

**Torino - Venezia**

2 May 2025, 20.45



- After winning six Serie A games in a row between 1947 and 1962, Torino managed just two wins in their next 10 games against Venezia in the competition (D6 L2).
- Venezia have won their last two away games against Torino in Serie A, one in 2001 and one in 2022, after having achieved just one success in the previous 10 (D2 L7).
- Torino have lost two of their last three league games, without scoring; that's as many defeats as in their previous 17 Serie A games (W5 D10) and as many games without scoring as in their previous 16.
- Torino are unbeaten in their last eight home games in Serie A (W4 D4) and have won four of their last six, as many as in their previous 17 home games in the competition (D8 L5).
- Since the beginning of February, Venezia have failed to score in seven out of 12 matches, including the most recent (0-2 against Milan); in this period, only Monza (eight) have failed to score in more matches than them.
- The last away match won by Venezia in Serie A was against Torino, on 12 February 2022 (2-1 with goals from Brekalo, Haps and Crnigoj); since then, they have been waiting for a win in 24 away games, the longest open streak among the teams currently in the top division.
- No team has scored more goals from outside the box in this championship than Venezia, 19% (tied with Udinese), netting five long-range goals out of 27; in particular, no player has scored more goals from outside the box than Hans Nicolussi Caviglia (three, like Zappacosta, Cataldi and Soulé).
- Venezia have conceded the most shots on target in this championship (172), while Torino is fourth in this ranking (162), behind only Lecce (170) and Monza (168).
- Since making his Serie A debut with Torino, Eljif Elmas is the Granata player who has scored the most goals (four) and attempted the most dribbles (24), while he is second only to Ché Adams for total number of shots (14 v 15).
- Gaetano Oristanio is the player who has won the most fouls in the attacking third of the pitch (23) and the Italian who has completed the most dribbles (53) in this Serie A season – the Venezia player, however, has not been involved in any goals in 16 consecutive league matches, the longest period for him without scoring or assisting in the tournament.

**Parma - Como**

3 May 2025, 15.00



- Parma are unbeaten in Serie A against Como (W1 D2); Como could become the fifth club against which the Gialloblù have played at least four games and without ever losing in the competition, along with Cremonese, Venezia, Ancona and Padova.
- Between Serie A and Serie B, Parma have lost only two home games against Como, one in 1931 and one in 1956; the Gialloblù are unbeaten in their last 15 home league games against Como (W9 D6) and, considering these two competitions, only have a longer streak against Cagliari (23).
- Parma have drawn six of their first nine league games under Cristian Chivu (2W 1D); in the three points for a win era, only two managers have drawn seven of their first 10 games in Serie A: Alexander Blessin and Sinisa Mihajlovic.
- After losing seven of their 13 home games under Fabio Pecchia in the current league season (W3 D3), Parma are unbeaten in their last four home Serie A matches under Cristian Chivu (W2 D2).
- For only the second time Como have achieved four wins in a row in Serie A, after the streak in 1952 under Robert Winkler; they have never won five consecutive matches in the top-flight.
- Como have scored in each of their last five away league games (10 goals, including six in the two most recent), the last time they scored in more consecutive away Serie A matches was back in 1976 (eight in that case).
- Como have scored the joint-most goals by high turnovers in Serie A this season (six, alongside Napoli and Inter), on the other hand Parma have netted just one goal by high turnovers, ahead of only Monza (zero).
- Como (five) have benefited from the most own goals in the Big-5 European leagues in 2024/25; the last team to have benefited from more own goals in a single Serie A season was Fiorentina in 1996/97 (six).
- Since Opta collects data on assists (from 2004/05), Emanuele Valeri is the first Parma defender to provide at least six assists in a single Serie A season – overall, the last Gialloblù player with at least seven assists was Dejan Kulusevski in 2019/20 (eight), while the last Italian was Sebastian Giovinco in 2011/12 (11).
- Only Tijjani Reijnders (184) has taken part in more open play sequences that ended with a shot than Nico Paz in Serie A this season (173, 18 of which resulted in goals) – the Argentine has the most shots following a one-two (nine) and he is second only to Henrikh Mkhitaryan (seven) for sequences that ended with a goal in which he made the pass before the assist (five).

**Cagliari - Udinese**

3 May 2025, 15.00



- 14th April 2018 is the last match in which Cagliari scored more than one goal against Udinese in Serie A (goals by Pavoletti and Ceppitelli); indeed, in the following 11 matches the Sardinians have scored six goals, failing to score in five of these.
- Udinese are unbeaten in their last five away games against Cagliari in Serie A (W3 D2), they have never had a streak of six away matches in a row without defeat against the Sardinians in the competition (five also between 1981 and 1993).
- Cagliari won their last league game (2-0 against Hellas Verona) and could win consecutive games in Serie A for the first time since March 2024 under Claudio Ranieri; in addition, the Sardinians have kept three clean sheets in their last five games, as many as in their previous 30 matches.
- Cagliari have lost eight of their 17 home games played in Serie A in 2024/25, only fewer than Hellas Verona (10) and Monza (11); only in four seasons have the Sardinians suffered more home defeats, all in the last 10 years: 11 in 2014/15 and 10 in 2017/18, 2020/21 and 2021/22.
- Udinese have scored just one goal in their last six Serie A games and none in their last four; the last team that failed to score in five games in a row in a single Serie A season was Empoli, between August and September 2023.
- Udinese have lost their last three away games in Serie A and have already suffered four away defeats in a row in the current league season, between September and November; this could become the fourth season in which the Bianconeri have had two such streaks of 4+ defeats away from home, after 1958/59, 1961/62 and 2017/18.
- Cagliari with 26% (9/35) and Udinese with 25% (9/36) are the two teams with the highest percentage of headed goals in Serie A this season – in particular, one of the two players with the most headed goals in the current league season is Udinese's Lorenzo Lucca (five, level with Mateo Retegui).
- Udinese are one of the three teams, along with Bologna and Genoa, with the fewest goals scored in the first 15 minutes of play in Serie A this season (all with two); Cagliari follows with three, level with Torino and Como.
- After his goal in the last match against Hellas Verona, Leonardo Pavoletti could score in consecutive Serie A games for the first time since December 2023, against Sassuolo and Napoli; his last home goal in the competition arrived against Sassuolo and he hasn't netted in his last 19 appearances at Unipol Domus.
- Sandi Lovric - the most subbed-off midfielder in Serie A this season (having left the pitch 24 times), hasn't been involved in a goal in his last 11 Serie A games, having scored a goal and provided an assist in the previous two.

**Lecce - Napoli**

3 May 2025, 18.00



- Napoli have kept a clean sheet in their last three Serie A games against Lecce, as many times as in their previous 14 games against them in the competition. This is the second longest clean sheet streak for the Partenopei against opponents currently in the top-flight (seven in a row against Venezia).
- After losing just one of their first nine Serie A home games against Napoli (W3 D5), without ever conceding more than one goal, Lecce have lost and conceded at least two goals in each of their last four home games against the Partenopei in the competition.
- Across their last nine league games, Lecce have collected only two points in Serie A – only Monza (one point) have won fewer in this period.
- Lecce have not won at home in Serie A since 15 December against Monza (2-1); since then, the Apulians have collected only three points thanks to three draws (L6), and have failed to score in six of their nine home games.
- Napoli have kept a clean sheet in their last three league games, last managing a longer such run in Serie A in February 2023, with Luciano Spalletti on the bench.
- At this point in the campaign, after 34 matches played, Napoli are the team that have improved the most compared to the same stage last season (24 more points), which is at least double that of any other team to feature in both seasons.
- Napoli are the only team yet to concede a headed goal this season, while Lecce have already conceded 10 headed goals – fewer than only Torino (11) and Monza (18).
- Napoli have conceded only three goals from set pieces in this Serie A season, fewer than any other team across the big five European leagues in 2024-25.
- Nikola Krstovic has attempted 130 shots in this championship, already a record for a Lecce player from 2004/05 onwards in Serie A (second only to Mirko Vucinic in 2005/06 with 104). When combining shots and chances created, however, Krstovic ranks first in a single season for the club in this period (157 total shot involvements against Vucinic's 143).
- In the 21st Century, only two Napoli midfielders have finished a Serie A campaign with at least 10 goals scored: Marek Hamsík (four times) and Scott McTominay. The Scottish midfielder currently has 11 goals, while the Slovakian's record is 12 (both in 2016/17 and 2009/10).

**Inter - Hellas Verona**

- Inter are both the team that have beaten Hellas Verona the most times in Serie A (41), and the team that have scored the most against the Gialloblu in the competition (117 goals).
- Hellas Verona have never won away against Inter in Serie A (D11 L22). There are three teams against which the Gialloblu have played at least 30 away games without obtaining a single victory in the competition: Juventus (34), Milan (33) and Inter (33).
- Inter have so far gained 71 points, while in the last Serie A season after 34 matchdays they were already at 89 points; this difference of -18 is the second worst among the teams present in both seasons (only Monza have done worse, -29 points).
- Inter have lost their last two league games without scoring, suffering as many defeats as in their previous 27 Serie A games (W19 D6); the Nerazzurri have not suffered three defeats in a row in the competition since April 2023, against Spezia, Juventus and Fiorentina.
- April and May are the two months in which Simone Inzaghi's teams have historically suffered the most defeats in Serie A (12 in each month); indeed, his loss percentage in May of 36% (12/33) is the second-worst, only behind July (50%, 4/8).
- The last time Hellas Verona scored more than one goal in Serie A was on 30 December 2024; since then, the Gialloblu have scored six goals in 16 games, 10 times without scoring, both negative records in the calendar year in the competition.
- Inter are the team that have attempted the most shots in this championship (532), which results in an Expected Goals value of 61.9. Indeed, their difference between goals scored (72) and xG is the second-biggest positive margin in this championship (10.1, lower only than Fiorentina's 10.2).
- This game will feature one of the two teams with the fewest headed goals in this season's Serie A (Hellas Verona, two, level with Monza) and the one that has scored the most goals in this manner (Inter, 14).
- In the 26 games with Marcus Thuram as a starter in this championship, Inter have lost just twice, with a loss percentage that rises from 7.7% with him in the starting eleven to 37.5% in the games in which he hasn't started (three defeats out of eight).
- All four of Amin Sarr's goals in this championship have come away from home. Indeed, he is currently the Hellas Verona player with the most goals scored by those who have only netted away from home in a single Serie A season (Emiliano Mascetti with three in 1971/72).



Empoli - Lazio

4 May 2025, 12.30



- In the last 12 matches between Empoli and Lazio in Serie A, there have been 10 Biancocelesti wins and two draws: the Tuscan club's last win against the Capitoline team in the competition was back on 29th November 2015 (1-0 with goal by Lorenzo Tonelli).
- Lazio have won each of their last five Serie A matches at the Castellani stadium against Empoli, scoring 10 goals (two per match) and keeping three clean sheets in the period; previously, the Biancocelesti had won only two of their first nine away matches against the Tuscans (D3 L4).
- The last Empoli win in Serie A was back on 8th December 2024 against Hellas Verona: 19 games in a row without a win (D6 L13) is the worst such record for the Tuscan club in Serie A; in addition, the last time the azzurri won a match against a club above them in the standings was the last MD of Serie A 2023/24 (2-1 against Roma).
- Lazio are one of the four teams in the current league season (with Atalanta, Empoli and Hellas Verona) with more points gained in away games than in home matches; the Biancocelesti have won their last two away games and the last time they won three consecutive matches on the road in Serie A was back in November 2022 (four in that case).
- In the first half of the season, Lazio had an average points per game of 1.84 (35 in 19 games); while in the second half of the season it's 1.67 (25 in 15 games). The Biancocelesti's goals per game average has also dropped, from 1.74 to 1.60.
- Lazio have scored the most goals in the last 15 minutes of play (20) in Serie A this season (including Pedro's brace in the last match against Parma); on the other hand, Empoli have conceded the most goals (16) in the same period in the current league season.
- Empoli have conceded 15 goals via crosses in Serie A this season, only fewer than Monza (16); on the other hand Lazio have scored three of their last five league goals following a cross (always from the left and always with Luca Pellegrini's assist).
- Jacopo Fazzini - who scored in the last two matchdays in Serie A - is one of four Italian midfielders born since 2003 with at least two goals in the current league season (with Niccolò Pisilli, Fabio Miretti and Giovanni Fabbian).
- Pedro (eight goals in 2024/25), who scored a goal in the reverse match against Empoli, is close to equaling his record of goals in a single season in Serie A (nine in 2021/22); the Spaniard has scored seven goals as a substitute in Serie A this season: in the Big-5 European leagues in 2024/25, only Alexander Sørloth (nine) has more (seven also for Cristhian Stuani).
- Matteo Guendouzi is the Lazio player with the most matches played this season in all competitions (44 games and 3.786 minutes on the pitch); in general, among Serie A teams in all competitions, only two midfielders have played more minutes than the Frenchman (Tijjani Reijnders and Marten De Roon).



Monza - Atalanta

4 May 2025, 15.00



- Among the opponents against which Atalanta have achieved 100% victories against in Serie A, Monza are the one that the Bergamo side have faced the most (5/5); the aggregate score between the Dea and the Biancorossi in the top-flight is 14-3.
- Monza have earned 15 points this season; only four teams have collected fewer after 34 league games in the three points for a win era in Serie A (since 1994-95): Pescara (14 in 2016-17), Ancona (13 in 2003-04), Napoli (14 in 1997-98) and Brescia (12 in 1994-95).
- Monza have lost their last five league games and have never recorded six consecutive defeats in their Serie A history.
- Monza have failed to score in each of their last three league matches; the Brianzoli could fail to find the net in four games in a row for the first time in a single Serie A season.
- With 65 points earned this season, this is Atalanta's third-best season in Serie A after 34 games, after 2019-20 (71) and 2020-21 (69). Furthermore, Atalanta have conceded 31 goals this season; only once have they conceded fewer after 34 league games in their history in the top-flight (28 in 1964-65).
- Atalanta are the team that have earned the most points away from home in this Serie A season (36 in 17 away matches); considering the big five European leagues in 2024-25, only Liverpool (38) and PSG (37) have more points away from home (Barcelona also have 36).
- Atalanta have won five of their last six away games in Serie A (D1), scoring 17 goals (2.8 per game) and conceding only two.
- Only Inter have scored more headed goals (14) than Atalanta (12) in Serie A this season, while Monza are the team that have conceded the most headed goals (18) in 2024-25 across the big five European leagues.
- Dany Mota is the Monza player with the most appearances (92), goals (14) and goal involvements (20 – 14 goals, 6 assists) in Serie A. Mota, who has scored five goals this season, could score six goals in a Serie A season for the first time (5 also in 2022-23).
- Mateo Retegui, who has scored 24 goals this season, has equalled Filippo Inzaghi (24 goals in 1996-97) as Atalanta's top scorer in a single season in the history of Serie A. However, he has played 269 minutes without scoring against Monza in the league: only against Inter has he gone more minutes without scoring (283).

**Roma - Fiorentina**

4 May 2025, 18.00



- Roma are the opponent against which Fiorentina have drawn the most games in their Serie A history (62 in 171 matches), with 58 Giallorossi wins and 51 for the Viola. Indeed, against no other team have Roma drawn more matches than against the Toscani in the top-flight (62, level with Lazio).
- Following their 5-1 win in the reverse fixture in October, Fiorentina could win both Serie A matches against Roma for only the second time in the last 60 years, previously doing so in 2011-12.
- Fiorentina are unbeaten in their last four league matches against Roma (W2 D2); the last time the Viola went on a longer such streak against the Giallorossi in Serie A was between 1975 and 1979 (run of nine).
- Roma have only lost three of their last 50 Serie A home games (W31 D16) against Fiorentina: the Viola's last away league win against the Giallorossi was April 2018 (2-0 thanks to goals from Marco Benassi and Giovanni Simeone); since then, four wins for the Capitolini and two draws.
- Roma are the team with the longest ongoing unbeaten streak in the big five European leagues (18 games - W13 D5); the Giallorossi are unbeaten in their last 18 games in a single Serie A season for the first time since between November 2009 and April 2010 (24 in that case under Claudio Ranieri).
- Roma have picked up the most points in 2025 in the big five European leagues (40 in 16 games - W12 D4); the Giallorossi also have conceded the fewest goals in that period (8) and are the only team to have more clean sheets (9) than goals conceded (8).
- Fiorentina are unbeaten in their last six league games (W4 D2); the Viola's last Serie A defeat was back in March against Napoli (1-2). Furthermore, the Toscani could win three matches in a row in the top-flight for the first time since between January and February.
- Roma and Fiorentina are two of the three teams, alongside Atalanta, to have scored the most goals (9 each) from outside the box in Serie A this season; while no side has conceded fewer goals than the Giallorossi from outside the box (2, level with Juventus).
- Matías Soulé has scored five goals in Serie A this season, all on the road: his last goal in a home league game was back in April 2024 for Frosinone against Salernitana. With two goals and one assist in his last three Serie A appearances, Soulé could be directly involved in at least one goal in four successive matches for the first time in the top-flight.
- Moise Kean has scored three goals against Roma in Serie A (including his first multiple goals for Fiorentina in the competition, a brace in October): only against Hellas Verona has he netted more goals (5) in the top-flight against an opponent.

**Bologna - Juventus**

4 May 2025, 20.45



- Bologna and Juventus have drawn each of their last four Serie A meetings, with both sides scoring in each of those: they could draw five games in a row in the top-flight for the first time since between 1978-1980.
- Juventus are unbeaten in their last 25 Serie A matches against Bologna (W17 D8): it's their longest current streak of consecutive games without a defeat in the competition; the last Rossoblù win against the Bianconeri in the top-flight was back to February 26th 2011 (0-2, at Torino, thanks to Marco Di Vaio's brace).
- Bologna's last Serie A home win against Juventus was back in November 1998 (3-0 with goals from Michele Paramatti, Giuseppe Signori and Davide Fontolan), drawing seven and losing 14 since. Furthermore, in the last eight encounters in Emilia against the Rossoblù, Juventus have always scored at least once.
- Should Bologna win, they will overtake Juventus in the table with three games to go: the Rossoblù have never been ahead of the Bianconeri with three games to go in a 20-team Serie A season.
- Following the win against Monza last time out, Juventus could win back-to-back for the first time since February-March in Serie A (five in that case); the Bianconeri have only gained one point (D1 L2) in their last three league away games and could they be winless in four games in a row on the road for the first time since the end of last season (eight in that case).
- Since Igor Tudor joined Juventus (matchday 30), the Bianconeri are the only team to have scored more than one goal from outside the box (two, Manuel Locatelli against Roma and Nicolás González against Monza); the Piemontesi have attempted 27 total shots from outside the box in the period (alongside Empoli): only fewer than Lecce (37), Milan (31) and Como (28) in Serie A.
- Only Napoli (3) have conceded fewer goals from set pieces than Bologna (6) in Serie A this season. However, among the top 10 sides in the Serie A table, Juventus have scored the fewest goals from set pieces (nine, five of those from penalties).
- Bologna are both the team with the most high turnovers in Serie A this season (242) and the side with the most pressed sequences (420).
- Riccardo Orsolini, who grew up in Juventus youth side despite never making his debut for the Bianconeri in Serie A, has scored two goals in his last three league appearances at Dall'Ara against the Piemontesi: should he score or provide an assist he would set his new record in a single Serie A season of involvement in goals (currently 15 as in 2022/23, thanks to 12 goals and three assists).
- Nicolás González has scored five of his 12 total Serie A goals from April onwards last season. Since his debut in Serie A, he netted 48% of his goals in the months of April, May and June (13 out of 27): May, in particular, is the month in which he has scored the most goals in the competition (six).

**Genoa - Milan**

5 May 2025, 20.45



- Milan and Genoa have drawn their last two Serie A meetings: they've not drawn three in a row in the top division since 1991-1992, with the 1991/92 season also the last in which the Rossoneri and the Rossoblu drew both matches.
- Milan are unbeaten in 13 of their last 14 league games against Genoa (W9 D4); the Rossoblu's only win in this period was 2-1 in March 2020, with goals from Goran Pandev and Francesco Cassata (Zlatan Ibrahimovic for the Rossoneri).
- Milan have won five of their last six games at the Ferraris against Genoa (D1), keeping four clean sheets. They are looking to keep three clean sheets in a row on Ligurian soil for the first time since 1962.
- Milan have won their last three away games in all competitions without conceding a goal; the Rossoneri have not won four in a row since March 2024, while they last did so without conceding (in the same campaign) in December 2003.
- Genoa have lost their last two Serie A games and have failed to score in their last three; the Rossoblu have not lost three league games in a row since October 2024 and have not gone four consecutive rounds without a goal since February 2022.
- Despite being the team that have attempted the most shots from outside the box (95) since the beginning of 2025 in Serie A (since the arrival of Sérgio Conceicao), Milan are one of three teams in the league that have yet to score from distance in this calendar year - together with Bologna and today's opponent, Genoa.
- Only Parma (28 shots) had fewer shots than Genoa (29, like Cagliari) in the month of April in Serie A; the Ligurians still produced an overall expected goals value of 3.39 in the month, despite scoring just one goal.
- Genoa's Andrea Pinamonti has not found the net in his last nine Serie A games: it is his longest drought in a single top-flight championship since 15 consecutive games without a goal between October 2019 and June 2020.
- Youssouf Fofana has already provided six assists in this championship; considering the last 20 seasons (since 2005/06), only one central midfielder has managed at least seven assists in his debut season in Serie A with Milan: Hakan Çalhanoglu in 2017/18 (Alberto Aquilani stopped at six in 2011/12).
- Christian Pulisic scored the only goal in the only match played in his career at the Ferraris against Genoa (1-0 on 7 October 2023); excluding central attackers (first or second strikers), the American could become the first Milan player to score more than 10 goals in the first two Serie A championships played with the Rossoneri since Luciano Chiarugi (1972/73 and 1973/74).
