

**Lecce – Como**

19 April 2025



- Among the teams against whom Como have never lost in Serie A, Lecce are the one they have faced the most: four wins and a draw for the Lariani.
- Como have faced Lecce twice away from home in Serie A, between 1985 and 1989: a 4-1 away victory in the first match and a 0-0 draw in the most recent one.
- In the last seven league matchdays, Lecce have won only one point, thanks to the draw against Venezia on the weekend of 21-23 February; in the top-5 European Leagues only Montpellier (7) have suffered more defeats than Lecce (6 – equal with Leicester, Monza, Real Valladolid and Southampton).
- Lecce have failed to score in five of their last seven home league games; in the top-5 European Leagues in 2025 only Leicester City (6) have failed to score in more home games than the Giallorossi (5 – same as Alavés, Hellas Verona and Venezia).
- For the third time in Serie A this season, Como have won two consecutive games; the Lariani have not achieved three consecutive successes in Serie A since the period between May and June 1952 (a run of three).
- Como won their last away game in Serie A (3-1 v Monza) and in the competition only once have they achieved at least two consecutive away successes, in 1950 (3).
- According to the Expected Points model, Como should have 46 points in this championship, while in reality they have only earned 36; the only team with a higher difference is Monza (14 points earned less than the model).
- Lecce (43) and Como (42, level with Lazio) are two of the three teams that have attempted the most shots from high turnovers in Serie A this season; the Lariani (5) have scored four more goals than the Salento team (1) from these situations.
- All five goals scored by Federico Baschirotto in Serie A have been headers (3 in 2022/23 and 2 this season); since his debut in Serie A, among the defenders, only Bremer (7) has scored more such goals – the Lecce defender, moreover, has scored in two appearances in a row for the first time in the competition.
- Among players with at least five goals and five assists in Serie A this term, Nico Paz (8 September 2004 – 6G+5A) is the youngest; the last Como midfielder to score more than the Argentine in a single season in the top-flight was Angelo Turconi (8) in 1951-52.



## Monza - Napoli

19 April 2025



- Napoli have scored at least two goals in three games against Monza in Serie A (10 goals in total), failing to score in the other two; only Atalanta (five) and Inter (four) have scored at least two goals in more matches against the Brianzoli in the competition.
- Monza have scored two goals in both their home games against Napoli in Serie A (W1 D1); the Partenopei could become the first team to concede at least two goals in three different away games against the Brianzoli in the top-flight.
- Since their first home game in Serie A, on 13 August 2022, Monza have lost 24 home matches (W14 D16); in this period only Hellas Verona (26) have suffered more defeats at home in the competition – 24 home defeats also for Empoli.
- Monza have lost 21 games in the current league season (W2 D9); among the teams that have suffered more than 21 defeats in a season in Serie A, only six avoided the relegation, the last being Sampdoria and Spezia in 2021/22.
- Since February 2025 Napoli have drawn six of 10 league games (W3 D1); in this period, the Azzurri played out the most draws in Serie A, losing six points compared to Inter (15 vs 21).
- Napoli haven't won in their last five away games in Serie A (D4 L1) and under one manager the last time they registered more away matches without winning was back in 2009 under Roberto Donadoni: 10, six of which in 2008/09 and four in 2009/10.
- Monza have scored the joint-fewest headed goals in Serie A this season (two, level with Hellas Verona); the Brianzoli have also conceded the most goals by headers (17) – on the other hand, Napoli are the only club with zero headed goals conceded in Serie A in 2024/25.
- Napoli have conceded the most goals from outside the box in Serie A this season (nine); this figure represents 36% of the goals conceded in total by the Partenopei (9/25), the worst percentage in the Big-5 European leagues in 2024/25.
- Dany Mota (5 goals and 2 assists) has already been involved in seven goals in this Serie A campaign – his joint-best total in a single season in the competition (seven also in 2023/24). With one more goal, he could both score more than one home goal against the same opponent in Serie A for the first time in his career (he already netted against Napoli at the U-Power Stadium on May 14, 2023) and set a new personal record for goals in a single Italian top-flight campaign (five also in 2022/23).
- Scott McTominay has scored eight goals in Serie A this season, surpassing his previous record for goals in a single campaign in the Big-5 European leagues (seven in 2023/24 for Manchester United) – five of his goals arrived when the score was 0-0, while he is the midfielder with the most opening goals in Serie A in 2024/25.

**Roma - Hellas Verona**

- Hellas Verona have won four of their last nine games against Roma in Serie A, including one awarded win in 2020 (D1 L4), as many wins as they achieved in their previous 46 games against the Giallorossi in the competition (D15 L27).
- Roma are unbeaten in 27 home games against Hellas Verona in Serie A (W21 D6); only against Atalanta and Bari (30) have the Giallorossi had a longer unbeaten run at home in the competition.
- Roma are unbeaten in their last 16 league games, thanks to 11 wins and five draws, and have not done better in a single championship since the end of the 2015/16 season, when under Luciano Spalletti they went 17 unbeaten.
- Roma have collected 23 points, thanks to seven wins and two draws, in their last nine home Serie A games, after having collected just 13 in the previous nine (W4 D1 L4).
- Hellas Verona have drawn each of their last three league games, after having won three and lost four in their previous seven; the Gialloblù have not drawn more consecutive games in the competition since the period between May and October 2000, when they had four.
- Hellas Verona's last four first halves away from home in Serie A have ended 0-0; the Gialloblù have had more consecutive first halves away from home without a goal for or against since 1990 (five in that case).
- Roma have scored nine goals from outside the box in Serie A this season, including one on the last matchday against Lazio; no team have done better in the 2024/25 in Serie A (nine also Atalanta and Fiorentina).
- Hellas Verona have conceded the most goals both in the first quarter of an hour of the match (10) and in the first half hour (25); in percentage terms, they have conceded 61% of their goals in the first half (36/59), the most in the current Serie A campaign.
- Matías Soulé, who scored in the last matchday, has scored twice against Hellas Verona in Serie A and has only done better against Cagliari (three); the Giallorossi player has not scored in two consecutive games in the competition since the period between December 2023 and January 2024, when the first of the two goals was against Lazio.
- Lorenzo Montipò has kept eight clean sheets in the 2024/25 Serie A season – matching his personal best in a single campaign (also eight in 2023/24). Only two Hellas Verona goalkeepers have recorded more clean sheets in a top-flight season during the three points for a win era: Marco Silvestri in 2019/20 (nine) and Sébastien Frey in 1999/00 (12).



## Empoli - Venezia

20 April 2025



- Among the teams against which they have never lost in Serie A, Venezia have faced Empoli most often (five times – W2 D3).
- In the nine matches in Serie A and Serie B between Empoli and Venezia at the Tuscans' home, both teams have always scored: 35 goals in total, at an average of 3.9 per match.
- Empoli have never played a Serie A match on Easter Sunday, while Venezia have already done so on six occasions, obtaining one win, one draw and four defeats (one of those defeats was an awarded game, on 24 March 1940 against Milan, after the match had ended with a score of 0-0).
- Empoli have earned nine points at home and 15 away in this championship and they have the largest difference between points won in home and away games in the Serie A 2024-25 (6).
- Empoli's last win in Serie A dates back to 8 December against Hellas Verona; since then the Tuscans have collected five points with five draws and 12 defeats; in this period no team has done worse in Serie A (Monza also won five points).
- After a run of eight draws and six defeats, Venezia won their last Serie A match, 1-0 against Monza; the Lagunari have not achieved two consecutive victories in the competition since November 2021, against Roma and Bologna in that case.
- If only the goals scored by Italian players in all matches of Serie A this season were considered, Empoli would have 31 more points than they currently have (55 v 24), the highest such difference among all teams in Serie A in 2024-25, and they would be in third position behind Fiorentina and Atalanta in the standing.
- Venezia have lost the most points from leading situations in this championship (26); considering the three points for a win era, the Lagunari have only lost more in 1999/2000 (28).
- Giuseppe Pezzella is, along with Tino Anjorin, one of two Empoli players with the most assists in Serie A this season; the defender has provided three assists in the Serie A in 2024-25, as many as between 2021-22 and 2023-24, and only in 2020-21 (4) has he done better in a single season in the top division.
- In Serie A this season, Mikael Ellertsson has scored two goals and provided two assists, with three of his involvements being in away games; the only exception is the assist last time out against Monza – the Venezia winger has never been involved in a goal in consecutive appearances in Serie A.



## Bologna - Inter

- Inter have won 75 of their 155 Serie A matches against Bologna (D37 L43), with only Juventus (79) having won more games against the Rossoblu in the competition.
- Bologna have not played a Serie A match on Easter since 1978 (draw against Fiorentina) and they have already met Inter four times on this holiday, with a record of two wins for each team.
- Having won five and drawn one of their previous six matches, Bologna lost their most recent Serie A match (0-2 v Atalanta) and they have not suffered two defeats in a row in the competition since January 2023 (v Roma and Atalanta).
- After a run of eight consecutive away wins with seven clean sheets, Inter have only won once in their last six away games in Serie A in 2024/25 (D3 L2), keeping just one clean sheet in the process; considering their last six away games in the competition, nine teams have won more points than the Nerazzurri.
- Inter (72) have surpassed the 70-goal mark after 32 Serie A matches for only the third time in the last 60 years, after 2021-22 (71) and last season (77) – after 33 games, however, the Nerazzurri have only done better last season (79) since 1960.
- Bologna have won the most points from losing positions in this league season (17), but Inter have never lost a game after leading (W21 D5) – in the three-point-for-a-win era, the Rossoblu have won more such points only twice (20 in 2022-23 and 19 in 2019-20).
- Inter have scored 15 goals from crosses in Serie A this season (including one last time out against Cagliari), more than any other team; the Nerazzurri were also first in this ranking in the Serie A in 2023-24, with 19 goals.
- In this championship Dan Ndoye has scored eight goals, seven of which were in home games, including five in his last four such matches; the last Bologna player to score in five consecutive home games in Serie A was Giuseppe Signori between January and May 1999 (six in that case).
- Marko Arnautovic - who played 54 games for Bologna in Serie A, scoring 24 goals - has scored four goals in this championship, but none away from home; with 13 total appearances, the Nerazzurri striker is just one goal away from the goals he scored in the entirety of last season (5 goals, but in 27 games played).
- Without Federico Dimarco's seven assists, Inter would have eight points fewer in this championship; the Nerazzurri winger is in fact the player who has brought the most points to his team thanks to his assists - with the assist delivered last time out against Cagliari, he surpassed his seasonal such record in the top division (6 in 2023/24).



## Milan - Atalanta

20 April 2025



- After remaining unbeaten in five consecutive games (W4 D1), Milan have lost two of their last three Serie A games (D1) against Atalanta and could suffer two consecutive defeats against the Bergamo club for the first time in the top-flight since May 2014-January 2015 (with Clarence Seedorf first and Filippo Inzaghi then on the bench).
- Milan have lost only one of their last 13 home games (W8 D4) in the second half of the Serie A season against Atalanta - the one on 30 March 2008 (1-2) – while the last Rossoneri coach to have suffered a defeat in his first match at the Meazza against the Nerazzurri in the second half of the top flight was Nils Liedholm, in April 1978 (0-1).
- Atalanta have not played on Easter Sunday in Serie A since 1978 (defeated against Inter); on that same date, Milan won what is now their last match on this day (2-0 against Pescara). The Rossoneri and the Bergamo team have never faced each other on this holiday in the competition.
- It will be only the second time that Milan have faced Atalanta with at least 10 points fewer in the standings at the start of the day in a Serie A season (61 currently for the Bergamo team and 51 for the Rossoneri); in fact, in all the previous 127 meetings between the two teams, this has only happened once so far: on matchday 36 of the 2019/20 championship (-15 in that case) which ended 1-1, at the Meazza.
- In their last eight home league games, Milan have kept just one clean sheet (in the 1-0 win against Hellas Verona last February); in their first eight home games of the current season, however, the Rossoneri had collected six clean sheet, the most of any side in the period.
- After 12 consecutive unbeaten away games (W9 D3), Atalanta lost their last away game against Fiorentina (0-1) and could suffer two consecutive defeats away from the Gewiss Stadium for only the second time this season (the first last August); however, the Bergamo side are the team that have collected the most points away from home in the 2024/25 in Serie A (33, W10 D3 L3), fewer than only Liverpool (35), PSG (36) and Barcelona (36) in the current Big-5 European leagues.
- Milan and Atalanta are two of the three teams that have gained the most points from losing situations in this championship: 16 for the Rossoneri and 15 for the Bergamo team, both behind only Bologna at the top with 17 points.
- Considering only goals scored after the 60th minute, Atalanta would be first in the standings with 62 points: 10 ahead of the second (Napoli with 52), and 12 ahead of Milan with 50 points, together with Roma, Fiorentina and Bologna.
- Tijjani Reijnders, with 10 goals, all from open play in this Serie A, has become the second Dutch player to score double figures for Milan in a single season in the competition after Marco Van Basten (five times - 1988/89, 1989/90, 1990/91, 1991/92 and 1992/93). Among midfielders in the big-5 European leagues who have scored all their goals from open play, only Jamal Musiala (12/12) has more than the Rossoneri this season (10/10, like Hamed Traorè).
- Mateo Retegui has been involved in 28 goals in this Serie A season (23 goals and five assists): only Mohamed Salah (45), Harry Kane and Omar Marmoush (both 30) have done better than him in the big-5 European leagues in 2024/25; furthermore, the only Atalanta player to have scored more in a single season in the top-flight was Filippo Inzaghi in 1996/97 (24).



## Torino - Udinese

21 April 2025



- Torino have won six of their last seven games (D1) against Udinese in the second half of the Serie A season, keeping a clean sheet in each of these victories, as many clean sheets as the Granata had in their previous 18 matches against the Friulians in the second half of the season.
- After six consecutive defeats in Serie A between 2003 and 2008 against Udinese, Torino have lost the same number of matches against the Friulians across the following 26 in the top-flight (W14 D6): the last defeat dates to 6 February 2022 (0-2 at the Bluenergy Stadium).
- Udinese have failed to score in 18 of their 39 Serie A games played away to Torino, or in 46% of their away games: only against Parma (48%) and Atalanta (49%) have the Friulians done worse in terms of away goals in the topflight (min. 15 away games).
- Torino have not lost any of their seven games (W3 D4) at the Olimpico Grande Torino in 2025; the Granata team could remain unbeaten in their first eight home games of a calendar year in Serie A for the first time since 2017, under Sinisa Mihajlovic (six draws, two wins in that case).
- Torino have conceded just 13 goals in their 15 home games this season: only Napoli have conceded fewer in home games (11 goals). Furthermore, since the Granata returned to Serie A (in 2012/13), only in 2014/15 (12) and 2023/24 (eight) have they conceded fewer at home in the tournament at this point in the season.
- Udinese have lost each of their last four league games, with an overall score of 1-8; the Friulians could suffer five consecutive defeats in a single Serie A tournament for the first time since February-April 2018: 11 defeats in a row in that case, with Massimo Oddo as coach.
- Torino have conceded 11 headed goals in Serie A this season (only fewer than Monza with 17); however, only two of these have come at home: the last one in November against the Brianza team. On the other hand, Udinese have scored nine goals via headers (only fewer than Atalanta with 11 and Inter with 14): one of these against the Granata in the first leg (Lorenzo Lucca).
- Torino move the ball forward slowly; indeed, the Granata have a direct speed of 1.55 meters per second: the lowest among the teams in the current championship.
- After his goal against Hellas Verona, Eljif Elmas could score in consecutive home matches for the first time in 74 Serie A home games, since January 2023, with the first of these two matches (both with the Napoli shirt) against Udinese.
- Lorenzo Lucca is the youngest player (September 2000) to have reached double figures for goals in this championship; however, the Udinese striker has not scored in six Serie A games (his last goal was in February against Lecce) and has only once gone more games in a row without scoring in the tournament: nine between January and March 2024.





## Cagliari - Fiorentina

21 April 2025



- Cagliari are winless in their last eight games (D3 L5) against Fiorentina in Serie A and they have failed to score in six of those, including the reverse game; the last Rossoblu win against the Viola in the top-flight was in November 2019 (5-2 at Unipol Domus).
- Fiorentina have won each of their last three matches against Cagliari in Serie A and they could register four wins in a row against the Rossoblu for the first time in the competition.
- Cagliari have won 18 of their 42 home games (D17 L7) against Fiorentina in Serie A: only against Sampdoria have the Sardinians collected more home wins (20/36) in the top flight.
- Cagliari won their last match played at Unipol Domus against Monza without conceding goal (3-0); the Rossoblu could win consecutive home games for the first time in Serie A since October-November 2023 and two home wins in a row without conceding goal for the first time in the top-flight since April 2017.
- Fiorentina haven't conceded a goal in four of their last six league games, after they kept only one clean sheet in their previous 12 Serie A matches; in addition, the Viola could draw three games in a row for the second time under Raffaele Palladino in Serie A, after the first three matches of the current league season.
- After four consecutive away wins, Fiorentina have won only one of their last eight away games (D2 L5) in Serie A, picking up five points in total (W1 D2): in the period (since mid-December 2024), only Parma (four), Empoli (three) and Monza (zero) have gained fewer points than the Viola on the road (five, like Venezia) in Serie A.
- Cagliari are one of four teams to have picked up more points in 2025 than they had gained from the start of the league season to December: 16 - 14 for the Sardinians, also Roma (34/20), Bologna (29/28) and Genoa (20/19).
- Fiorentina have taken 18<sup>th</sup> – most corners taken in Serie A this season: 124, only more than Venezia (115) and Monza (114) and 33 fewer than Cagliari (157); however, the Viola have the joint-highest corners/goal on average in the current league season: one goal for every 18 corners (level with Inter).
- All six assists provided by Tommaso Augello in the current league season have been via crosses; in the last 20 Serie A campaigns (since 2005/06), only one Cagliari player has provided more assists in a single season following a cross: Andrea Cossu in 2009/10 (seven), 2010/11 (eight) and 2012/13 (eight).
- After scoring two goals in his first two Serie A games against Cagliari, Moise Kean hasn't been involved in a goal in each of his last three matches against them; he has been involved in 20 goals in the current league season (17G+3A): the last Italian Viola player to have more in a single Serie A campaign was Alberto Gilardino (21 in 2008/09).





## Genoa - Lazio

21 April 2025



- After a run of eight consecutive victories in Serie A, Genoa have won only three of their last 17 games against Lazio in the top-flight, losing 11 (D3); only against Juventus, Roma and Inter have the Ligurians suffered more defeats (12 against all three) in this period in the competition (since 2015-16).
- In the last 10 Serie A seasons (since 2015-16), Lazio have scored 39 goals in 17 games against Genoa; an average of 2.3 goals per match: a record for the Biancocelesti against a single opponent over this period.
- Genoa have lost four of their last six home games (W1 D1) against Lazio in Serie A, including the two most recent ones, as many defeats as those suffered by the Ligurians against the Biancocelesti in the previous 12 home matches (W4 D4).
- Since Patrick Vieira's arrival (from MD13), Genoa have won 29 points in 20 games (W7 D8 L5) and would be ninth in the standings - in the era of three points for a win (since 1994-95), the Frenchman is the Genoa coach with the highest points average (1.45 per match) in the competition.
- In 2025, Genoa are one of the six teams unbeaten at home in Serie A, thanks to five wins and one draw: as many wins by the Rossoblu as in their 23 previous home matches (D11 L7). Indeed, in this period, the Ligurian team have conceded the fewest goals at home (2).
- Lazio won their last league away game against Atalanta without conceding (1-0) and they could win two consecutive away matches without conceding for the first time since their last two games on the road of the 2022-23 season under Maurizio Sarri.
- Lazio have scored 16 goals via substitutes, with the last two coming away from home against Milan and Atalanta; only Barcelona (17) and Atlético Madrid (19) have scored more goals via substitutes in the big five European leagues in 2024-25 (Bayern Munich and PSG also have 16).
- Lazio have scored 18 goals in the final 15 minutes in Serie A this season, with six coming after the 90th minute, both of which are the most in Serie A this season.
- All three of Fabio Miretti's goals in this Serie A campaign have come in home matches. The Genoa midfielder has also provided three assists, as many as he had delivered across the 2021-22 to 2023-24 seasons combined. Among midfielders with at least three goals and three assists in the Italian top-flight this season, only Nico Paz (born in 2004 - 6 goals, 5 assists) is younger than him.
- Alessio Romagnoli's first goal and first red card in Serie A both came against Genoa, in March 2013 with Roma and in September 2015 with Milan; the Lazio defender has scored twice in his last four games - as many as in his previous 95 matches in the competition - and he could find the net in two consecutive games in the competition for the first time since October-November 2018, with the first of those two goals coming against the Ligurians.



## Parma - Juventus

21 April 2025



- Parma have won only one of their last 15 Serie A matches (D4 L10) against Juventus, 1-0 at the Tardini in April 2015 (with Josè Mauri scoring the decisive goal). Furthermore, the Emilians have conceded 97 goals against the Bianconeri in the competition, only against Roma have they conceded more (100).
- Parma drew the reverse game against Juventus this season (2-2); the Ducali could avoid defeat in both Serie A matches against the Bianconeri for the first time in the competition since 2010-11 (W2).
- Juventus have won their last three away games against Parma in Serie A - already a record for the Bianconeri in the top-flight. Indeed, it is the longest ongoing streak of consecutive away wins for the Bianconeri among side in Serie A this season (three also against Como and Udinese).
- Among the teams in the bottom half of the table, only Como have won more points (17) than Parma (16) against opponents currently in the top half of the table; furthermore, the Gialloblù have remained unbeaten in each of the last four of these matches (draw against Fiorentina, Inter, Torino and win against Bologna).
- Parma have drawn each of their last five league games and could draw six successive Serie A games for the first time in their history (five also between April and May 2019).
- Juventus have won eight of their 13 games in the second half of the season in Serie A (D2 L3), already three more than they did in the second half of last season (W5 D10 L4) and just one win fewer than Roma and Inter, who have the joint-most wins in the second half of this Serie A season (9).
- The team that has scored the highest percentage of goals following a corner in this Serie A season (Parma with 22%, 8/37) will face the team that has conceded the highest percentage of goals from corners (Juventus with 20%, 6/30).
- Juventus have made 136 substitutions (like Milan) in Serie A this season, only Napoli have made fewer (132); on the other hand, Parma have used 157 (level with Como and Venezia), fewer only than Inter (159) in Serie A in 2024-25.
- Among defenders with at least four goals scored, only Monaco's Thilo Kehrer has so far taken fewer shots to score (one goal every 2.5 total shots) than Enrico Delprato (one goal every three total shots) in the big five European leagues in 2024-25.
- After failing to find the back of the net in any of his first 12 Serie A games against newly promoted sides, Dusan Vlahovic has now scored 17 goals in the 23 subsequent games against this opposition; however, Parma are one of four teams currently in the competition, along with Monza, Fiorentina and Como, against whom the Serbian has yet to score in the top-flight (223 minutes in four encounters).
