

**Milan - Bologna**

9 May 2025



- After a run of 13 wins and four draws against Bologna, Milan lost their most recent league match against them in February; the Rossoneri last won both games against the Rossoneri in a Serie A season back in 1939-40.
- Milan have drawn two of their last three home games in Serie A against Bologna (W1), as many draws as across their previous 16 matches at San Siro in the competition against this opposition (W11 L3).
- Milan have won their last two Serie A matches and will be looking to win three in succession for just the second time in the top-flight this season, after victories over Venezia, Inter and Lecce under Paulo Fonseca in September.
- Milan lost their last home game in Serie A (0-1 v Atalanta) and last suffered two consecutive home defeats between October-November 2023 in the league. The Rossoneri have also lost two of their last four home games in the competition (W1 D1), as many defeats as in their previous 27 such matches combined (W15 D10).
- Bologna have won 62 points so far in the league and they can potentially still surpass their record at the end of the season in the three points for a win era (68 in 2023-24). They currently have 16 wins, while in the last Serie A season at this point, they had collected 17.
- Bologna have failed to score in each of their last two away games in Serie A (0-2 v Atalanta and 0-0 v Udinese), last going three consecutive away games without scoring in the competition in January 2021.
- Bologna are one of three teams, along with Genoa and Udinese, to have scored the fewest goals in the first 15 minutes in Serie A this season (2).
- Milan have earned 19 points from losing positions in Serie A in this season, three of those last time out, whilst Bologna have gained 18 points. The Rossoneri and the Emiliani are the two teams with the most points picked up in this ranking in Serie this season.
- Theo Hernández has found the net four times in Serie A this season and could score five goals for the fifth time in Serie A, equalling Sergio Cervato and Giacinto Facchetti, as the only two defenders to have achieved this milestone.
- After netting in the reverse fixture, Milan could become the second team, after Monza, that Santiago Castro has scored more than one goal against in Serie A. Among players with 4+ goals and 4+ assists in this championship, the Bologna star is the youngest (18 September 2004).

**Como - Cagliari**

- Como and Cagliari have met seven times in Serie A: three wins for the Lombardi, two for the Rossoblù and two draws.
- Cagliari are one of only eight teams against which Como have won 100% home games in Serie A (3/3). Among these sides, only against Palermo and Triestina (four both) have Como played more matches on their own patch in the competition.
- Como have won each of their last five Serie A matches, conceding only one goal in the process. Amongst newly-promoted teams, the only side to win more successive games in the competition was Lazio in 1973 (eight in that case).
- Como have won their last two Serie A home matches, both 1-0 (against Torino and Genoa), and neither in the top-flight this season nor in 2002/03 have they won three home games in a row, with the last time coming in October-November 1984.
- Cagliari have lost three of their last four Serie A matches (W1), as many defeats as they suffered in their previous eight matches in the competition (W2 D3).
- Cagliari won their last Serie A away game (2-0 against Hellas Verona) and could win back-to-back matches on the road for the first time in the competition since September 2019, against Parma and Napoli in that case.
- Como are one of three teams, alongside Napoli and Inter, to have scored the most goals from high turnovers in Serie A this season, six goals from 43 total shots, the best tally among the three teams.
- Como have conceded the fewest goals by percentage in the first half of Serie A matches in this season, only 33% (16 goals conceded out of a total of 48).
- Gabriel Strefezza - five goals and four assists in Serie A this season - has been directly involved in a goal in each of his last three top-flight appearances (two goals, one assist). He's never recorded a goal contribution in four successive matches in the competition (also three between September and October 2022).
- Nadir Zortea has scored six goals in Serie A this season, two more than he netted between 2021/22 and 2023/24 in the competition. Excluding forwards, the last Cagliari players to score more goals in a single top-flight season were Massimiliano Cappioli and Vittorio Pusceddu (both seven in 1992/93).



Lazio - Juventus

- Juventus are the team with the most wins against Lazio in Serie A: 87 vs 36 victories for the Biancocelesti (D38). Overall, the only side defeated more times by a single opponent in the top-flight are Inter (88 by Juventus).
- Lazio have won two Serie A home games in a row against Juventus for the first time since 2001 and could win three successive matches on home soil against the Bianconeri for the first time since May 1956.
- Lazio have never repeated the same result across their last 10 Serie A games (W4 D5 L1); in the top-flight this season already once, between November and February, the Biancocelesti have gone 11 games without repeating the same result twice in a row (W5 D2 L4).
- Lazio have drawn their last five Serie A home games, the last time the Biancocelesti drew six meetings in a row on their own patch in the competition was back to 1991.
- For the first time in Serie A, at matchday 36, there are three teams with the same number of points and with at least 60 points (Juventus, Roma and Lazio); in particular, Lazio and Juventus will meet on equal points in both seasonal games for the first time in the top-flight.
- Igor Tudor, who has been Lazio manager for nine Serie A games at the end of 2023/24 season, has only picked up two points in his first three league away matches against Juventus. The last Bianconeri's coach to have failed to win in his first four Serie A meetings on the road was Cestmir Vycpalek in 1971.
- Juventus have conceded 94% of their goals (30/32) from inside box in the current Serie A season, with no other side suffering more by percentage (also 94% Roma).
- Despite only being 10th for high turnovers (208), Lazio rank second for shot-ending high turnovers in Serie A in this season with 46, behind only Lecce (47).
- Boulaye Dia scored last time out whilst Lazio have won 11 points thanks to his nine goals in Serie A this season - the most among players who have netted fewer than 10 goals this season.
- Khéphren Thuram has scored four goals and provided five assists in Serie A in this season, both his best tally between Italian top-flight and Ligue 1 (four goals also in 2021/22 for Nice). Should he find the net against Lazio, he could become the first Juventus midfielder with at least five goals and five assists since Miralem Pjanic in 2017/18 (5G, 8A).

**Empoli - Parma**

- Empoli and Parma have drawn four of their last six meetings in Serie A (one win each) after each of the prior 13 games in the top-flight had a winner.
- Empoli have drawn their last three home matches against Parma in Serie A; for the Toscani this is their longest current drawing streak against a single side in the competition on home soil (three also vs Fiorentina).
- Empoli are winless since December in Serie A (vs Hellas Verona); the Toscani were the only team without any wins in the period in the competition, whilst they've picked up the second -fewest points since then (6) – only Monza have less (five).
- Empoli have won just one home match in Serie A this season (D7 L9), with no team winning fewer across the current Big-5 European Leagues (one win also for Monza, Ipswich Town and Southampton).
- Parma have drawn six of their last eight League matches (W1 L1), as many draws as they recorded in the previous 22 games played in the competition (W4 L12).
- Parma's last away win came in November against Venezia (D5 L6) drawing each of their last four games away from home. The Gialloblù never recorded five away draws in a row in the competition.
- Empoli have scored a higher percentage of their goals in the first half than any other side (59%, 16 goals on 27 overall).
- Empoli have recorded 11.286 passes in Serie A this season (an average of 322 per match), fewer than any other team in Serie A; in the current top five European leagues, only Getafe have fewer on average (297).
- Only one of Sebastiano Esposito's eight goals this Serie A season came in a home match (13%) - amongst the players with more than five goals in this Serie A, only Rafael Leão has a lower percentage of home goals than the Empoli player (no such nets for the Portuguese).
- Among defenders who have not been dribbled past, Lautaro Valenti is the player with the most mins played in Serie A this season (1436).



Udinese - Monza

- Udinese are unbeaten in their last five matches against Monza in Serie A (W2 D3); only against Pescara (eight), Alessandria (six) and Pisa (six) the Bianconeri have played more games without losing in the competition.
- Udinese and Monza have both drawn of the Bianconeri's home games in Serie A: 2-2 in April 2023, 0-0 in February 2024 – against no team have the Brianzoli drawn three away matches in the competition so far.
- After a run of five defeats in a row, Udinese have earned four points in their last two Serie A games; the Bianconeri have failed to score in five of their last seven matches: as many as they did in their previous 23 league meetings.
- Udinese have failed to score in their last three Serie A home games (D1 L2) and they could fail to find the net for more successive matches on home soil in a single top-flight season for the first time since 1993/94 (five between October and January).
- Monza have picked up 15 points in 35 league games; the last team to end a Serie A season with 15 or fewer points was Ancona in 2003/04 (13). In a 20-team top-flight season it would be a negative record (currently Salernitana with 17 in 2023/24).
- Monza have lost each of their last 10 Serie A away games; the last team went on a such longer streak on the road in the top-flight was Benevento in 2017/18 (15).
- No team have faced more total shots than Monza (516, along with Venezia) in Serie A this season; in the detail, the Brianzoli have conceded 274 total shots in 2025: only four sides in the Big five European leagues have suffered more: Borussia Mönchengladbach (303), St Etienne (287), Ipswich Town (280) and Holstein Kiel (278).
- On the one hand, Udinese have scored 24% of their total goals with headed goals in Serie A this season (9/38): less only than Cagliari (25%); on the other hand, no team have netted fewer headed goals than Monza (two, level with Hellas Verona).
- Jaka Bijol is the Udinese player with the most clearances (178), 102 of those with head; furthermore, none of his teammates have attempted more interceptions than him (37) in the current top-flight season.
- Udinese are the team against which Gianluca Caprari has provided the most assists (five) in Serie A; against the Bianconeri he has also scored two goals, one of those at the Bluenergy Stadium in December 2020.



Hellas Verona - Lecce

- After avoiding defeat in nine successive games (W6 D3), Hellas Verona lost their last Serie A match against Lecce (0-1 in the reverse fixture) and could suffer back-to-back defeats against the Salentini for only the second time in the competition (2001).
- Lecce have never won against Hellas Verona in nine Serie A matches on the road (D4 L5), against no team have the Pugliesi played more away games in the competition without winning (nine also against Genoa).
- Hellas Verona have lost their last three league matches without scoring, the last time the Gialloblù suffered four defeats in a row in Serie A was between last November - December. Additionally, the last time that they lost four successive matches whilst also failing to score was in March 2014 under Andrea Mandorlini.
- Hellas Verona have failed to score in 10 of their 17 home games in Serie A this season and could fail to find the net a record amount of times on home soil in a single top-flight season if failing to do so once more (10 also in 1988/89).
- Lecce are winless in their last 12 league games (D4 L8), with their last win coming in January against Parma on the road (3-1). Their previous longest run came between November 1997 - March 1998 (16 in a row in that case).
- In their first six Serie A away games under Marco Giampaolo, Lecce have earned nine points (W3 D3, for an average of 1.5 per match) and were 6th in terms of away points in this period. However, in the last five away matches the Salentini have only picked up two points, better only than Monza (0).
- Lecce have the fewest scorers in the current Serie A season (7), with the last side to end a top-flight season with seven or fewer scorers being Sampdoria in 2003-04 (seven).
- Hellas Verona have conceded 28 goals in the first half of Serie A matches this season - 20 more than Lecce. It's the most across Europe's big five leagues this season, ahead of Hoffenheim on 27.
- Daniel Mosquera has scored each of his five goals in Serie A this season as a substitute; the most of any player who have netted 100% of their goals as a substitute across the big five European leagues this season.
- Since his debut in Serie A (2022-23), Federico Baschirotto has played 109 games, starting each of those. In that period, the Lecce defender is the outfield player who has played the most minutes in the top-flight: 9775 (ahead of Sebastiano Luperto, with 9,603).



Torino - Inter

- After avoiding defeat in five consecutive games (W2 D3), Torino have lost 10 of their last 11 matches (D1) against Inter in Serie A, with an aggregate score of 24-7. In this period (since 2019-20), the Nerazzurri are the team against which the Granata have suffered the most defeats in the competition (10, at least two more than against any other opponent).
- Inter have won their last five Serie A matches against Torino, recording four clean sheets in the process; only once have the Nerazzurri achieved more consecutive victories against the Granata in the competition: seven, between September 2002 and September 2008.
- In the era of three points for a win (since 1994-95), Torino have lost 14 of their 20 home encounters (W2 D4) against Inter in Serie A; the Granata had lost only 17 of their 60 previous home matches (W23 D20) against the Nerazzurri in the top-flight.
- Torino are one of four teams in Serie A, alongside Bologna, Roma and Napoli, not to have lost at home in 2025. The Granata are unbeaten in nine home matches (W4 D5) and have not achieved at least 10 games in a row without losing at home in Serie A since April - November 1995, under Nedo Sonetti.
- Among teams in the top half of the Serie A table, Inter are only one of two, alongside Lazio, not to have recorded successive clean sheets in 2025.
- After eight consecutive away wins, Inter have won only one of their last seven away games (D3 L3) in Serie A: the 2-0 win against Atalanta in March. Across this period (since February), only Fiorentina have earned fewer points (4 points) away from home among the teams in the top half of the table.
- Inter are one of three teams to have scored the most goals from set piece situations in the big five European League this season: 22, level with Bayern Munich and Osasuna. 11 of these goals came from a corner: a record in Serie A and less only than Arsenal (13) in the current Big-5 (Wolfsburg and Crystal Palace also have 11).
- Inter are the team against which Nikola Vlasic has lost the most matches in Serie A: five out of five; furthermore, after his goal last time out against Venezia, the Croatian could both set a personal record for goals in a single season in the competition (five, also in 2022-23) and score in consecutive games for only the second time in Serie A, after a run of three in August-September 2022.
- Lautaro Martínez has been involved in 15 goals (12 goals, 3 assists) in Serie A this season. The Argentine is looking to become the first player to be involved in more than 15 goals in each of the last six Serie A campaigns (since 2019-20).
- Torino are the team against which Marcus Thuram has scored the most goals in Serie A: four, including the only hat-trick he has scored in his career in the big five European Leagues (last October at the Meazza). Furthermore, only three Inter players have scored at least two braces in the competition against the Granata: Roberto Boninsegna (2), Virgilio Levratto (2) and Giuseppe Meazza (4).



Napoli - Genoa

- After five consecutive defeats between 2007 and 2009, Napoli have lost only two of their last 28 matches against Genoa in Serie A, winning 18 and drawing eight. Across this period (from 2010 onwards), only against Sampdoria have the Neapolitans recorded more victories (21).
- Genoa are winless in their last 13 away games against Napoli in Serie A (D5 L9) – the Ligurians' last away success against the Azzurri was in February 2009 (1-0, goal by Bosko Jankovic) - only against four teams have the Rossoblu a longer ongoing run of consecutive away matches without a victory in the competition: Inter (18), Juventus (21), Roma (22) and Fiorentina (26).
- Genoa have not won against the side starting the day in first place of Serie A since March 2019: 2-0 at the Ferraris, against Juventus, with goals from Stefano Sturaro and Goran Pandev (under Cesare Prandelli); since then, two draws and six defeats, including the last such game against Inter in March 2024 (1-2).
- Napoli have won their last four league games without conceding a goal and they could record five consecutive wins without conceding for the first time in their history in Serie A (also 4 in 2023, 1990 and 1934).
- Genoa have lost their last three league games and could suffer four consecutive defeats in Serie A for the first time since December 2021, under Andriy Shevchenko.
- Napoli have conceded the fewest goals (25) and recorded the most clean sheets (17) in the big five European Leagues this season; only twice have the Neapolitans kept more clean sheets in Serie A at the end of a 20-team competition: in 2022-23 (18) and in 2017-18 (19).
- Despite scoring the fourth-most goals in Serie A this term (55, level with Milan), Napoli have the fewest players with at least one shot on target attempted in this competition: just 17, six fewer than Genoa who are fourth in this ranking with 23 (alongside Venezia).
- All five of Aarón Martín's assists in Serie A this term have come via a cross; the Spaniard could become the first Genoa defender to provide more than five assists in a single Serie A season since the Rossoblu returned to the top-flight (2007-08): Paolo Ghiglione, Luca Antonelli, Edenilson and Fabiano also recorded five.
- Genoa are the team that Romelu Lukaku has scored the most goals against in Serie A – seven – and the only team currently in the competition against which the Belgian has scored more than one brace: two, both with Inter, in December 2019 and July 2020 respectively.
- Scott McTominay has scored a brace in each of his last two home league games (v Empoli and Torino); in the three points for a win era (since 1994-95), only one Napoli player has scored more than one goal in three consecutive home games in Serie A: Gonzalo Higuaín, in both 2015 and 2016.

**Venezia - Fiorentina**

- Venezia have avoided defeat in five of their last eight Serie A matches against Fiorentina – four wins, one draw and three defeats – after suffering eight defeats in their previous nine league meetings (W1).
- Venezia have kept a clean sheet in three of their last four league matches against Fiorentina, including the reverse fixture (0-0): it's one more shutout than the Lagunari managed in all of their previous 23 encounters against the Viola in Serie A.
- Fiorentina are the side against which Venezia have won the most home games in Serie A: eight out of a total of 13 (D1 L4), including each of their last four in the competition.
- Fiorentina have lost six of their last 10 away games (W2 D2) in Serie A – as many defeats as in their previous 19 (W8 D5). In this period (since mid-December), only Empoli (7) and Monza (10) have suffered more such defeats in the competition than the Tuscans.
- All four of Venezia's Serie A victories this term have come at home, the last one in April against Monza. Indeed, the Venetian team have collected the highest percentage of their points at home in the division: 65%, 17 out of 26 overall.
- Fiorentina lost their last league match against Roma without scoring and could suffer back-to-back defeats in a row without scoring for the second time this season, after also doing so in February.
- Fiorentina have the highest ratio between touches in the opposition box and goals scored: one goal for every 13 touches. On the other hand, only Lecce have so far recorded a worse such average (24) than Venezia (one goal for every 22).
- Following his goal against Torino, Kike Pérez became the second Spanish player to score for Venezia in Serie A, after Juan Santisteban Troyano (two goals in 1961-62). The midfielder is looking to score in successive games for the first time in his career in the big five European Leagues.
- Among defenders who have played at least 2000 minutes, only Ardian Ismajli has been dribbled past less times (just 3) than Luca Ranieri (4) in Serie A this term.
- Moise Kean has been involved in 20 goals (17 goals, 3 assists) in this league campaign; however, the Fiorentina striker has not been involved in a goal in his last two games in the competition, and could go three games in a row without having a hand in a goal for the first time with Fiorentina in Serie A.



Atalanta - Roma

12 May 2025



- Atalanta have won 13 points (W4 D1) in their last five Serie A games against Roma. In this period (last three seasons), only against Hellas Verona (16), Empoli and Monza (both 18) have the Bergamo team earned more points in the competition.
- Atalanta kept a clean sheet in the reverse fixture against Roma in December (2-0); the Nerazzurri last kept consecutive clean sheets in the competition against the Giallorossi in the same season in 1964-65, under Ferruccio Valcareggi.
- Roma have lost four of their last five away games (W1) against Atalanta in Serie A: as many defeats as the Giallorossi suffered in their previous 13 away games (W6 D3) against the Bergamo side in the competition – a period in which the Nerazzurri have never repeated the same result for two games in a row.
- Atalanta have won just eight points from their nine home league games in 2025 (0.9 on average per game), recording one win and five draws (L3); the last time the Bergamo side won fewer points after their first nine Serie A home games in a calendar year was in 2013 (7).
- Roma are the side that have won the most games by a 1-0 scoreline in the big five European Leagues this season: nine times - eight of which have come under Claudio Ranieri - including all of the last three matches; they have never won four games in a row with this scoreline in Serie A.
- Roma are unbeaten in their 16 games so far in the second half of the season (W12 D4); the last team not to have lost any of their first 17 games in the second half of the season in Serie A was Antonio Conte's Inter in 2020-21: the last match of that unbeaten run for the Nerazzurri came against Roma (they were then defeated in the 18th game of that streak v Juventus).
- Atalanta have scored 99 goals this season in all competitions and they could reach triple figures for goals for the fifth time in their history, after 2023-24 (106), 2020-21 (111), 2019-20 (116) and 2018-19 (103).
- Mateo Retegui has been directly involved in 31 goals (24 goals, 7 assists) in Serie A this season – fewer than only Mohamed Salah (46) in the big five European Leagues (Harry Kane, also 31). Retegui could become the first player of the Bergamo team with more than 31 contributions across the last 20 Serie A seasons (since 2005-06) - Luis Muriel, also 31 in 2020-21.
- One of the four braces that Charles De Keteleare has scored in Serie A came against Roma last season; from January 2024, only Mateo Retegui and Dusan Vlahovic have more (5 each) such goals than the Belgian (4, level with Marcus Thuram) in the competition across that period.
- Among goalkeepers with at least 20 games played in the big five European Leagues this season, Mile Svilar has the highest save percentage (77.5%). Furthermore, he has kept 15 clean sheets this season, the last Roma goalkeeper to record more in a Serie A season was Alisson Becker, with 17 in 2017-18.
