



# INSIGHTS - MATCHDAY 10

SERIE A - 2025/2026



**On November 2, 1930, in Pro Vercelli-Lazio (3-0), Silvio Piola scored the first of his 274 goals in the single-division Serie A, which—to this day—earn him the all-time top-scorer record in Italy’s top flight.**

**For the first time since Serie A adopted three points for a win (1994/95), after nine matchdays there are still four teams seeking their first victory of the season: Fiorentina, Genoa, Pisa, and Verona.**



UDINESE



ATALANTA

**There have been 48 previous matches between the sides in Udine:** 25 wins for Udinese (most recent 2-1 in Serie A 2017/18), 12 draws (most recent 0-0 in last season's Serie A), and 11 wins for Atalanta (most recent 6-2 in Serie A 2021/22).

**Udinese's most recent victory dates back to 29 October 2017:** a 2-1 Serie A win with goals from De Paul and Barák after Atalanta had taken the lead through Kurtic (Cristante missed a penalty five minutes from time). Since then, in Friuli there have been four draws (three in the last three seasons) and three Atalanta wins.

**Udinese have failed to score only once in 11 official matches in 2025/26— the 0-3 home defeat to Milan; in the other 10 games they have netted 15 goals.**

**Udinese have conceded the joint-most goals in Serie A 2025/26:** 15, level with Fiorentina.

**Udinese have also conceded the joint-most goals in the opening 15 minutes:** 4, level with Verona.

**Atalanta have had the most different scorers:** 10, tied with Inter.

**Atalanta are one of six teams to have conceded the most goals to opposition substitutes:** 3, along with Parma, Lecce, Inter, Verona and Cagliari.

**Atalanta have scored the most goals in the final 15 minutes of the first half (31'-45' including stoppage time):** 5 of their 13 total goals have come in this period.

**Atalanta are the only unbeaten team after nine matchdays in Serie A 2025/26, as was also the case in 2022/23.** However, their current 13 points are their lowest tally at this stage since 2018/19: in that season Atalanta had just 9 points.

**Atalanta have seven draws in nine Serie A games.** In the 20-team top flight (format reinstated in 2004/05), this had happened only once before at this point—Inter in 2004/05, with the same record of two wins and seven draws in the first nine matches.

**For Kosta Runjaic and Ivan Juric this is their second official meeting after last season's clash: Roma-Udinese 3-0 (22 September 2024).** The Giallorossi goals came from Dovbyk, Baldanzi and Dybala, in what was the Croatian coach's first game in charge of Roma the day after De Rossi's dismissal.



UDINESE



ATALANTA

**Ivan Jurić faced Udinese four times as a player:** one draw and three wins for the current Atalanta coach (in Serie A 2007/08 and 2008/09).

**Against Milan, Ademola Lookman scored his 40th Serie A goal—his first of the season.** He has scored against Udinese only once, on 9 October 2022: Udinese–Atalanta 2–2.

**Ademola Lookman ranks second among Nigerian scorers in the history of the single-division Serie A (40 goals), behind Victor Osimhen (66).**

**Nicolò Zaniolo is on three goals this season across Serie A and the Coppa Italia;** only in 2019/20 did the Udinese forward start faster, with four goals (for Roma) by the end of October.

**Zaniolo is also a former Atalanta player:** 23 appearances and 3 goals (all away and in the second half) in the Nerazzurri shirt from July 2024 to January 2025.



NAPOLI



COMO

**In the 17 official meetings between the sides in Naples,** Napoli have 14 wins (most recent 3-1 in last season's Serie A), 1 draw (1-1 in the 1999/00 Coppa Italia), and 2 Como victories (most recent 1-0 in Serie B 2003/04).

**On all but two occasions Napoli have scored at home against Como, for a total of 41 goals.** The only two games in which Napoli failed to score were a 0-0 in Serie B 1948/49 and a 0-1, also in Serie B 2003/04.

**The only draw between the teams in Naples was recorded on 18 August 1999 in the Coppa Italia:** 1-1, with Comazzi putting the visitors ahead and Lombardi equalising for Napoli.

**Como's most recent win in Naples—1-0 in Serie B—dates back to 7 September 2003, the opening day,** one of the very few matches played that day due to the Serie B strike. The decisive goal was scored by Mauro Bressan.

**Napoli have been awarded the most penalties (3) and have also conceded the most (3,** level with Fiorentina) after nine matchdays of Serie A 2025/26.

**Napoli are one of three teams that, in the second halves of Serie A 2025/26,** have gained the most points compared to their scores at half-time: +7, along with Roma and Juventus.

Napoli have scored the most goals in the first 15 minutes after the break, with 5 of their 16 total goals.

**Napoli are unbeaten at home in 16 official matches across last season and this one:** 13 wins (six in the last six) and 3 draws. Their last home defeat was a 0-1 loss to Lazio in Serie A on 8 December 2024.

**Napoli have scored in each of their last 16 home matches, 31 goals in total.**

**Como are unbeaten in eight official matches, with a record of four wins and four draws;** their last defeat was 0-1 at Bologna in Serie A on 31 August.

For Antonio Conte and Cesc Fàbregas this is their third official meeting; last season they split the head-to-head: Napoli-Como 3-1 and Como-Napoli 2-1.

**As a player, Antonio Conte faced Como on 22 February 2003: Como-Juventus 1-3** (Camoranesi, Di Vaio and a Juarez own goal for Juventus; Pecchia for Como).



NAPOLI



COMO

**Stefan Posch returned to the scoresheet on Wednesday night after a year and five months;** his previous goal dated back to 11 May 2024 in Serie A, Napoli-Bologna.

**Against Verona, Anastasios Douvikas scored his fifth goal of the season—**his seventh for Como—with all of his goals coming at the Sinigaglia.

**Nico Paz scored his only Champions League goal against Napoli (29 November 2023) in Real Madrid-Napoli 4-2.**

**It was Mërgim Vojvoda's fifth goal against Italian opposition;** since Wednesday, Verona have become his favourite target with two goals, after the one he netted at the Bentegodi for Torino in May 2021 (Serie A).

**On Tuesday night, Vanja Milinković-Savić saved his seventh penalty** since playing for Italian clubs, denying Francesco Camarda.

**Against Lecce, Zambo Anguissa scored his 13th Serie A goal** and is third among Cameroonian scorers in the top flight, behind Samuel Eto'o (35) and Patrick Mboma (20).



CREMONESE



JUVENTUS

**There have been eight official meetings between the sides in Cremona, all in Serie A:** the hosts have never won. The record shows four draws (most recent 3-3 in 1995/96) and four Juventus victories (most recent 1-0 in 2022/23).

**Cremonese have 14 points after nine matchdays:** for the Grigiorossi, it's their best start in the three-points-for-a-win era. It's also the best performance by a promoted side since 2014/15.

**Across their last 13 official games, spanning last season and this one, Cremonese's only defeat came away to Inter (1-4 in Serie A on 4 October).** In between, they recorded five wins and seven draws.

**Cremonese concede the most goals at the start of the second half:** three between minutes 46 and 60, level with Udinese, Milan, Cagliari and Pisa.

**Today marks Juventus's 128th birthday, founded on 1 November 1897.**

**Juventus lead Serie A 2025/26 for goals by substitutes: four in the first nine matchdays.**

**Juventus are one of three teams in Serie A 2025/26 that have gained the most points in second halves compared to their half-time scores: +7, along with Roma and Napoli.**

**Juventus are prolific in the final 15 minutes (plus stoppage time).** They are the top-scoring Serie A 2025/26 side in this phase, with five goals.

Juventus have scored in seven of their eight matches in Cremona, 14 goals in total. **The only blank was a 0-0 in Serie A 1929/30.**

**Between Davide Nicola and Luciano Spalletti there have been five previous meetings as managers,** all won by Juventus's new head coach.

**As a player, Davide Nicola faced Juventus three times, with a perfectly balanced record: one win, one draw and one defeat.** The most recent was Juventus-Spezia 2-3 in Serie B.

**Luciano Spalletti is making his fifth mid-season appointment in Italy,** after Sampdoria 1998/99, Udinese 2000/01, Ancona 2001/02 and Roma 2015/16.



CREMONESE



JUVENTUS

**Luciano Spalletti has always drawn his debut match after taking over:** Sampdoria-Cagliari 0-0, Reggina-Udinese 1-1, Ancona-Palermo 3-3, and Roma-Verona 1-1. Despite his impact, Sampdoria were relegated to Serie B at the end of the season; Udinese finished 12th; Ancona stayed up in Serie B; and Roma ended third, qualifying for the Champions League with that Serie A's best attack (83 goals).

**Luciano Spalletti mathematically clinched his first promotion to Serie A as a coach in Cremona,** winning 1-0 with Empoli on the final day of the 1996/97 Serie B season (15 June 1997), thanks to a decisive goal by Carmine Esposito.

**His most recent Italian club match on the bench was on 4 June 2023:** Napoli-Sampdoria 2-0 in the league.

With his brace at Marassi, **Federico Bonazzoli reached double figures for Cremonese: 10 goals in 35 official games**, eight of them away from home; this season it's four out of four away.

**Bonazzoli recorded his second Serie A brace and the fourth of his professional career—his first for Cremonese.** His scoring rate stands at 10 goals in 1,778 minutes, effectively one every two matches in Grigiorosso.

**It was Federico Gatti's second goal of the season—after the one at Villarreal in the Champions League; he had never previously scored twice by the end of October in his professional career.**

**Dušan Vlahović is on 90 Serie A goals and is the Serbian with the most goals in the competition.** The podium is completed by Sergej Milinković-Savić (57) and Dejan Stanković (51).



**At Verona, the two sides have met 36 times in competitive fixtures:** 6 wins for the Gialloblù (most recently 1-0 in Serie A 1991/92), 11 draws (most recently 2-2 in Serie A 2023/24), and 19 Nerazzurri victories (most recently 5-0 in last season's Serie A).

**Since Verona's last win at the Bentegodi, there have been 14 meetings with 4 draws and 10 Inter victories.**

**Inter have scored in all of their last 14 matches, totaling 38 goals.**

**Two contrasting sides in terms of goal scorers in Serie A 2025/26:** Verona (like Pisa and Parma) have had just 3 different players on the scoresheet, while Inter boast 10 (matching Atalanta).

**In the opening 15 minutes, Verona have conceded more goals than any other Serie A side in 2025/26** (4, level with Udinese), **while Inter have scored the most** (4, alongside Lazio).

**Both sides are among the six teams in Serie A 2025/26 who have conceded the most goals from opposition substitutes after 9 rounds** – 3 apiece, alongside Parma, Atalanta, Cagliari, and Lecce.

**Verona are one of four Serie A sides still without a win after 9 rounds in 2025/26, alongside Genoa, Pisa, and Fiorentina.** Their last victory came on May 25, a 2-1 win at Empoli that secured survival for the Venetians and condemned the Tuscans to Serie B.

**Verona haven't gone winless through the first 9 matches of a Serie A season since 2015/16,** when they finished bottom with 28 points and were relegated to Serie B.

**Verona haven't won at home since February 23, a 1-0 victory over Fiorentina.** Since then, the Gialloblù have registered 8 draws and 3 defeats in 11 competitive fixtures at the Bentegodi across last season and this.

**In Chivu's first 9 matches in charge, including the Club World Cup, Inter conceded 11 goals—an average of 1.22 per game.** In their last 7 outings, the Nerazzurri have shipped just 4 goals, averaging 0.57 with 4 clean sheets.

**Inter boast the best attack in Serie A 2025/26 after 9 rounds, with 22 goals scored.**

**This is the second competitive meeting between Paolo Zanetti and Cristian Chivu,** with their only previous encounter ending 0-0 when Verona hosted Parma on March 31, 2025 in Serie A.



**Cristian Chivu faced Verona as a player on December 18, 2012 in the Coppa Italia:** Inter ran out 2-0 winners with goals from Cassano and Guarin.

**Suat Serdar has netted his second goal of the season, matching his tally from his debut campaign in yellow and blue.** Remarkably, all four of the German-born midfielder's goals for Verona have come away from home.

**Since joining Italian football, Hakan Calhanoglu has taken 32 penalties, converting 31 with just one miss—the solitary blot coming in Inter's 1-1 draw with Napoli in November 2024.**

**Hakan Calhanoglu struck his fourth Serie A brace on Wednesday against Fiorentina** — his fourth for Inter and sixth overall with Italian clubs in competitive fixtures. The Viola have now become his favorite victims, with seven goals to his name against them.



FIorentina



LECCE

**There have been 20 official meetings between the sides in Tuscany:** 11 Fiorentina wins (most recent 1-0 in last season's Serie A), five draws (most recent 2-2 in 2023/24) and four Lecce victories (most recent 1-0 in 2019/20).

**Lecce's four wins have all come in the last ten meetings in Tuscany;** the remaining results are four Fiorentina wins and two draws.

After nine rounds of Serie A 2025/26, Fiorentina and Lecce have conceded the most goals in the final half hour plus stoppage time: **8 of Fiorentina's 15 and 8 of Lecce's 14.**

**Fiorentina are still without a win in Serie A 2025/26 after nine matchdays.** It's their worst start in the single-division era; in 1977/78 they earned their first win on matchday 9, 1-0 at Bologna.

**Their last league victory was a 3-2 win at Udine on 25 May.**

**Fiorentina have conceded the joint-most goals in Serie A 2025/26: 15, level with Udinese.**

**Fiorentina are the only team in Serie A 2025/26 to have already faced all of the current top six (Roma, Napoli, the two Milan clubs, Como and Bologna).**


**Lecce have conceded the joint-most goals by opposition substitutes:** three in nine rounds, along with Verona, Inter, Atalanta, Parma and Cagliari.

**There have been 13 official meetings between Stefano Pioli and Eusebio Di Francesco:** eight wins for the Fiorentina coach, one draw and four for Lecce's coach.

**Edin Džeko scored twice against Lecce in the 2019/20 Serie A head-to-head:** Lecce-Roma 0-1 (Džeko 56' ) and Roma-Lecce 4-0.

**Francesco Camarda made his Serie A debut on 25 November 2023 in Milan-Fiorentina 1-0, coming on in the 83rd minute. At 15 years and 260 days he became the youngest debutant in Serie A history.**

**Wladimiro Falcone has played 123 Serie A matches for Lecce** and ranks fourth on the club's all-time list. Next up is the podium: third place is Lorenzo Stovini on 125.



**There have been 11 official meetings between the sides in Turin:** 8 Torino wins (most recent 1-0 in the Coppa Italia last September), 2 draws (most recent 0-0 in Serie A 1988/89), and 1 Pisa victory (2-0 in Serie A 1982/83).

**This is their second meeting of the season after the Coppa Italia round of 32, which Torino won 1-0 at home, with Casadei deciding it in the 9th minute.**

**Pisa's only win away to Torino came on 8 May 1983:** a 2-0 Serie A victory with goals from Todesco and Sorbi.

**Although there have been 11 games between them in Turin, two are historic:** 29 September 1968, Pisa's first-ever Serie A match (1-0 Torino, Emiliano Mondonico with the winner), and 4 June 1991 (2-1 Torino after extra time in the Mitropa Cup final, won thanks to goals by Martín Vázquez—penalty—and Carillo after Polidori had put the Tuscans ahead).

**Pisa have not scored on Torino's ground since Polidori's goal in that June 1991 Mitropa Cup final;** the Nerazzurri's drought there totals 216 minutes, as the final went to extra time.

**Torino are unbeaten in four league matches (2 wins, 2 draws);** their last defeat was 0-2 at Parma on 29 September.

**One third of Torino's goals conceded in Serie A 2025/26 have arrived in the 15 minutes before half-time,** including stoppage time—5 of their 14.

**Pisa have conceded in 13 straight Serie A away games spanning the end of 1990/91 (their last top-flight season before now) and this season:** 30 goals in total. Their last away clean sheet was a 2-0 win at Roma on 20 January 1991.

**Pisa's last Serie A victory dates back to 12 May 1991:** Pisa-Bari 1-0. Between that season and the current one, the Tuscans are winless in 11 league matches.

**Pisa have recorded the most 0-0 draws in Serie A 2025/26:** three in nine games, level with Parma.

**Pisa have the fewest different scorers in Serie A 2025/26:** three so far, level with Verona and Parma.



**Pisa concede the most goals in the first 15 minutes of the second half:** 3 conceded between minutes 46 and 60, level with Milan, Udinese, Cagliari and Cremonese.

**This is the fifth official meeting between Marco Baroni and Alberto Gilardino:** in the two Verona-Genoa clashes in Serie A 2023/24, Gilardino won both; in 2024/25, Lazio-Genoa finished 3-0 (a Baroni win); and in this year's Coppa Italia tie, Torino-Pisa ended 1-0.

**As a player, Gilardino faced Torino 20 times, with a record of 6 wins for the current Pisa coach, 6 draws and 8 Torino victories.**

**As a player, Gilardino scored five career goals against Torino and also missed a penalty against the Granata in the 2006/07 season.**

**Alberto Paleari has conceded just one goal in his three starts for Torino (two in Serie A and one in the Coppa Italia).**



PARMA



BOLOGNA

**The two teams have met 25 times in Parma, with Bologna winning eight times** (most recently 2-0 in last season's Serie A), 12 draws (most recently 2-2 in the 2019/20 Serie A) and five wins for Bologna (most recently 3-0 in the 2020/21 Serie A).

**The historic precedent was the 2004/05 relegation play-off: Parma remained in Serie A, losing 0-1 at home in the first leg and overturning the result in the return leg with a 2-0 win at the Dall'Ara.**

**Parma have not scored at the Tardini for 198 minutes:** their last goal was scored by Pellegrino in the 72nd minute of Parma 2-1 Torino on September 29.

**Parma have the lowest scoring attack in Serie A 2025/26, with only four goals scored, equal to Genoa,** and the team with the fewest players scoring, three, like Pisa and Verona.

**Parma is the only team in Serie A not to have scored or conceded a goal between the 1st and 30th minutes of play.**

**Parma is one of six teams to have conceded the most goals from substitutes,** three in nine games, alongside Atalanta, Verona, Inter, Lecce, and Cagliari.

**Parma is the team with the most 0-0 draws in Serie A 2025/26: three in nine games, along with Pisa.**

**Bologna are unbeaten in their last 7 official matches:** 3 wins and 4 draws, with their last defeat coming in Birmingham in the Europa League, 0-1 on September 26.

This will be the first ever meeting between Carlos Cuesta and Vincenzo Italiano.

**During his playing career, Vincenzo Italiano took to the field against Parma six times,** with a record of three wins, one draw, and two wins for the Ducali.

**Vincenzo Italiano has made 200 appearances on the bench in Serie A, with a record of 80 wins, 54 draws, and 65 defeats.** He made his debut on September 27, 2020, in Spezia-Sassuolo 1-4.

Patrick Cutrone scored a goal against Bologna on September 14, 2024, in the Como-Bologna 2-2 match.

Riccardo Orsolini has already scored at the Tardini wearing the Bologna shirt, on February 7, 2021: Parma-Bologna 0-3.



MILAN



ROMA

**There have been 101 official matches between the two teams at San Siro**, with Milan winning 53 (the last 3-1 in last year's Coppa Italia), 26 draws (the last 1-1 in last year's Serie A) and Roma winning 22 (the last 1-0 in the 2023/24 Europa League).

**The Rossoneri's 2010/11 Scudetto under coach Massimiliano Allegri was mathematically secured on matchday 36 of that tournament, with a 0-0 draw at Roma.** In 2003/04, it was also a victory, this time 1-0 at San Siro, that kicked off Milan's tricolor celebrations on matchday 32 in a league still structured around 18 teams. Shevchenko scored the decisive goal after two minutes.

**Roma have scored in seven official matches against Milan, with a total of 10 goals:** the last match without a goal was on June 28, 2020, when Milan beat Roma 2-0 in the league.

**Milan are unbeaten in nine official matches, with seven wins and two draws.** The Rossoneri's last defeat was a 2-1 loss to Cremonese at San Siro on August 24, in their Serie A opener.

**In their last nine home games, the Rossoneri have always scored, with a total of 18 goals. Their last game without scoring was Milan 0-1 Atalanta (Serie A, April 20).**

**Milan are the team that concede the most goals in the first 15 minutes of the second half:** three of the Rossoneri's seven goals conceded in this period of the game, along with Verona, Inter, Cagliari, Atalanta, and Cremonese.

**Roma have not drawn since the derby at Lazio on April 13, which ended 1-1.** In the following 18 official games, between the old and new seasons, they have recorded 12 wins and 6 defeats.

**Roma have the best defense in Serie A 2025/26 with only 4 goals conceded.**

**Roma are one of three teams in Serie A 2025/26 who earn more points in the second half than in the first 45 minutes:** +7, along with Napoli and Juventus.

**Massimiliano Allegri and Gian Piero Gasperini have faced each other 29 times in official matches**, with 13 wins for the Rossoneri coach, 10 draws, and 6 wins for Gasperini.

**Massimiliano Allegri has his best month in November with 2.21 points per game at the helm of Italian clubs**, with a record of 43 wins, 13 draws, and 8 losses in 64 games played.



MILAN



ROMA

**Against Atalanta, Samuele Ricci scored his first goal in a Milan shirt and his sixth in Serie A.** Five of these six goals have come away from home.

**Rafael Leao has scored two goals against Roma in his career: on January 6, 2021 (Milan 3-1 Roma) and on September 1, 2023 (Roma 1-2 Milan).**

**Matteo Gabbia is the only Milan player to have played every minute of the 2025/26 Serie A season so far.**

**Mario Hermoso scored his first Serie A goal in Wednesday's match against Parma.** He had already scored for Roma on December 12, 2024, against Sporting Braga in the Europa League. Both goals were scored at the Olimpico and in the second half.

**Artem Dovbyk has already scored against Milan in the Coppa Italia on February 5, 2025: Milan-Roma 3-1.**



SASSUOLO



GENOA

**In Emilia, the two sides have met 10 times:** 6 home wins for the Neroverdi (most recently 2-1 in Serie A 2020/21), 2 draws (most recently 1-1 in Serie A 2021/22), and 2 victories for the Grifone (most recently 2-1 in Serie A 2023/24).

**Domenico Berardi is the top scorer in the 10 meetings at Sassuolo's home ground with 3 goals** – one each in the 2014/15, 2019/20, and 2021/22 campaigns.

**Sassuolo have been flying in their last 7 matches, averaging nearly 2 points per game:** after defeats in the opening two rounds, they've collected 13 points from the following seven.

**Seven of the Neroverdi's 10 goals this season have come in the final half-hour plus stoppage time.**

**Genoa remain winless in Serie A 2025/26, alongside Pisa, Verona, and Fiorentina.** The Grifone's last victory came on May 24, a 3-1 triumph at Bologna.

**Genoa are the lowest scorers in the league with just 4 goals in 9 rounds, matching Parma's tally.**

**Genoa have dropped more points in the second half compared to their half-time positions than any other side in Serie A 2025/26: -7.**

Seven of the Rossoblù's 13 goals conceded have arrived in the final half-hour, including stoppage time.

**This is the first competitive meeting between Fabio Grosso and Patrick Vieira as managers.** The pair were teammates at Inter during the 2006/07 season.

**Andrea Pinamonti and Armand Laurienté have scored 5 of Sassuolo's 10 goals so far** – exactly 50%.

**Domenico Berardi has netted 11 braces in Serie A**, including one against Genoa on January 18, 2021, in a 3-3 draw.

**Armand Laurienté has 14 Serie A goals for Sassuolo and sits two short of the Neroverdi's all-time top ten in the top flight**, where Sansone, Scamacca, and Traoré are tied on 16.



SASSUOLO



GENOA

**Andrea Pinamonti sits sixth in the all-time Serie A scoring charts for the Neroverdi with 19 goals.** His next target is fourth place, currently shared by Zaza and Politano on 20 goals apiece.

**Johan Vasquez and Norton Cuffy** are the only outfield players for Genoa to have featured in every minute of Serie A 2025/26 so far.



LAZIO



CAGLIARI

**There have been 42 previous official matches between the two teams in Rome**, with Lazio winning 29 (the last 2-1 in last year's Serie A), six draws (the last 2-2 in Serie A 2021/22) and seven wins for Cagliari (the last 1-0 in Serie A 2009/10).

**Lazio have scored in 13 consecutive games when hosting Cagliari**: a total of 29 goals and their last defeat dating back to October 28, 2009, 1-0 to the Rossoblù.

**Cagliari's only victory, which remains the last Sardinian victory at the Olimpico to date**, was 1-0 with the decisive goal scored by Matri (Sardinian coach Massimiliano Allegri).

**In Lazio-Cagliari matches in general, the players who have scored the most goals in the last 30 years are**: Ciro Immobile (11 goals), Tommaso Rocchi (8 goals), and Miroslav Klose (5 goals). In fourth place is Alessandro Matri with 4 goals.

**Lazio is the most prolific team in Serie A 2025/26 in the first 15 minutes of play**: 4 goals scored by the Biancocelesti (like Inter).

**Cagliari are the team that have conceded the most goals after the break: 3 goals conceded between the 46th and 60th minutes of play**, like Milan, Atalanta, Pisa, Udinese, and Cremonese.

**Cagliari are one of the six Serie A 2025/26 teams that concede the most goals from opposing substitutes**, 3, like Parma, Inter, Verona, Atalanta, and Lecce.

This is the first official meeting between Maurizio Sarri and Fabio Pisacane as coaches.

**Fabio Pisacane faced Lazio five times as a player**, with a record of four wins for the Biancocelesti and one draw.

**Mattia Zaccagni has scored two goals against Cagliari**. The first goal was on December 6, 2020, in the Verona-Cagliari 1-1 match; the second was on November 4, 2024 (Lazio-Cagliari 2-1).

Zito Luvumbo scored two goals last year in Serie A, one of which was against Lazio at the Olimpico.
