roma (18) have both conceded the fewest goals from open play in Serie A in 2024-25.
- Mile Svilar and Michele Di Gregorio (both 12, along with Yann Sommer) are two of the three goalkeepers to have kept the joint-most clean sheets in Serie A this season. In 2025, only Augsburg's Finn Dahmen has both recorded a higher save percentage and kept more clean sheets (90% and 8) than Mile Svilar (85.4% and 7) in the big five European leagues.
- After scoring against Genoa last time out, Juventus' Kenan Yildiz could find the net in successive games for the first time in Serie A. Indeed, he equalled Moise Kean as the player with the most goals scored (both 7) for Juventus in the top-flight before turning 20 in the three points for a win era (since 1994-95).

**Bologna - Napoli**

- Napoli have scored the most goals against Bologna in Serie A (197). The Partenopei have won 50 of their 131 Serie A matches against the Rossoblu (D39 L42), only against Lazio (54), Fiorentina (54) and Torino (52) have they achieved more wins in the competition.
- Napoli haven't lost in nine of their last 10 league matches (W6 D3) against Bologna; the only wins for the Emilians in that period arrived in May 2024 (2-0 at the Maradona Stadium).
- Bologna have won just one of their last eight games (D3 L4) at the Dall'Ara Stadium against Napoli in Serie A (3-2 in May 2019 under Sinisa Mihajlovic, with a brace by Federico Santander and a goal by Blerim Dzemaili), drawing the two most recent ones.
- Bologna have won their last five league games; only three times previously have the Emilians recorded more consecutive wins in their history in Serie A - six between February and March 2024 under Thiago Motta; six between April and May 1967 under Luis Carniglia and 10 between November 1963 and February 1964 under Fulvio Bernardini.
- Bologna have won six consecutive league games at the Dall'Ara Stadium; the last time the Rossoblù won more home games in a row in Serie A was between March and August 2019 (8 under Sinisa Mihajlovic).
- In 2025, Bologna have scored the most goals (25) in Serie A; in addition, only Roma have picked up more points (32) than the Emilians (28 in 13 matches – W8 D4 L1) in the competition.
- After a win against Milan in their most recent match, Napoli could win at least two league games in a row for the first time since between December 2024 and January 2025 (run of 7). Furthermore, the last away win in Serie A for the Partenopei was in January 2025 against Atalanta (D3 L1 since).
- Bologna and Napoli have faced the fewest shots both in total (262 for the Rossoblù and 296 for the Azzurri) and on target (83 for the Emilians and 85 for the Partenopei) in Serie A this season.
- Riccardo Orsolini - who equalled his record of goals (11, as in 2022-23) in a single Serie A season - is the Italian player with the most goals in the last three seasons in Serie A (32 goals for him since 2022-23). However, Napoli are the opponent he has played the most matches against (11) without scoring or providing an assist in the top-flight.
- Romelu Lukaku has scored five goals in five games against Bologna in Serie A, with the Belgian scoring on average a goal every 81 minutes against the Rossoblu; only against Benevento (every 37 minutes – 4 goals in 2 matches) does he have a better mins/goal rate in the competition. In addition, in 2025 only Mateo Retegui (11) has been involved in more goals than the Napoli striker in Serie A (9 - 5 goals, 4 assists).
