



INSIGHTS - MATCHDAY 11

SERIE A - 2025/2026



For the first time in the history of Serie A's single-group era (from 1929/30 to the present), three teams are still winless after 10 matchdays: Fiorentina, Pisa and Verona.

Compared with Matchday 10 of the 2024/25 season, there have been 58 fewer goals: 221 have been scored in Serie A so far, versus 279 twelve months ago.

So far in the 2025/26 Serie A season, 41.6% of all goals (94 out of 226) have been scored in the final half-hour plus stoppage time.

On 7 November 1944—the day the Matchday 11 opener will be played—Gigi Riva was born. He remains Cagliari's all-time top scorer in Serie A (156 goals from 1964 to 1976) and the Italy national team's record scorer (35 goals in 42 caps, winning the 1968 European Championship). He was also Serie A's top scorer three times, in 1966/67, 1968/69 and 1969/70, with 18, 20 and 21 goals respectively.

On Saturday, 8 November, Sandro Mazzola turns 83. Born in Turin in 1942, he made his Serie A debut on 10 June 1961 in Juventus–Inter 9–1, a match in which Inter fielded their youth team and Omar Sivori scored six goals. Mazzola spent his entire career with Inter, where he won four Serie A titles, two European Cups and two Intercontinental Cups, and he was the joint Serie A top scorer in 1964/65 with 17 goals (alongside Fiorentina's Orlando). With the national team he won the 1968 European Championship.

On Sunday, 9 November, Alessandro Del Piero turns 51. Born in Conegliano Veneto, he made his debut with Padova before becoming a Juventus icon, and he is the club's all-time leader in appearances (705) and goals (289) in official competitions. He won one Viareggio Cup, six Serie A titles, one Coppa Italia, four Italian Super Cups, one UEFA Champions League, one Intercontinental Cup and one UEFA Super Cup. With the national team, he was one of the key figures in Italy's triumph at the 2006 World Cup in Germany.



PISA



CREMONESE

In Pisa, the official head-to-head record between the two sides stands at 23 matches: 12 nerazzurri wins (latest 2-1 in last year's Serie B), 5 draws (latest 0-0 in Serie B 2023/24) and 6 grigiorossi victories (latest 1-0 in Serie C1 2006/07).

Pisa haven't won a league match since their home game against Cremonese, 2-1 in Serie B last 13 May (goals from Moreo, Tourè and Bonazzoli pulling one back for the grigiorossi).

It's the first time Pisa-Cremonese is being played in Serie A.

Cremonese haven't won in Pisa since 18 March 2007, 1-0 in Serie C1. The decisive goal was scored by Leandro Vitiello.

No team has conceded more goals than Pisa and Cremonese in the first 15' of the second half (3), level with Milan, Genoa, Udinese and Cagliari.

Pisa haven't scored at home yet in this Serie A: the last nerazzurri goal at the Arena in the top flight dates back to 12 May 1991 in a Pisa-Bari 1-0, Fiorentini's goal in the 76th minute. Since then, the goal drought has reached 554'. Moreover, the Tuscans haven't won yet in this Serie A (along with Verona and Fiorentina); their last victory dates back to that very Pisa-Bari. Since then, 12,598 days have passed since their last win in the top flight.

Pisa hold 2 records in Serie A 2025/26 after 10 rounds: most penalties taken (3, level with Napoli) and fewest different goalscorers (4, like Verona and Parma).

Pisa are the second team to concede most goals in the final 15' of the first half: 4 goals out of 14 total (Torino first with 5).

Between Alberto Gilardino and Davide Nicola, second official meeting: the only previous encounter was Empoli-Genoa 0-0 in February 2024 in Serie A.

First two goals and first brace in Serie A (and for Pisa) for Stefano Moreo, who during his professional career had scored only one other brace before last Sunday, in Serie C1, in a Savona-Virtus Entella 2-2 in April 2014 (nearly 12 years ago), wearing the Ligurian shirt.

Before Moreo in Torino-Pisa, a Tuscan player hadn't scored a brace in Serie A since 24 March 1991: on that occasion Michele Padovano's goals in a Parma-Pisa 2-3.



COMO



CAGLIARI

In Como, the two sides have met 24 times in official competitions: **13 wins for Como** (most recent: 3-1 in last season's Serie A), **six draws** (most recent: 1-1 in Serie B 2022/23) and **five wins for Cagliari** (most recent: 3-1 in Serie B 2003/04).

Como have a perfect home record against the Sardinians in their four Serie A meetings, with an aggregate score of 11-3 in Como's favour.

Cagliari's last three wins at the Sinigaglia all came in Serie B: in 1977/78 (0-1), 1989/90 (0-1) and 2003/04 (1-3). On each of those occasions, Cagliari subsequently won promotion to Serie A.

Como are one of the three teams in Serie A 2025/26 with the most red cards so far (two, level with Lazio and Parma).

Como are on an eight-match unbeaten run, with a record of three wins and five draws. Their last defeat was 1-0 away to Bologna on 31 August.

Como have lost at home only once in their last 14 official matches: nine wins and four draws, with the sole setback a 2-0 defeat to Inter on 23 May.

Cagliari are one of three teams in Serie A 2025/26 who always use all five substitutions; the others are Torino and Bologna.

No team have conceded more goals than Cagliari in the first 15 minutes of the second half (3; level with Milan, Pisa, Genoa, Cremonese and Udinese).

Cagliari are one of six sides in Serie A 2025/26 to have conceded the most goals to opposition substitutes: 3, level with Atalanta, Lecce, Parma, Inter and Verona.

This will be the first official match between Cesc Fàbregas and Fabio Pisacane.

Fabio Pisacane faced Como four times as a player: one win apiece and two draws.

Leonardo Pavoletti has scored once against Como in his career, in Cagliari 2-0 Como on 14 January 2023 in Serie B.



LECCE



VERONA

There have been 24 official meetings between the two sides in Salento: 12 giallorossi wins (latest 1-0 in last year's Serie A), 5 draws (latest 1-1 in Serie B 2002/03) and 7 Veneto victories (latest 1-0 in Serie A 2023/24).

The last 4 clashes in Lecce between the two teams have all ended 1-0: one victory for the giallorossi, 3 for the gialloblù.

A draw at the Via del Mare has been missing for 22 years: the last time was in May 2003, 1-1 in Serie B with goals from Giacomazzi for the hosts and a Silvestri own goal for Verona; since then, 6 meetings with 3 wins apiece.

Lecce's very first Serie A match, dated 8 September 1985, was against Verona, fresh from winning their first scudetto the previous season. The final score was 2-2 at the Bentegodi with goals from Elkjaer Larsen and Di Gennaro for the hosts, Nobile and Paciocco for the Salento side.

Lecce still without home wins in this Serie A 2025/26: the giallorossi's last victory dates back to 18 May, 1-0 over Torino.

Lecce and Verona are the teams that have conceded most goals from substitutes in this Serie A (3, like Inter, Cagliari, Parma and Atalanta).

Verona are the team conceding most goals in the first 15' in this Serie A (4, like Udinese). The scaligeri also concede most in the final 15' of matches, with 6 goals shipped.

Verona are the team that have conceded most goals so far (16, like Torino and Fiorentina).

Verona are the team that have so far used fewest different goalscorers (4, like Pisa and Parma).

Verona are one of 3 teams in Serie A 2025/26 still without a win, along with Pisa and Fiorentina. The scaligeri's last league win dates back to the 1-2 at Empoli on 25 May, the match that sealed gialloblù safety and the Tuscans' relegation to Serie B.

Verona without wins in Serie A after 10 rounds: it hadn't happened since the 2015/16 season (the first win came in the 23rd round, 2-1 over Atalanta on 3 February 2016).



LECCE



VERONA

Between Eusebio Di Francesco and Paolo Zanetti, third official meeting as coaches. The two previous encounters date back to last season in the double clash between Venezia and Verona, with a record of 1 win for Zanetti and one draw.

Eusebio Di Francesco is the ex of the day: he coached the scaligeri for 4 official matches between August and September 2021. One victory (3-0 over Catanzaro in Coppa Italia) and 3 defeats in Serie A 2021/22.

Eusebio Di Francesco hasn't won at home yet at the helm of Lecce in Serie A: 11 games between 2011/12 and the current season, with a record of 3 draws and 8 defeats.

Paolo Zanetti as a player faced Lecce as an opponent 5 times: record of 1 win apiece and 3 draws, with a goal scored by the current Verona coach in a Torino-Lecce 3-0 in August 2008, in Serie A, a goal that represents his second and last in his Serie A career.

Against Fiorentina, second Serie A goal for Medon Berisha, both away and within a week (25 October in Udine, 2 November in Florence).

Against Inter, Giovane scored his first Serie A goal, in his tenth appearance in the top flight.



The official head-to-head record between the two sides at Juventus' home stands at 90 matches: 50 bianconeri wins (latest 2-0 in last year's Serie A), 23 draws (latest 1-1 in Serie A 2021/22) and 17 granata victories (latest 1-2 in Serie A 1994/95).

The 1-2 win secured by Torino against Juventus on 9 April 1995 (Rizzitelli brace and Maltagliati own goal) **is the granata's last at the bianconeri's home:** in the subsequent 21 clashes, record of 16 Juventus wins and 5 draws.

In the last 16 derbies at the bianconeri's home, Juventus have always scored with a total of 36 goals; last goalless clash on 26 February 2008, 0-0 in Serie A.

Torino have drawn a blank at Juventus' home for 227'; last goal scored by Sanabria in the 43rd minute of the derby lost 2-4 by the granata on 28 February 2023.

On 23 May 1988 Juventus-Torino was a playoff to qualify for the 1988/89 UEFA Cup: after 0-0 in 120', the bianconeri won on penalties 4-2.

Juventus are the team scoring most goals in the final 15' of matches (5, like Inter).

Juventus have so far set 3 records in this Serie A: they're the team using most different goalscorers (11, level with Inter), scoring most goals with substitutes (4) and gaining most points in second halves compared to first-half results (+7, like Roma and Napoli).

Juventus have won 2 of their last 11 official matches between Serie A and Champions League: remaining record of 6 draws and 3 defeats.

Torino are one of three teams in Serie A 2025/26 always making all 5 substitutions: like the granata, Bologna and Cagliari.

Torino are the team that have conceded most goals in the final 15' of the first half: 5 out of 16 total.

Torino are the team conceding most goals in Serie A 2025/26: 16, like Verona and Fiorentina.

Between Luciano Spalletti and Marco Baroni, fifth official meeting as coaches: the bianconero boss unbeaten with 3 wins and 1 draw in his favour. Moreover, Spalletti's teams have always scored in these clashes, with a goal difference of 8-4.



Luciano Spalletti is set for the first Turin derby of his career. The former Italy head coach has already managed in the Rome and Milan city derbies. With Roma he recorded six wins, two draws and five defeats across 13 Derby della Capitale; with Inter he posted three wins, one draw and one defeat in five Derby della Madonnina.

Marco Baroni is a former Juventus man for the day: the Torino coach led Juventus' Primavera side in 2011/12 and 2012/13, winning one Viareggio Cup and one Coppa Italia at youth level.

As a player, Marco Baroni won an Italian Super Cup against Juventus while at Napoli, a 5-1 victory for the Azzurri.

Filip Kostić has scored in Serie A again after more than two and a half years; his previous goal before last Saturday in Cremona came in a 1-1 Inter-Juventus draw. Kostić is now on four Serie A goals, all scored in first halves.

Andrea Cambiaso has scored four of his six Serie A goals between the 65th and 70th minutes (one at 66', two at 68' and one at 69').

Giovanni Simeone is one of the two most-substituted players in the 2025/26 Serie A season: he has been taken off nine times, level with Armand Laurienté (Sassuolo).



PARMA



MILAN

The two sides have met 34 times in official matches at the Tardini: Parma have 9 wins (most recent: 2-1 in last season's Serie A), there have been 10 draws (most recent: 1-1 in Serie A 2018/19), and Milan have 15 wins (most recent: 3-1 in Serie A 2020/21).

Milan have scored in nine consecutive games at the Tardini (17 goals in total); their last blank there was a 1-0 Serie A defeat on 24 March 2010.

Parma vs Milan has been a trophy decider on three occasions: in the 1992 Italian Super Cup, Milan prevailed 2-1 at San Siro; in the 1993 UEFA Super Cup, Parma won 2-0 at San Siro after Milan's 1-0 first-leg victory at the Tardini; Parma repeated the feat in the 1999 Italian Super Cup, winning 2-1 at San Siro.

Parma have scored the fewest goals in Serie A 2025/26: 5 in 10 matchdays.

Parma have the fewest different scorers: 4, level with Pisa and Verona.

Parma have received the most red cards (2, level with Lazio and Como).

Parma are among the sides conceding the most goals to opposition substitutes (3, level with Inter, Verona, Lecce, Cagliari and Atalanta).

Parma have taken 2 points from their last 5 league games (3 defeats and 2 draws). They have not won since 29 September, when they beat Torino 2-1 at the Tardini.

Milan are unbeaten in nine matchdays, with 6 wins and 3 draws. **The Rossoneri's only defeat came on Matchday 1, when Cremonese won 2-1 at San Siro on 24 August.**

This will be the first official meeting between Carlos Cuesta and Massimiliano Allegri.

Strahinja Pavlović has scored his second goal of the 2025/26 Serie A season, matching last year's tally in a Milan shirt. His 2 goals in 2024/25 both came away from home; this season both have been at San Siro. The Serbian defender's personal best is 3 goals, set in 2023/24 with Salzburg (Austrian Bundesliga).

Milan Đurić has made the most substitute appearances in Serie A 2025/26: 9 outings (42 minutes in total), all coming off the bench.



ATALANTA



SASSUOLO

In Bergamo there have been 16 meetings between the two sides: 13 nerazzurri wins (latest 3-0 in Serie A 2023/24), 2 draws (latest 1-1 in Serie A 2016/17) and 1 neroverde success (2-0 in Serie A 2013/14).

Atalanta come into this on 9 consecutive home wins against Sassuolo, who last came away from Bergamo unscathed in the 1-1 on 8 April 2017 (Cristante's goal for the nerazzurri and Lorenzo Pellegrini for the neroverdi, now teammates at Gasperini's Roma).

Only on the occasion of Sassuolo's sole win in Bergamo, 2-0 in April 2014 (Sansone brace), **have Atalanta failed to score in home clashes against the Emilians.** In the other 15 games the nerazzurri goals have totalled 36.

Domenico Berardi has scored 4 goals at the Bergamo stadium, one each in Serie A 2014/15, 2015/16, 2018/19 and 2021/22.

Mario Pasalic on target 3 times against Parma, in the 2018/19, 2022/23 and 2023/24 campaigns.

Atalanta are the team scoring most goals in the final 15' of the first half: 5 nerazzurri goals netted from the 31st to 45th minute including stoppage time.

Atalanta one of 6 sides in Serie A 2025/26 conceding most goals from opposition substitutes, 3, level with Verona, Inter, Parma, Cagliari and Lecce.

The nerazzurri without league wins since 21 September, 3-0 at Torino's home; then 6 rounds with 5 draws and 1 defeat, last Saturday in Udine, 0-1, ex-player Zaniolo's goal.

Between Ivan Juric and Fabio Grosso, first official meeting. As a player 8 encounters between Fabio Grosso and the Bergamo side: 4-2 the tally of wins for the current neroverde boss and 2 draws.

Armand Laurienté is one of the two most substituted players in Serie A 2025/26 at the 10th round: 9 times taken off early, like Simeone (Torino).

Against Genoa, after almost two years Domenico Berardi returned to scoring in Serie A from open play; the last had been in November 2023 in Empoli, where he scored a brace and began his run of goals from the spot, the last 3 consecutive before last Monday.



BOLOGNA



NAPOLI

There have been 74 official meetings between the sides in Emilia: Bologna have 33 wins (most recent: 3-2 in Serie A 2018/19), there have been 20 draws (most recent: 1-1 in last season's Serie A), and Napoli have 21 wins (most recent: 2-0 in Serie A 2021/22).

The clash in Bologna has ended level in each of the last three seasons: 1-1 in 2024/25, 0-0 in 2023/24 and 2-2 in 2022/23.

Napoli's most recent win dates back to 17 January 2022, a 2-0 victory sealed by a Lozano brace.

Bologna's last win was a 3-2 on 25 May 2019, with goals from Santander (two) and Dzemaili for the hosts, and Ghoulam and Mertens for Napoli.

Bologna's first-ever victory in the single-group Serie A era came against Napoli on 27 October 1929 (Matchday 4): a 3-1 win with goals by Pilati IV, Maini and Schiavio; Buscaglia scored for Napoli.

Santiago Castro recorded his first brace in Italy last Sunday at Parma. The 2004-born Argentine has reached 15 goals in 65 matches for Bologna, across 3,807 minutes played—one goal every 254 minutes.

Napoli are the team that score the most in the first 15 minutes of the second half: 5 goals between the 46th and 60th minutes, out of 16 total.

Napoli, along with Pisa, have been awarded the most penalties in Serie A—three in 10 matchdays—but they have also conceded the most: 4.

Napoli are one of three Serie A 2025/26 sides to gain the most points after half-time compared to the half-time scoreline: +7, level with Juventus and Roma.

There have been four official meetings between Vincenzo Italiano and Antonio Conte: 2 draws and 2 wins in favour of the Napoli coach.

As a player, Italiano faced Napoli seven times: 1 win for the current Bologna boss, 4 draws and 2 Napoli victories.

Against Como, **Vanja Milinković-Savić saved an Álvaro Morata penalty—his eighth penalty save since playing in Italian club football. Since 2024/25, he has saved 6 of the 11 penalties faced in Serie A.**



GENOA



FIorentINA

The official head-to-head record between the two sides at Marassi stands at 59 matches, with 19 Genoa wins (latest 2-1, in Serie A 2019/20), 22 draws (latest 1-1, in Serie A 2020/21) and 18 Fiorentina successes (latest 1-0, in last year's Serie A).

The viola have won all of their last 3 clashes at Genoa's Ferraris. Genoa haven't beaten Fiorentina at home since 1 September 2019, 2-1 in Serie A, thanks to goals from Zapata and Kouamè for the hosts, Pulgar from the spot for the viola.

Genoa without home wins in Serie A since 4 April, 1-0 over Udinese. Between last and current season, 2 draws and 6 defeats in the following 8 games played at Marassi.

Genoa haven't scored at home yet in Serie A 2025/26: the last rossoblù league goal dates back to Genoa-Atalanta 2-3 on 17 May, Pinamonti the scorer in the 58th minute. A drought lasting 482'.

Genoa are the Serie A 2025/26 team that have so far received most yellow cards: 28 in 10 games, almost 3 per match on average.

Genoa are the team that have conceded most goals in the first 15' of the second half: 3 goals shipped from the 46th to 60th minute, like Cremonese, Cagliari, Milan, Udinese and Pisa.

Genoa and Fiorentina are the two teams that have lost most points in second halves compared to half-time results, in Serie A 2025/26: -5 for the viola (like Verona), -7 for the Grifone.

Fiorentina are the worst defence in Serie A 2025/26 with 16 goals conceded, level with Torino and Verona.

Fiorentina without a league win: it had never happened after 10 rounds in a Serie A campaign. The Tuscans' last Serie A success dates back to the 3-2 in Udine on 25 May.

Between Roberto Murgita and Daniele Galloppa, first official meeting. Murgita was also registered at Genoa as a player: coming through the youth sector, in the first team he totalled 8 appearances without goals, remaining in rossoblù for two seasons, in 1987/88 and 1993/94.



GENOA

Galloppa as a player counts 11 encounters against Genoa: the overall record reads 2 wins, 5 draws, 4 defeats.

Domenico Criscito, Murgita's assistant, collected as a player wearing Genoa's shirt 291 appearances and 31 goals. Criscito sits sixth in the all-time rossoblù ranking of players with most appearances.



ROMA



UDINESE

There are 54 official meetings between the two sides in Rome with a record of 34 giallorossi wins (latest 3-0, in last year's Serie A), **13 draws** (latest 1-1, in Serie A 2008/09) and **7 bianconeri successes** (latest 2-0, in Serie A 2019/20).

Roma come into this on 5 consecutive home wins against the Friulians, who last came away from the Olimpico unscathed in the 2-0 on 2 July 2020, goals from Lasagna and Nestorovski.

A draw has been missing in Rome between the two sides since 7 March 2009, 1-1 sealed by goals from Vucinic and Felipe; then 17 clashes at the Olimpico, with 15 Roma victories and 2 Friulian ones.

Roma are the best defence in Serie A 2025/26 with 5 goals conceded in 10 matches.

Roma are one of 3 teams in Serie A 2025/26 that, in second halves, gain most points compared to half-time results: +7, like Juventus and Napoli.

Against Milan in the last round, seventh penalty not converted by Paulo Dybala in official matches, since he's been in Italy. The last dated back to a Salernitana-Juventus league match, November 2021.

Udinese are the team conceding most goals in Serie A 2025/26 in the first 15' of play: 4 goals conceded by the Friulians, like Verona.

The Friulians also concede most goals of all in the first 15' of the second half, 3, like Milan, Pisa, Cagliari and Cremonese.

Therefore at the start of both halves Udinese have conceded 7 of their 15 total goals after 10 rounds of the championship.

Udinese without goals only once in the last 13 official matches, including last season. Only blank in the 0-3 home defeat to Milan on 20 September. In the remaining 12 games the Friulian goals totalled 18.

Between Gian Piero Gasperini and Kosta Runjaic, third official meeting: in the two previous encounters, 1 win and 1 draw for the current giallorosso boss.



ROMA



UDINESE

Against Glasgow Rangers in the Europa League, Gian Piero Gasperini celebrates his 900th official match on the bench, of which 609 in Serie A, 109 in Serie B, 34 in Serie C, 62 between Coppa Italia and Serie C Coppa Italia, 79 in European competitions and 7 in other post-season tournaments. Absolute debut on 17 August 2003, Serie C Coppa Italia, Taranto-Crotone 3-3, at the helm of the Calabrian side.

Gian Piero Gasperini in Serie A had never conceded so few goals after 10 rounds: 5.

Nicolò Zaniolo on 3 goals after 10 rounds: only in the 2019/20 season was the Udinese player on 3 goals after the first match in November, finishing the season on 6 wearing Roma's shirt.



INTER



LAZIO

The official head-to-head record between the two sides in Milan stands at 92 matches with 49 Inter wins (latest 2-0, in Coppa Italia 2024/25), **31 draws** (latest 2-2 in last year's Serie A) **and 12 Lazio victories** (latest 1-0, in Serie A 2018/19).

Lazio's last win at San Siro, nerazzurri side, dated 30 March 2019: 1-0 in Serie A, with the decisive goal from Milinkovic-Savic.

In the last 8 matches 6 nerazzurri successes and 2 draws and Inter always on the scoresheet in these 8 clashes (17 goals total).

Last year's 2-2 in Milan, penultimate round of the championship, prevented Inter from overtaking Napoli. Lazio's 2-2 goal was scored deep into stoppage time by Pedro.

Inter-Lazio has been a final to assign titles on 4 occasions: in the 1997/98 UEFA Cup nerazzurri victory 3-0 in Paris; in the 1999/00 Coppa Italia biancoceleste success, 2-1 in the first leg at the Olimpico and 0-0 in the return at San Siro; in the 2000 Supercoppa another biancoceleste triumph, 4-3 at the Olimpico; finally the 2009 Supercoppa, another Lazio success 2-1.

On 15 May 1966 Inter mathematically won the Scudetto beating Lazio 4-1 at San Siro, penultimate round. Goals from Suarez, Mazzola, Governato own goal and Domenghini for the nerazzurri, Renna for the capital side.

Facing each other at San Siro are the two teams in Serie A 2025/26 scoring most goals in the first 15' of play after 10 rounds: 4 apiece.

Inter are the Serie A 2025/26 team scoring most goals in the final 15' of play plus stoppage time: 5, like Juventus.

Inter are the least booked team in Serie A 2025/26: 11 yellow cards received in the first 10 rounds.

Inter with 11 different goalscorers after 10 rounds of Serie A 2025/26: top in Serie A, level with Juventus.

The nerazzurri among the 6 sides in Serie A 2025/26 conceding most goals from opposition substitutes, 3, same as Verona, Lecce, Cagliari, Parma and Atalanta.

Inter on 24 goals in Serie A 2025/26: the best attack in the competition.



INTER



LAZIO

Lazio on a positive run for 6 rounds, 3 wins and 3 draws with their last defeat in the Capital derby, 0-1 to Roma on 21 September.

In these 6 games Lazio have kept a clean sheet 5 times, conceding goals only in the 3-3 home draw against Torino, on 4 October.

Between Cristian Chivu and Maurizio Sarri, first official meeting.

As a player Chivu faced Lazio as an opponent 13 times: record of 5 wins to 2 for the Romanian and 6 draws.
